BUDGET EXECUTION CIRCULAR FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2022/2023

A. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Budget for FY 2022/2023 was approved by Parliament on 20th May 2022 in accordance with Article 155 of the Constitution of the Republic of Uganda and, Section 14 (1) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2015 (Amended).
- 2. In line with Section 13 (5) of the Public Finance Management Act. 2015 (Amended), the Budget for FY 2022/2023 came to effect on 1st July 2022. The approved Estimates for FY 2022/2023 (Volume I for Central Government Votes and Missions Abroad; Volume II for the Local Governments and Volume III for the State-Owned Enterprises and Public Corporations) have been published as required under Section 13 (12). These can be accessed on the Budget Information Website: www.budget.go.ug and the Ministry's website: www.finance.go.ug.
- 3. This fiscal year's Budget was prepared under the theme "Full Monetization of Uganda's Economy through Commercial Agriculture, Industrialization, Expanding and Broadening Services, Digital Transformation and Market Access". This aims at accelerating economic recovery and enhancing productive sectors for improved livelihoods.



- **4.** The purpose of this Budget Execution Circular therefore is to Communicate:
 - i. The Annual and quarterly Cash flow Plan (Annex 1) of Government for the FY 2022/2023; and
 - ii. The Operational and Administrative Guidelines for implementation of the Budget for FY 2022/2023.

B. THE ANNUAL CASH-FLOW PLAN FOR FY 2022/2023

- 5. Following the approval of the budget for FY 2022/2023 by Parliament, an Annual Cash Flow Plan has been generated in line with Section 36(b) of the PFM Act 2015 (as amended), based on quarterly projections in your work plans, Procurement plans and Recruitment Plans.
- **6.** Implementation of the FY 2022/2023 budget will follow the approved work plans, procurement plans, and recruitment plans. These will form the basis of the Quarterly Expenditure Limits.
- 7. In line with Sections 15 and 21(i) of the PFM Act 2015 (Amended), you are required to undertake commitments and activities based on the Annual Cash Flow Plan issued under this Circular. This helps to match the cash inflows and outflows and timing of the payments to meet service delivery requirements

C. POLICY DIRECTIVES, ADMINISTRATIVE AND OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BUDGET FOR FY 2022/2023

Policy Directives

8. As you may recall, during the reading of the Budget Speech for FY 2022/2023, the Honorable Minister of Finance, Planning and Economic Development presented to Parliament the Policy Imperatives for the Budget for this Fiscal Year. The following policies impact on execution of the Budget and these include:



- i. Enhancing fiscal discipline to limit supplementary expenditure to only the unforeseeable and unavoidable spending within the 3 percent provided for under the law.
- ii. Enhancing domestic revenue mobilization to increase the revenue-to-GDP ratio to our target of 18 percent over the medium term.
- iii. Automating Government processes and systems to enhance efficiency, save money, and fight fraud and other forms of corruption.
- **9.** Accounting Officers should adhere to the above policy directives as explained in the subsequent paragraphs.

Quarterly Expenditure Limits

- **10.** In order to facilitate timely release of funds and execution of the Budget in the FY 2022/2023, this Ministry will undertake the following:
 - i. Issue Quarterly Expenditure Limits for all categories of funds once every quarter not later than the 10th day of the first month of each quarter. Therefore, effective FY 2022/2023, the ministry will not accept requests for additional expenditure limits in the course of the quarter except for emergency purposes.
 - ii. Release funds for Missions Abroad twice in the course of the financial year, in July (First Quarter) and in January (Third Quarter) purposely to guard against loss of poundage and to enable Missions to meet obligations which require one-off payments, such as rent.
 - iii. Release funds for all institutions of learning (Primary, Secondary, Tertiary, BTVETs, and other Post-Secondary Institutions like National Teachers' Training Colleges, Colleges of Commerce, and Nursing Training Schools etc.) will be aligned to the Termly Calendar and semesters of the Academic Year to facilitate timely planning and budget execution.



- iv. Release 100 percent of Local Government Development Grants by the Third Quarter (Q3) to avoid unspent balances at the end of the Financial Year.
- v. Release Parish Revolving Funds (PRF) to qualifying PDM SACCOs, in four Quarters during the Financial Year. Ushs. 25 million shall be released per Quarter, per PDM SACCO.
- vi. Release Local revenue to Local Governments basing on remittance to the Uganda Consolidated Fund by individual Local Governments.
- 11. Quarterly Expenditure limits will be guided by the cash position of Government at the time of issuance.

Warranting and Invoicing of Funds

- 12. Despite the requirement for Accounting Officers to submit accounting warrants within five working days after issuance of the expenditure limits of a given quarter, and, the commitment by this Ministry to consider and approve/reject all warrants within 48 hours after submission, we have noted delays in submission of warrants by a number of Accounting Officers. This has negatively affected service delivery. **Going forward**;
 - i. Accounting Officers will be required to warrant 100 percent of all expenditure limits for all categories of expenditure and submit all warrants at once in line with the issued Expenditure Limits. Any warrants submitted contrary to this requirement will automatically be rejected.
 - ii. This Ministry will also publish non-compliant Votes on a monthly basis to facilitate follow up by relevant institutions.
 - iii. All Accounting Officers who do not submit warrants timely will be held accountable for the delayed service delivery.
- 13. Accounting Officers are advised to keep their usernames and passwords up to date to avoid causing delays in warranting and invoicing of funds for public service delivery. In case of any

- 14. Local Government Accounting Officers should ensure that transfer of funds to the lower-level facilities including Health Units, Education Institutions, Sub-Counties, town councils and Municipal Divisions is done not later than the 20th day of the first month of the quarter. Likewise, all funds budgeted through the Center Votes for transfer to other Agencies, Projects or subventions should be transferred by the same date.

Finance Committee Meetings

15. It has been brought to my attention that some Votes allocate quarterly expenditure limits without involving Heads Department/Cost Centres which undermines spirit of transparency and accountability. All Accounting Officers should ensure that, Finance Committee meetings (involving all Heads of Departments/Cost Centres) are held on a quarterly basis upon receipt of the expenditure limits to agree on the priorities and cost Centre allocations before submission of warrants. Copies of signed minutes of these meetings should be sent to this Ministry for the attention of Director Budget along with hard copies of the warrants on a quarterly basis to guide the subsequent release of funds

Virement of funds

- 16. Implementation of the budget has been characterized by frequent requests for virements which distorts the initially approved work plans and compromises credibility of the budget. Therefore, effective FY 2022/2023, requests for Virement will be limited to within the 10 percent of the money allocated to an item/activity in accordance with Section 22 (2) of the PFM Act (2015).
- 17. Please note that requests for Virements, if any, should be initiated online using the Program Budgeting System within 30 days before the start of the subsequent Quarter. Accordingly, NO Virements will be authorized once expenditure limits have been issued.



Supplementary Funding and Statutory Revisions

- 18. We have noted that a number of Votes do not adequately provide for statutory, mandatory and critical expenditures during budget preparation hence leading to perpetual supplementary requests during execution. This leads to distortion of the budget, displacement of other critical service delivery interventions and undermines credibility of the Government Public Expenditure Management System.
- 19. Therefore, effective FY 2022/23, there will be no room for supplementary funding for avoidable and foreseeable expenditures.
- 20. In case of any critical need arising during Budget Execution, Votes should explore the option of Virement within the 10% in line with the PFM Act (2015 Ammended) to address the emergency.
- 21. Where supplementaries have been allowed, Accounting Officers should initiate timely requests online using the Program Budgeting System in any case not more than five working days following approval of the supplementary as communicated by this Ministry.

Enhancement of the Program Budgeting System

22. In line with the programme based approach to planning and budgeting, the Program Budgeting System (PBS) has been enhanced and adjusted to facilitate this reform. The adjusted system can be accessed on URL; https://pbsmof.finance.go.ug.

Contract management and Construction of Public Infrastructure

23. As you implement infrastructure projects under Health and Education sub-programs in the Budget for FY 2022/2023, in line with H.E the President's directive of having all projects in the two sub-programs undertaken by the UPDF Construction Brigade, all Accounting Officers are guided as follows;



- i. Projects financed 100% by Government of Uganda should be undertaken by the National Enterprise Corporation and Uganda Peoples Defense Forces Engineering Brigade with exception of Universities and Primary Schools.
- ii. For Projects financed by Development Partners, procurement should be done in line with procurement arrangements stipulated in the respective Financing Agreements and the Programme Operational Manuals. This arrangement only applies to on-going Development Financed projects in Education and Health.
- iii. Projects with already ongoing Contracts should continue to be executed using the existing agreements.
- iv. Projects Funded by both Development Partners and Government of Uganda Counterpart funding should also continue to be implemented as those in ii & iii above.
- **24.**I have observed the continuous delays in implementation of critical Government programs and projects leading to low absorption of funds. To address these delays, Accounting Officers are required to:
 - i. Ensure timely Appointment of Managers for every contract and/or Project;
- ii. Initiate procurements and contracts in time with the beneficiary Departments as stipulated under the procurement plan; and
- iii. Timely resolve land acquisition and compensation related issues to avoid delays in execution of government projects especially infrastructure development.

Domestic Arrears

25. Oversight of a Vote budget is the responsibility of the Accounting Officer. Accounting Officers are required to ensure that implementation is done efficiently, within time and budget to avoid creation of arrears. As such, in line with the domestic arrears strategy and PFM Act (2015 Amended) Accounting Officers are hereby required to:

- i. Ensure good internal controls and processes are in place and are adhered to;
- ii. Update the IFMS Arrears tool with accurate records of all obligations and unpaid bills.
- iii. Prevent the accumulation of arrears.
- iv. Only enter into an obligation for which funding is sufficient or authorized.
- v. Remit taxes; and
- vi. Record all obligations and unpaid bills on the IFMIS Arrears tool for Quarterly reporting;
- 26. I am also aware that a number of Accounting Officers divert funds meant for settlement of verified arrears to finance other expenditures. Any Accounting officers found culpable will be sanctioned in accordance with the law.
- 27. Government has provided Shillings 662 Billion in line with the domestic arrears strategy 2022 to clear arrears, details of the allocations are attached as Annex 2. Accounting Officers are urged to prioritize payment of arrears in Quarter One on First in First Out Basis (FIFO) from the verified Suppliers captured in the IFMS Arrears database. Furthermore, Accounting Officers should submit to this Ministry, lists of beneficiaries by category for reconciliation of released funds by 15th October 2022.
- 28. Accounting Officers who will accumulate arrears in FY 2022/2023 will have the equivalent amount deducted from the MTEF ceilings of their Votes in FY 2023/3024 to clear these arrears and this will take the first call on the available resources.

Payment of Rent, Utilities and Service Providers

29. It has come to my attention that some Votes have continued to accumulate utility arrears even with the introduction of the pre-paid billing system for some of the utilities. All Accounting Officers are urged to clear all their outstanding utilities with the corresponding service providers before the end of Quarter One of FY 2022/2023.



You are further urged to clear your utility and rent bills timely during the course of the financial year to prevent accumulation of new arrears.

30. Going forward, your warrants will not be approved unless rent and other utility obligations are adequately provided for in your expenditure limits.

Payment of Taxes and other statutory deductions by Government

- 31. Accounting Officers are advised to adhere to Tax Inclusive Budget execution, therefore all payments for goods and services should be tax inclusive and accordingly, gross expenditures should be made when clearing certificates. Accounting Officers are required to comply with this directive and remit all tax deductions to Uganda Revenue Authority (URA) to prevent further accumulation of arrears. Pay as You Earn should be paid against Chart of Accounts Item 111101.
- **32.** We have noted with concern that some Accounting Officers do not remit tax and NSSF deductions to URA and NSSF respectively leading to accumulation of arrears, this practice should stop. Effective FY 2022/2023, URA and NSSF should submit lists of non-compliant Votes to this Ministry at the beginning of every Quarter for appropriate action.

Remittance of Local Service Tax to Local Governments

- 33. It has been noted that most MDAs have been remitting Local Service Tax (LST) to Local Councils where their employees' workplace is located contrary to provisions of Section 9 of the Local Government Act. Therefore, in order to address this anomaly, going forward, you are advised to remit LST to Local Councils of your Employees' residences. As such, Accounting Officers, and your respective payroll managers should prioritize the following:
 - i. Create a database of employees' residences and update them regularly before the start of every new financial year effective FY 2022/23.



- ii. Mobilize Lower Local Council authorities to keep an updated register of their residents for reconciliation purposes with remittances received; and,
- iii. Initiate application for supplier details on the IFMS system for each of all LST remitting MDAs to facilitate receipts of LST collections.

Non Tax Revenue (NTR)

34. Section 29 of the PFM Act, 2015 requires that all Non-Tax Revenue collected by Votes is remitted to the Consolidated Fund. All Accounting Officers are reminded to adhere to this provision of the PFM Act 2015, those who will attempt to collect and use NTR at source will be penalized accordingly.

D. SALARIES, PENSION AND GRATUITY PAYMENTS

Payroll Management

- 35. With effect from FY 2013/2014, Government undertook reforms to decentralize the salary payment process to ensure timely payment of salaries and eliminate irregularities on the payroll. Subsequently, effective FY 2014/2015, Pensions payroll management and payment of pensions and gratuity were also decentralized. As Accounting Officers, you are responsible for budgeting, management and payment of salaries, wages, pension and gratuity under your Vote, to ensure that all Public Servants and Pensioners are paid by the 28th day of every month in line with Government Policy.
- 36. It should be noted that paying of temporary staff against the wage bill of the regular Civil Service is irregular and should stop, since this has been a source of reported wage shortfalls during budget execution. You are therefore, instructed to ensure that payment of staff is only made to those with National Identification Number (NIN), Tax Identification Number (TIN), IFMS Supplier Number and an Integrated Personnel and Payroll System (IPPS) Number and should be charged from the following wage item codes accordingly.



- i. 211101 For Public Servants recruited by the Service Commissions and Appointing Authorities;
- 211102 For Contract Staff recruited under appointing Authorities, Boards and Councils;
- iii. 211103 For Statutory Bodies; and
- iv. 211106 Allowances (for any other short term contract and casual laborer) and Foreign Service allowances.
- 37. Accounting Officers for Votes that have not yet enrolled on the IPPS/HCM and still pay salaries directly off the IFMS without the IPPS payrolls interface files, should follow up with Ministry of Public Service to have their Votes fully enrolled on the IPPS before end of December 2022 so that staff acquire IPPS numbers for us to have a comprehensive Government payroll.
- 38. Furthermore, Government started the reform in which Heads of Department authorize payments and invoices on the IFMS. Accounting Officers should ensure proper alignment of wage budgets to existing staff structures. To eliminate the vice of paying ghost workers, compel Heads of Department NOT TO PAY persons who are not substantively deployed in their respective Departments.

Management of Non-Statutory Deductions

39. In line with our Circular to all Accounting Officers issued in May 2022 on the management of non-statutory deductions, you must ensure that ALL non-statutory deductions are paid at the same time as the net salaries of staff under your Votes. Failure to observe this principle will lead to disciplinary action against individual Accounting Officers.

Pension and Gratuity Processing

40. Following the full decentralization of pension and gratuity processing, all Votes are responsible for the management of their

payrolls. However, it is still noted that there are delays in processing pension files due to unmatched records/information on retirees' files and IPPS system among other reasons. These issues should have been rectified by now through decentralization, given that you have access rights to both physical staff files and the IPPS/HCM system. You are advised to superintend over officers in the approval process, to ensure that no file takes more than one week at any given verification or approval stage and initiate disciplinary proceedings on the Officer(s) where such unnecessary delays are identified.

- 41. Relatedly, cases of delays to access pensioners on pensions payroll have also been reported. Others drop-off the pensions payroll without clear reasons before they are 75 years old, while those required to submit annual Life certificates are not informed in time to do so. This has caused anguish and misery to some of our senior citizens. Accounting Officers are therefore advised;
 - i. To access new pensioners on the monthly payroll immediately after final approval.
 - ii. Maintain a stable pensions payroll, and ensure timely processing and payment of Monthly Pension by the 28th day of the month.
 - iii. Timely notify pensioners who are due to submit life certificates for verification.

Salaries, Pension and Gratuity Arrears

- **42.**In line with Government's strategy and commitment to mitigate against salaries, pension and gratuity arrears, Government in FY 2016/2017 fully decentralized verification and processing salary, pension and gratuity arrears. Despite this, a number of Accounting Officers continue to submit arrears that have been outstanding for more than two years.
- **43.** Accounting Officers are therefore informed that the cut-off period to verify and submit salaries, pension and gratuity arrears accrued in the past has been extended to FY 2022/2023. Any arrears that will not have been verified and submitted to this Ministry by 31st

December 2022, shall not be accepted by this Ministry as it shall be considered invalid. All Accounting Officers are strongly advised to disseminate this timeline to all staff and pensioners/Estate Administrators of the deceased pensioners within their respective jurisdictions to submit their claims before the aforementioned due date. Accounting officers will be held personally liable for all arrears not submitted to this ministry by 31st December 2022.

- **44.**You may have noted, in the new Chart of Accounts, Salary Arrears are now being budgeted for under **Item 352880** for Domestic Arrears while Pension and Gratuity Arrears have been allocated under **Item 352881** for Pension Liabilities. You are therefore reminded to ensure that these payments are made in line with the verified schedules on these respective Items.
- 45. Relatedly, adequate funds have been provided in the Budget for FY 2022/2023 to clear all your verified arrears submitted to this Ministry before 15th March 2022. These funds will be released to your respective Votes in the first quarter of FY 2022/2023 with a detailed schedule of claimants. You are therefore advised to circulate and display this schedule on your Institution's notice boards and ensure payments and accountability of these arrears are effected in the same quarter of disbursement. It should be incumbent upon the Accounting Officer to follow up with the Ministry to ensure that these arrears claims are paid according to the schedule within the first quarter of FY 2022/2023 and accountability submitted in the second quarter without fail.

Recruitments

46.I have noted that some Accounting Officers undertake recruitment without due regard to the adequacy of the wage bill and without clearance to recruit. Even where such due diligence is undertaken, some Service Commissions and Appointing Authorities under the influence of Accounting Officers, have proceeded to recruit more staff than those approved by the Ministry of Public Service, hence creating wage shortfalls. Some MALGs have continued to illegally recruit staff



in one financial year and regularised them in subsequent financial years creating salary arrears. Accounting Officers are advised to desist from such practices to avoid sanctions.

E. PUBLIC INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT

Projects to be exited from the PIP at the end of FY 2022/23

- 47. The Development Committee periodic portfolio reviews have revealed that projects have failed to exit the Public Investment Plan (PIP) due to poor project management, inadequate procurement planning, low prioritization of budget allocations, delays in acquisition of right of way among others. This led to numerous requests for project extensions on account of contract and financial obligations. Consequently, a total of 95 projects (Annex 3) were given extensions to FY 2022/2023.
- **48.** A total of 105 projects are scheduled to exit the PIP at the end of FY 2022/2023 as listed in **Annex 4**. These should be prioritized and fast tracked to ensure that they are completed by the end of FY 2022/2023.
- 49. Therefore, all Accounting Officers should ensure that all exiting projects take the first call on resources and prioritize contract management and supervision. This will ensure that they are completed on time, scope and budget so as to free up fiscal space for critical interventions in the PIP. No more extensions will be given to projects that have received extensions before. Projects scheduled to exit the PIP in FY 2022/2023 should be presented to the Development Committee for consideration by 30th August 2022.

Submission of Completion Reports

50. Previously, projects have exited the PIP without submission of completion reports by Accounting Officers. These reports assess performance of the project, ensure completion of all intended outputs, and derive any lessons learned and best practices that can be applied to future projects.



51. Going forward, all Accounting Officers are guided to ensure that completion reports for all exiting projects in FY 2022/2023 are prepared and submitted to this Ministry as required by the Development Committee (DC) guidelines to assist in evaluation of project performance.

Completion of the Project Approval Process

- **52.** During Budget preparation, a number of projects were given codes (*Annex 5*) to enable them access the budget for FY 2022/2023. This was done due to their strategic nature and/or finalization of negotiations for external financing. Additionally, some of the newly created votes were issued codes for their respective retooling projects to enable them acquire the necessary tools to support their operations.
- 53. All Accounting officers with projects under this category must fast track completion of the requisite approval processes in line with the PIMS framework. Failure to do so will lead to freezing of the respective project codes during implementation.

Deviation of projects from Original Work Plans

- **54.** During project implementation, several projects deviate from their original approved work plans (by Scope, Cost and Time). This has led to implementation challenges, failure to absorb project funds and delays in completion of projects.
- 55. Accounting Officers are therefore requested to ensure that all projects adhere to their approved work plans and within the established procedures, policies and legal frameworks so as to efficiently conclude the interventions therein in accordance with the planned development outcomes. In the event of any change in scope of project, a formal request should be extended to PS/ST for approval in line with the DC guidelines before any action is taken.

Low absorption of Project Funds

56. Slow implementation of projects leading to low absorption of funds remains a major obstacle to project management. This is due to



procurement delays, lack of project management skills and tools, poor financial management, failure to meet disbursement conditions such as land acquisition, recruitment of requisite personnel, establishment of necessary legal and policy frameworks, gender and equity considerations among others.

57. Accounting Officers are therefore, guided to ensure conditions precedent on GoU by virtue of financing agreements with Development Partners are fulfilled to enable timely disbursements. Furthermore, project management teams need to be equipped with requisite skills in project management i.e. Project Management Professional (PMP), acquired from the Project Management Institute (PMI) to aid in efficient implementation of projects.

Titling of Government Land

58. It has come to my attention that a number of Votes have land that is not titled, furthermore, a number of Votes are attempting to undertake infrastructure projects on untitled land which can result into litigation leading to cost and time overruns. I issued guidance in the Second Budget Call circular for FY 2022/2023 advising you to budget for and allocate adequate resources to this activity. All Accounting Officers should ensure that all land owned by their respective Votes is titled this Financial Year within the available resources.

Asset Management

59. It has come to my attention that there is still poor maintenance and control of public assets for a number of votes and Accounting Officers are urged to ensure that they prioritize their budget allocations for the proper maintenance of the assets under their control in order to derive maximum benefits and value from the assets during the delivery of public services. As an important control, Accounting Officers are reminded of the critical need to maintain complete and up-to-date asset registers covering all assets including the infrastructure assets.



F. LOCAL GOVERNMENT SPECIFIC ISSUES

Release of Funds in FY 2022/23

- **60.** In the context of the reforms to fiscal transfers, it is important to note that, during budget execution:
 - i) The release of transfers will be managed through PBS and the enhanced IFMS interface. Information on transfers is available on-line, i.e https://www.budget.go.ug/fiscal_transfers;
 - ii) Direct transfers will be made to all Lower Local Governments, including sub-counties, for the non-wage unconditional grant and the DDEG on the basis of the grant allocations made to them in line with the approved Budget; and
 - iii) Transfers to service delivery units (Schools and Health facilities) will be made based on the allocations to those units in the Local Government Budgets.

Virement, Re-allocation and Supplementary Requests by Local Governments

- **61.** A review of the Budget performance reports for FY 2021/22, and various correspondences by LG Accounting Officers has revealed that, a number of Local Governments either delayed to initiate their requests for Supplementary/virements on the PBS system as required, while others initiated on time **BUT** without clearance by their respective Councils and **NO** Minute extracts are attached as required to enable this Ministry process the supplementary.
- 62. In addition, in most cases the Budget debit/credit line codes where the supplementary are to be charged are not specified and without providing proper justifications and some Votes request for rejections of the submissions even after their approvals are in advanced stages. Please ensure that you submit correct budget expenditure lines together with the supplementary/virement request on the PBS system.
- 63. This is to emphasize to you that, all re-allocations, supplementary and virements must be approved by the Executive Council and requests to this Ministry should be accompanied by such. You should

ensure that the charge codes are clearly stated and the movement of funds must be in tandem with the 10% threshold under section 22 (2) (a) of the PFMA, 2015. Please note that, no requests shall be accepted without proper explanation and documentation of approval of reallocations, supplementary and virements across Departments under your respective Votes.

64. In addition, when submitting supplementary requests for external financing, you must attach agreements, disbursement timelines, evidence of remittances of funds to the collection account and signed promissory reports to enable this Ministry process the required supplementary.

Management of Local Revenue

- 65. Local Revenue budgets for FY 2022/23 were based on projections by respective Local Government Votes. Expenditure limits for Local Revenue shall continue to be issued based on remittances to the Uganda Consolidated Fund. The Cash limits shall be issued as and when funds are received.
- **66.** In the event that a Local Government collects revenue over and above the available Budget, the affected Local Government should remit the excess funds and request for Supplementary Budget before such excess collections can be spent. It is important to note, however, that such requests shall only be honored upon approval by Parliament.

Physical Location of Health Facilities and Institutions of Learning

- 67. Over the years, various concerns have been raised on the huge variations between data submitted to this Ministry, on the location of cost Centers/Schools which greatly affects release of funds especially for Tertiary Institutions. Given that funds are released on the basis of the location of a given facility, these variations distort release of funds.
- **68.** In order to avoid such situations, this Ministry in collaboration with Ministry of Education and Sports has enhanced the PBS to allow respective Local Government Accounting Officers to match the Cost



Centers on the PBS. Accounting Officers must ensure that all the facilities under their jurisdiction are properly captured in the PBS. Any Accounting Officer who fails to align their Cost Centers will be held personally responsible for submission of wrong data and misallocation of resources.

Implementation of the Parish Development Model (PDM)

- 69. The roll-out of the Parish Development Model (PDM) as Government's last mile strategy to facilitate the transition of subsistence households into the money economy, commenced in FY 2021/22. However, some Local Governments did not follow the PDM Guidelines and corresponding Circulars on Financial Inclusion (Pillar 3). There was non-compliance with respect to identification of subsistence households before Enterprise Group and SACCO formation; opening of bank accounts without the involvement of PDM SACCO members and leaders; commencing with e-Registration of PDM SACCOs before registration of the SACCOs by the Registrar of Cooperatives, among others.
- **70.** Disbursement of the Parish Revolving Fund (PRF) funds shall not be made to the PDM SACCOs, unless the Accounting Officer ensures full compliance to the PDM Guidelines and any other official correspondences, and that the following conditions are fulfilled: -
 - a) The parish for which the PDM SACCO corresponds, is included on the list of gazetted Parishes provided by the Ministry of Local Government for budgeting;
 - b) Registration of the PDM SACCO under the Cooperative Societies Act (as amended), is complete;
 - c) A bank account complying with the minimum standard provided has been opened at a Financial Institution supervised by Bank of Uganda;
 - d) A PRF Financing Agreement has been dully signed by the PDM SACCO; and
 - e) A signed schedule of the qualifying PDM SACCOs, in the attached format (Annex 6) has been submitted by the Accounting Officer to the Accountant General



- **71.**PRF funds shall be disbursed directly to the respective bank accounts of **ONLY** the qualifying PDM SACCOs and the details of the disbursements published in the media, to promote accountability and transparency.
- 72. Furthermore, the Accounting Officers at the Local Governments shall ensure that the District Commercial Office, District Production Office, District Community Development Office and other relevant Technical Departments provide day-to-day guidance, support, monitoring and supervision to the PDM SACCOs to enforce compliance to the PDM Guidelines and Circulars.
- 73. Government has provided **Ushs1,069.9bn** in Local Government for PDM activities, of which; **Ushs.1,059.4Bn** is for the revolving funds, with each Parish allocated **Ushs100million**. A PDM Administrative Costs Budget of **Ushs. 10.5 Billion** has been provided to facilitate the Local Government's support activities under PDM.
- 74. All Local Government Accounting Officers are reminded to ensure that other preparatory activities, including: recruitment of Parish Chiefs by all districts; data collection, verification of beneficiaries; sensitization and mobilization, among others are concluded in readiness for full implementation of the Model by 1st July, 2022.

Local Government Performance Assessment

75. Following the Decentralization Policy, Government remains committed to improving the delivery of services to all citizens, especially through Local Governance. On this basis, Government started the implementation of Intergovernmental Fiscal Transfer Reforms purposely to address financing gaps and challenges under Health and Education Sectors. Since then, Local Governments are assessed on three dimensions of: (i) Budget and accountability requirements; (ii) crosscutting and sector functional processes and systems; and (iii) service delivery results. The results of the assessment were used in determining the allocation of the UGIFT development Grant for decentralized services under Education, Agriculture, Water and Health for FY 2022/2023.



- **76.** An assessment of Local Governments' adherence to budget and accountability requirements is underway to verify whether budget requirements and programme guidelines have been met. I will only sign Performance Contracts for FY 2022/23 with Accounting Officers, if the assessment shows that:
 - Grant Guidelines are properly adhered to in the Budget allocations;
 and
 - ii. If Development and Unconditional Grant Allocations are:
 - a) Properly budgeted for against the respective Lower Local Governments and facilities;
 - b) Consistent with the approved budget allocations provided by this Ministry; and
 - c) Bank Account details have been provided up to facility levels.

Uganda Inter-Governmental Fiscal Transfers Program (UGIFTP) and USMID

- 77. In line with the Fiscal Decentralization Strategy, Government committed to improving the adequacy, equity and delivery of services across Local Governments through the UGIFT program, the Local Government Accounting Officers should ensure the following:
 - i. Operationalization of completed Seed Secondary Schools and upgraded Health Centre IIs to Health Center IIIs.
- **78.** All completed facilities should be operationalized not later than **October 2022**. Funds for wage and medicines have been provided in the Budget to enable operationalization of the newly completed facilities.
- 79. In addition, adequate funds have been provided to all District Service Commissions for facilitation during recruitment activities during the FY 2022/23. Therefore, all Chief Administrative Officers should initiate the recruitment process in consultation with Ministry of Public Service not later than 30th September, 2022.



- Unspent Balances for UGIFT and USMID Projects in FY ii. 2021/2022
- 80. Local Government Accounting Officers are requested to submit their supplementary requests NOT later than 31st July 2022, for unspent funds returned to the consolidated funds. This request should be accompanied with evidence from the Accountant General confirming that these funds have been refunded to the Consolidated Fund. Please note that, late submission will not be tolerated beyond the above. These funds will only be revoted through supplementary to the respective Local Government Vote after confirmation by Office of the Accountant General by project and budget category.

Contract Management, Monitoring and Supervision iii.

- 81. Under the Project Investment Service costs, Local Government Accounting Officers should ensure that Project Management Teams are facilitated to carry out Joint Monitoring and Supervision exercises related to Contract Management, Environment and Social Safeguards implementation, payment of Clerk of works and related procurement expenses. Ensure that the revised Standard Bidding Documents (SBDs) for all Works and Supplies are utilized during procurement. All Payments to Contractors should be done within 30 days upon receipt of the requisition from the Contractor.
- 82. In addition, in order to improve on monitoring and supervision of projects in Local Governments, additional funds were provided to the Office of the Accounting Officers for improved supervision of projects. Therefore, all Local Governments should utilize the provided funds to Monitor and supervise projects under their jurisdictions and Accounting Officers must ensure that all certificates for payment on construction works are certified by project engineers and pre-audited.
- Adherence to Environment, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) iv. requirements:



83. We have noted with concern that some Local Governments do not comply with the requirement to undertake Environmental, Social and Health Safety Requirement which sometimes delays disbursement of funds. All Local Government Accounting Officers are requested to undertake environment and social screening for new projects guided by the issued Environment, social, Safety and Health safeguard guidelines for Local Governments. The areas of emphasis are on; environment and social assessment of projects before commencement, acquisition of land titles for all government facilities and operationalization of grievance redress committees.

v. Micro-Scale Irrigation under Uganda Inter-Governmental Fiscal Transfer (UGIFT) Programme

- 84. Government piloted the micro-scale irrigation programme in 40 Districts in FY 2020/21 and in FY 2022/23, the programme will be rolled out in the remaining 95 districts. The additional 95 LGs should focus on preparatory activities like creating awareness about the program and collection of expressions of interest from interested farmers and of farm visits.
- 85. Accounting Officers should mobilize farmers to fulfil their cofunding obligations on time to trigger Government contribution through timely installation of the equipment and training in their use. For avoidance of doubt, contributions by farmers should be treated as Locally raised revenue to support activities under the Agro-industrialization Programme.
- **86.** In addition, Local Governments should recruit the necessary technical staff and build capacity of their extension staff to support farmers in selection of suitable irrigation equipment. The Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries is requested to issue the relevant detailed operational Guidelines for the Grant.

Operationalization of newly created Administrative Units and Cities

87. Effective FY 2021/22, Government started operationalization of the newly created Sub-counties and Town Councils through provision of supplementary, and these resources have been carried forward in the

Budget for FY 2022/23. As such, all newly created Town Councils and Sub counties are expected to be in operation in FY 2022/23 given that the required resources have been fully provided in the Budget. LG Accounting Officers are strongly advised to ensure that these Sub-Counties and Town Councils are operational.

88. In addition, the remaining batch of five approved Cities are expected to be fully operational in FY 2023/24, as such whatever funds that are available in the Budget in FY 2022/23 should be used for the preparatory activities such as physical planning and mapping of all in readiness for their full-scale administrative boundaries operationalization.

Payment of Ex-gratia and Councilors' Allowances

- 89. We have noted that during the course of Budget implementation, some Local Government Accounting Officers do not follow the prescribed Government rates for Councilors allowances and hence causing shortfalls on the budgeted funds.
- 90. Therefore, in FY 2022/23, Accounting Officers are reminded to ensure that, Councilors and other Leaders are facilitated in line with Schedule 1 and 3 of the Local Government Act, 2017 as amended, by following the correct Government rates as indicated below:
 - Monthly is District/Municipal/City Allowances Councilors' UShs.250,000
 - District/City Speaker's monthly allowance is UShs.400,000
 - UShs.300,000 monthly for deputy Speaker of Municipal Council;
 - Sub -County/Town Council/Municipal Division Chairpersons Ushs 35,000 per Month; and
 - Ex-gratia/Councilors' Allowance for LCI and LCII Chairpersons is at Ushs120,000 annually.

BUDGET PERFORMANCE AND BUDGET TRANSPARENCY **Quarterly Performance Reports**

91. I have noted with concern the persistent delays in submission of quarterly performance reports to this Ministry by a number of Votes.



In line with Section 16 (1 &2) of the PFMA 2015, Accounting Officers should submit quarterly budget performance reports within 30 days after the end of the quarter in accordance with the format issued by this ministry on the Programme Budgeting System. All Accounting officers are advised to adhere to this provision of the PFM Act, 2015(Amended). Failure of which will leave this Ministry with no option but to freeze your IFMS operations and also to publish defaulting Accounting Officers in the press as a budget transparency initiative and accountability to the general public besides other administrative measures that will be taken against you.

- **92.**Your performance reports should be in line with the new budget structure, NDPIII Programs, Program Implementation Action Plans and the aligned budgets for FY 2022/2023 for which resources were appropriated by Parliament.
- 93. You are therefore advised to adhere to the reporting timelines and warned against late submission of reports. Local Government Accounting Officers should also provide copies of progress reports to the Offices of the LC Vs and RDCs and other relevant stakeholders for budget transparency.

Budget Transparency

- 94. The Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development introduced the Budget Transparency Initiative (BTI) in 2013 to scale up efforts to improve transparency and accountability for public expenditure and enhance public service delivery in Uganda. As part of the BTI, this Ministry operates the Budget Website and Call Center. To enhance Budget transparency at the Vote level, all Accounting Officers should adhere to the following:
 - i. Ensure that all necessary information (quarterly releases, funds provided for projects, school releases, health center releases and locally raised revenue and expenditure, pension and gratuity, etc.) is displayed on the noticeboards at all times to encourage public awareness.



- ii. Avail all relevant budget information to the political leadership to facilitate their oversight for effective implementation and proper accountability of Government Programmes for improved service delivery; and
- iii. Engage in joint monitoring of government projects and ensure the findings in the Monitoring reports are followed up with appropriate actions.
- **95.**Government MALGs should timely upload accurate budget information on their websites to improve access by the public to enhance their participation in monitoring of public resources and demand for accountability.

H. CONCLUSION

- **96.** This Circular has been issued to guide and facilitate timely implementation of Government programs in the approved Budget for FY 2022/2023 in accordance with the legal frameworks and guidelines issued.
- **97.** All Accounting Officers are requested to commence implementation of Government programs and Projects for FY 2022/2023 in line with the approved work plans, procurement plans and recruitment plans, and budget implementation guidelines contained in this Circular.
- **98.** I thank you for your commitment and continued efforts towards Improving Service Delivery. I wish you success in the implementation of the Budget for FY 2022/2023.
