Re: SECOND BUDGET CALL CIRCULAR: PREPARATION OF DETAILED BUDGET ESTIMATES FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2014/2015.

A. INTRODUCTION

- 1. Cabinet approved the National Budget Framework Paper for FY 2014/15, which has been laid before Parliament in accordance with Section 4 of the Budget Act, 2001 (see copy enclosed).
- 2. Accordingly, the purpose of this circular is to:
 - i. Forward a copy of the National Budget Framework Paper for the FY 2014/15 with the revised resource envelope, sector ceilings and budget priorities for FY 2014/15 and the medium term;
 - ii. Communicate key policy and administrative guidelines that should be taken into consideration for the preparation of the detailed budget estimates for FY 2014/15;
 - iii. Request you to finalise the preparation of the detailed budget estimates, annual and quarterly workplans as well as procurement plans and Ministerial Policy Statements for FY 2014/15 in line with the attached National Budget Framework Paper.

B. THE BUDGET STRATEGY AND KEY PRIORITIES FOR THE FY 2014/15

Budget Strategy and Priorities

- 3. In the Budget for FY 2014/15, Government will focus on the following priority areas:
 - Maintenance of National Security and Defence;
 - ii. Accelerating Infrastructure Development in roads, railway, electricity,ICT and Industrial Parks;

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- iii. Enhancement of Science, Technology and Innovation for Industrialization, Competitiveness and Employment;
- iv. Enhancing Production and Productivity in Agriculture and Tourism sectors with specific emphasis put on provision of planting, breeding and stocking materials, water for production as well as tourism promotion, training and infrastructure;
- v. Human Skills Development relevant to market labour demand; and
- vi. Public Sector Reforms for improved accountability and enhanced service delivery.
- 4. The detailed sector priorities are highlighted **on pages 49-61 of the National Budget Framework Paper.** Therefore, Accounting Officers are requested to adhere to the national and sector priorities approved by Cabinet while finalising the detailed estimates.

Resource Envelope for FY 2014/15 and MTEF projections

- 5. The total resource inflows in Financial Year 2014/15 are projected to amount to **Shs 14,317.2bn**. These are comprised of **Shs 10,127.3bn** from domestic revenues, **Shs 221.0bn** of budget support, **Shs 2,601.7bn** from project support, and **Shs 1,647.2bn**, financing on a net basis, from the domestic banking system. Accordingly, the resources available for Government expenditures in FY 2014/15, net of interest payments and arrears is **Ushs 11,665.50bn** as per proposed Medium-Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) (**Annex 1**).
- 6. Consequently, the additional resources of **UShs. 1,025.69bn** (including savings from one-off expenditures) for the FY 2014/15, have been earmarked to key national priorities as detailed under **(Annex 2 attached)**.
- 7. The official exchange rate of One Uganda Shilling against One US Dollar, to be used for FY 2014/15 and over the medium term are as follows:

i. FY 2014/15- Ushs 2,671

ii. FY 2015/16- Ushs 2,725

iii. FY 2016/17- Ushs 2,779

iv. FY 2017/18- Ushs 2,834

v. FY 2018/19- Ushs 2,771.

C. KEY POLICY ISSUES

Budgeting for Salaries for the FY 2014/15

8. Starting with preparation of the budget for the FY 2014/15, the Output Budgeting Tool (OBT) was upgraded to enable the Heads of the Cost Centres

to prepare and provide detailed staff information as part of the Sector and Local Government Budget Framework Papers. This new arrangement also places the responsibility of budgeting for salaries directly under the Heads of Departments and Cost Centres like Head Teachers.

- 9. All Civil Servants are required to individually sign-off the staff lists before data is entered into the Output Budgeting Tool (OBT) by the Heads of Department and submitted as an attachment to the detailed budget estimates for the FY 2014/15. In the 1st Budget Call Circular for 2014/15 dated 22nd October 2013, Accounting Officers were requested to use the October 2013 payroll while estimating the wage requirements for 2014/15.
- 10. However, I have noted the delay by some Accounting Officers to provide the required information to facilitate the budgeting for salaries. Failure by the Accounting Officers to provide this information on time affects our effort to address the challenges experienced in management of the Government payroll, which include among others, the wage bill overruns existence of "ghost" staff on the Government payroll as well as delayed and non-payment of staff salaries. To mitigate these challenges, disciplinary action will be taken against all non-compliant Accounting Officers, including revoking of their appointments.
- 11. Therefore, to ensure proper budgeting, it is important that the staff details and wage estimated submitted in the Sector and Local Government Budget Framework Papers are adjusted in line with the current payroll. Therefore, all MDA's are reminded to use the salary payments to staff for the month of February 2014 and resubmit updated staff details based on the guidelines which has already been sent to you in a separate letter Ref: BPD 103/155/01, dated 1st April 2014.
- 12. In the finalization of the Budget for FY 2014/15, votes with funds for recruitment will be informed by the Ministries of Public Service and that of Finance, Planning and Economic Development. MDA's with provisions for recruitment, are required to submit the costed recruitment plans by cost centre, to Ministry of Public Service with a copy to this Ministry for approval by **not later than 17**th **April 2014.** Approval will therefore be given by 31st May 2014.

Interfacing the Integrated Personnel and Payroll System (IPPS) with the Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS)

13. The interface between the Integrated Personnel and Payroll System (IPPS) and the Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS) has been finalised. The interface of the two systems will enable payment of all staff salaries through the IFMS as the sole Government payment system. As a result, all payroll

records hitherto being processed under the old Legacy System under Uganda Computer Services (UCS) have been transferred to the IPPS. In addition, with effect from the month of January 2014, all Pension payments are done through the Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS). Government has also undertaken to roll out IPPS to all sites with IFMS in July 2014/15. This will reduce the burden of manually inputting records at the Ministry of Public Service. You are therefore requested to position yourself for this exercise without any excuse.

14. While this Ministry will provide all the necessary technical support for smooth implementation of the IFMS and the OBT, Accounting Officers are required to make adequate budgetary provisions for recurrent costs for IFMS, IPPS and the automated OBT, through an appropriate item.

Decentralisation of Salary Payments

15. Government will complete the exercise of Decentralising of salary payments in July 2014. The exercise required that every public officer obtains a Tax Identification Number (TIN) from Uganda Revenue Authority as a requirement for every supplier on IFMS. This requirement was waived for votes on the pilot phase because of the short time to prepare and effect salary payment. All public officers are required to have TIN by 31st May 2014 as those who will not have will be automatically deleted off the payroll effective July 2014. Uganda Revenue Authority should ensure that public officers receive the TIN from the local governments where they are working to avoid disruption of service delivery. Accounting officers should facilitate public officers in this exercise.

Audit of the Government Payroll

16. Government is currently undertaking a comprehensive audit of the entire Government payroll (Salary and Pension). The major objective of this audit exercise is to establish the validity, authenticity and accuracy of all the current payroll records. This exercise also involves conducting a systems audit of the Integrated Personnel and Payroll System (IPPS) to establish its effectiveness in the processing and management of the Government payroll. A final report of this exercise by the Auditor General is expected by end of April 2014 and will guide the finalisation of wage estimates for the FY 2014/15 and in the medium term. You are therefore requested to give this exercise maximum cooperation.

Display of Payrolls on Cost Centre Public Notice Boards and Printing of Pay slips

17. In order to increase transparency and accountability as well as minimising the existence of "ghost" staff on the Government payroll, all Accounting Officers and Heads of Cost Centres are required to print and display monthly payrolls

on public notice boards for scrutiny. In addition, it is a requirement by all Accounting Officers to print and distribute pay slips to all Public Servants for endorsement as acknowledgement for receipt of salary on a monthly basis. However, failure by most Accounting Officers to enforce this directive perpetuates the existence of "ghosts" and other payroll irregularities on the Government payroll.

18. Therefore, in the FY 2014/15, Government will aggressively enforce this requirement in all Government Ministries, Departments and Agencies. Accordingly, all Accounting Officers should ensure that there is adequate budget provision for printing of pay slips for public officers and payroll reports per cost centre. In addition, Accounting Officers will be held responsible for any payroll irregularities arising out of their failure to enforce the printing of pay slips and display of payroll on public notice boards whenever salaries are paid.

Budgeting for Contract Staff Salaries

19. Effective FY 2013/14, Budgeting for Contract Staff Salaries (Incl. Casuals, Temporary), which had hitherto been budgeted for under the non-wage recurrent, is provided for under the wage category in the MTEF and budgeted for under item 211102 (Contract Staff Salaries) in the detailed estimates. Accounting Officers should ensure that the amount of funds allocated to this item is not less than the provision for this FY 2013/14 unless there is clear justification to the contrary.

Budgeting for Pension and Decentralizing Gratuity Payments for the FY 2014/15

- 20. Accounting Officers for both Central and local government should note that budgeting for Pension in FY 2014/15 will remain the responsibility of the Ministry of Public Service. Therefore, to streamline budgeting for pension and gratuity, the Ministry of Public Service should liaise with spending Agencies and submit to this Ministry, **not later than 30th April 2014** the following information:
 - i. Details of those who have retired in FY 2013/14 and those due for retirement from March to June 2014;
 - ii. Details of current Pension obligations by Payroll category; and
 - iii. Verified Pension and Gratuity arrears.
- 21. There have also been concerns about delays in paying commuted Pension Gratuity for retiring Civil Servants and this has been a major cause of pension arrears. As a measure, Government has decided that commuted gratuity will be paid by the vote where the public officer is retiring from after MOPS has verified the computations. Consequently, Accounting Officers were required to submit all cases for officers to retire in 2014/15 to the

Ministry of Public Service for verification by 1st April 2014 as stated in my Circular of 21st March 2014 attached in <u>Annex 3</u>, who will forward the verified commuted pension by vote to Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development by 30th April 2014.

22. As is the case with Salaries, Ministry of Public Service will print and distribute Pension Payroll by Local Governments and Payslips to Pensioners every month. Accordingly, Ministry of Public Service should ensure that they budget adequately for printing of Pensions Payrolls and Payslips for Pensioners by Local Governments for FY 2014/15.

Improvements in Payroll management

Grading of Schools

23. Since 1997, when the grading of primary schools was done, Ministry of Education and Sports has not reviewed these grades, yet the enrollment has gone up in all the schools. This has affected the schools staff ceilings and posting of teachers across and within local governments leading to staff appearing on the wrong payrolls. To address this issue, government is to implement the re-grading system of schools, in line with the Schemes of Service developed in 2008 by Education Service Commission. Ministry of Public Service in liaison with Ministry of Education and Sports should take note of this administrative measure and ensure that the above are in place before 15th April 2014.

Staff Ceilings for Primary Schools

24. Effective FY 2014/15, we have commenced budgeting for wages by cost center and therefore the individual officers/staff are signing the staff lists. For the case of the Primary schools, this necessitates that staff ceilings are communicated to local governments at vote and cost centre level by the end of March 2014 to enable finalization of the wage estimates in the OBT for the next FY. The Ministry of Education and Sports should as a matter of urgency prepare and issue staff establishment ceilings to all local governments by vote and by school in any case not later than 15th April 2014.

Review of Projects in the Public Investment Plan (PIP)

25. The Development Committee has reviewed the PIP as well as new projects for inclusion in the PIP. This exercise identified projects for removal from the PIP, transfer to the recurrent Budget as well as those that required further clarification. You should therefore take note of the attached Annex 4 and adjust your detailed estimates accordingly.

Finalization of Central Government (Form A) and Local Government (Form B)

26. In an effort to improve service delivery, Government introduced a wide range of reforms. These include among others Result Oriented Management (ROM), Output Oriented Budgeting (OOB) and Performance Contracts for Accounting Officers. Accounting Officers should note that as they finalize their detailed budget estimates, they should embark on preparation of Form A for Central Government and Form B for Local Government, which is the basis of Performance Contracts to be signed with Permanent Secretary/Secretary to the Treasury. Accordingly, your form A (Central Government votes) & Form B (local Government Votes) for the FY 2014/15 should be very clear indicating the key outputs to be delivered, and provide a link between Key Performance Indicators, outputs and the detailed workplan; since this will form the basis for performance evaluation of the Accounting Officers, and should be submitted in both Hard and soft Copy to the Permanent Secretary/Secretary to the Treasury not later than 30th June 2014.

D. KEY ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES

Budget Allocative Efficiency

- 27. As communicated in my 1st Budget Call Circular dated 22nd October 2013, you were informed that while allocating resources, sectors must identify the various efficiency measures for improving service delivery within the available resources by among others, reducing expenditure on non-core activities such as administrative and consumptive activities and redirecting the resources to frontline service delivery under the respective sectors
- 28. Accordingly, to strengthen efficiency and effectiveness in budgeting and delivery of public services, Government will maintain the following efficiency measures:
 - i. Budget allocations to the items for advertisement, workshops and seminars, travel inland, allowances, fuel and vehicle maintenance, printing, welfare and entertainment and special meals among others should be maintained at the level of the FY 2013/14;
 - ii. The ban on purchase of motor vehicles shall be maintained in the FY 2014/15 with exception for security, Ambulances and Road equipment and;
 - iii. While finalizing their detailed budget estimates, votes should adhere to the Chart of Accounts provisions and allocate resources under the right budget item.

- 29. As earlier communicated in my first budget call circular, no budget allocation should be made to the item general supply of goods and services otherwise the funds will be centrally reallocated to more service delivery programs. This item has been frozen in the OBT for FY2014/15 and for the medium term. Votes are advised to use the new items created as possible replacement and these were communicated to you in my letter dated 27th November 2013. These include:
 - i) 224004 Cleaning and sanitation;
 - ii) 224005- Uniforms, beddings and protective gear;
 - iii) 224006 -Agricultural Supplies;

Preparation of Annual Workplans, Quarterly Workplans and Procurement Plans

- 30. Analysis of Sector BFP submissions and Performance Reports reveals lack of a clear linkage between resource allocation, outputs, Key Performance Indicators and Performance Targets. There is also gross inconsistencies between the planned and achieved outputs. Specifically the analysis shows:
 - i.) Difficulty to mirror out achievements and planned outputs;
 - ii.) Deviations between planned and achieved outputs including lack of geographical location.
 - iii.) Lack of coordination between budget preparation, implementation and reporting. In some cases, Planning Units and Heads of Departments/Projects who are involved in budget preparation and reporting are not involved in implementation of the budget.
- 31. As a way forward, the OBT will be updated and re-aligned to ensure that achievements are mirrored to planned outputs. Accounting officers are reminded to ensure that they operationalise the mandate of finance committees within their vo tes as a means of ensuring implementation of budgets as planned. In this regard, Planning Units should act as Secretariats of the Finance Committee. Accountant General is therefore authorised to allocate responsibility of access/viewing rights on the IFMS to Heads of Planning Units, effective **1**st **July 2014.**
- 32. We have also noted the failure by spending agencies to properly link their work and procurement plans leads to delayed implementation of critical programs/projects. You are accordingly required to ensure that your work and procurement plans are properly linked clearly showing the projected quarterly cash flow requirements in line with the project/program implementation schedule, planned outputs, Key Performance Indicators and Performance Targets for the FY 2014/15.

- 33. In order to address challenges in Government procurement, the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) has development guidelines for bulk procurement as indicated in Annex 5 attached. You are required to adhere to these guidelines to improve the management of procurement in your respective entities.
- 34. Analysis of work plans for many Central Government institutions indicates that there is little or no involvement of Heads of Departments/Projects in preparation of Annual/quarterly work plans and performance reporting under the Output Budgeting Tool (OBT). This undermines transparency and accountability and ultimately leads to failure by spending agencies to link the work plan, procurement plan and detailed estimates. This further leads to low absorption of resources, huge unspent balances at the end of the financial year and poor service delivery at both Central and Local Governments. In order to address this challenge, it is necessary that Accounting Officers take advantage of the **Export** and **Import** provisions in the OBT and direct Heads of Department to participate in preparation of their work plans and detailed estimates using the "Mini Data bases". In addition, a provision has been provided in the Central Government OBT for Heads of Departments /Projects to endorse the hard copies of both the detailed estimates and performance reports.

Preparation of the Ministerial Policy Statements (MPS)

35. In accordance with the revised Budget Process Calendar, all Central Government Accounting Officers are reminded to prepare Ministerial Policy Statements in the format contained in the OBT for submission to Parliament, not later than 25th April 2014.

Budgeting for Taxes

Value Added Tax (VAT)

- 36. Every spending Agency should budget for VAT in line with the second Schedule, paragraph (aa) of the VAT Act 2009 (Amended), within the available MTEF provision except for the items which were exempted. The exempt areas are:
 - i) Supply of Specialized Vehicles vi) Civil works related to Hydro-Electric
 - ii) Plant and Machinery
 - iii) Feasibility Studies
 - iv) Engineering Designs
 - v) Consultancy Services
- Roads and Bridges' Power, construction;
- vii) Public Water Works;
- viii) Agriculture and;
- ix) Education and Health Sector

Import Taxes

- 37. As you are well aware, Government has been budgeting inclusive of taxes, but in the case of imports, taxes would be cleared under the non-resource tax arrangement. Based on the budget outturn for FY 2012/13 and the half year performance for FY 2013/14, it has been noted that there is gross under performance of taxes on imports in the budget and therefore, the effective tax expenditure on government imports is estimated at Ushs 70bn in FY 2014/15. Accordingly, effective FY 2014/15, MTEF Ceilings for MDAs will include funds for payment of import duties on Government imports where applicable.
- 38. In this regard, Accounting Officers will be responsible for payment of taxes due on government imports for their respective votes to URA. Based on your submission, additional resource of **Ushs 70bn** has been provided and will be allocated based on your request and justification. A list of goods and services exempted from Import Duty under the EAC-Customs Act 2004 Amended July 2011 is attached in **Annex 6.**
- 39. Accordingly, effective FY2014/15, URA will only release goods on receipt of funds from contractors and suppliers contracted by Government for all tax obligations.

Budgeting for Taxes under Local Governments

40. It has been noted that most local governments do not budget for Tax expenditure under their projects. This is therefore to remind local government Accounting Officers that they should submit any anticipated tax obligations to the Permanent Secretaries of the respective Sector Ministries that supervise the grants where taxes are due to enable them capture your tax requirements while finalizing the Ministry's detailed estimates and also in view of the new policy of tax inclusive budgeting.

Disposal of Government Assets and Budgeting for Non-Tax Revenue (NTR)

- 41. Non-Tax Revenue has been identified as a potential source of domestic revenue improvement. In the FY 2011/12, progress was registered by Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs through provision of NTR information to this Ministry. This culminated into publication of NTR rates, estimates and charges booklets. Accordingly, Accounting Officers should budget for NTR using the revised rates.
- 42. It has been further noted that many Ministries and Government agencies are holding on Government assets that are uneconomical to maintain such as vehicles and plant machinery. Many are beyond salvage value and hence can only be disposed off at low prices. In this regard, and as part of the process of finalizing the detailed

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estimates for FY 2014/15, you are therefore required to estimate the non-tax revenue that will accrue from the sale of such assets. Thereafter, you are requested to work with the office of the Accountant General to expedite the disposal process and report to this Ministry by 30th September 2014.

Budgeting for Government Parastatals, Authorities and Government Agencies

43. In order to ensure that the concerns of Parliament in regard to totality of Government budgets including the budgets for Government Parastatals and Authorities are addressed, effective FY 2014/15, Government Parastatals and Authorities are required to provide detailed budget allocations, activity, outputs and Key Performance Indicators showing how the funds generated by these institutions will be utilized. A separate module has been developed in the Output Budgeting Tool (OBT) to facilitate this process.

Budgeting for Semi-Autonomous Institutions

- 44: As a reminder, Accounting Officers of all Autonomous and Semi-Autonomous institutions receiving Government subventions and **generating Non Tax Revenue** should note that they are required to:
 - i. Prepare and submit their detailed budget estimates including costed staff lists to the parent Ministry, not later than Monday, 11th April 2014;
 - ii. Adhere to the duty facilitating allowance rates approved by Ministry of Public Service, while budgeting and during budget execution;
 - iii. Clearly indicate how both the estimated Non-Tax Revenue collections and the Government subventions for the FY 2013/14 will be expended.
 - iv. The responsible Officers should liaise with the Ministry of Public Service and integrate their payrolls into the overall Government payroll by 1st of July 2014

Budgeting for Rent and Office Accommodation

45. It has been noted that some spending agencies have continued to commit Government to pay exorbitant office rent, which could be avoided. While Government is currently revisiting the policy on office accommodation,

Accounting Officers should adequately budget for rent obligations and also refrain from renting unaffordable office premises. In addition, all rent estimates must be accompanied by rental agreements, copied to the Office of the President.

Budgeting for Utilities

46. Some Government institutions have continued to accumulate utility arrears especially for water and electricity, mainly due to the failure to adequately budget for utility requirements, contrary to the Government policy of Commitment Control System (CCS). You are therefore urged to adequately budget for utilities and ensure that utility payments and arrears take a first call on the resources provided to you. **Utility Companies will cut off supplies if the bills are not paid on time.**

Mainstreaming of Gender and Equity, Environment and HIV/AIDS

47. Analysis of the Budget Framework papers, preliminary estimates and workplans indicates that most MDAs have made policy/budget statements on addre4ssing gender equity, environmental and HIV/AIDS without accompanying resource allocation to implement them. Accounting Officers should ensure that cross-cutting issues are properly mainstreamed in their budget and work plans as you finalise your detailed estimates.

E. LOCAL GOVERNMENT ISSUES

Issuance of Indicative Planning Figures (IPFs) to LGs for FY 2014/15 for Direct Grants

48. Based on the advice by the Sector line Ministries responsible for the grants transferred to local governments, a schedule of transfers to local governments for FY 2014/15 is attached as **Annex 7.** The Local Government Accounting Officers are reminded that LGs should not use any other IPFs issued by any Central Government institution other than the ones communicated by the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development (MoFPED).

Issuance of Indicative Planning Figures (IPFs) to LGs FY 2014/15 for funds appropriated under Central Governments

- 49. The Central Government institutions with decentralized funds currently appropriated under Central Government votes **as attached in Annex 8**, should note the following while finalizing their budget:
 - i.) Clearly indicate funds earmarked for local governments by Vote and submit to this Ministry by **11**th **of April 2014**; and

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ii.) Indicate activities which are financed in Local Governments but managed at the Centre.

Submission of Pupil/ Student Registers by local government for UPE and USE Schools

50. Government has noted with concern inconsistencies on pupils and students records for primary and secondary schools. This has an effect on proper budgeting for Wage, Capitation Grant and School Facilitation Grant among others. In order to address the above, a new template has been developed to capture school enrolment by birth, class and gender. The process will start with capturing information in the excel sheet at school level and endorsed by the Class/stream teacher and the Head Teacher as communicated in my Circular of 1st April 2014. This information should then be submitted to the Head of Department (DEO), and later to the Accounting officer who will submit to the Permanent Secretary/Secretary to the Treasury, Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development with a copy to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education and Sports not later than 30th April 2014.

Implementation of the Treasury Single Account

51, Effective this FY 2013/14, Government has started the implementation of the Treasury Single Account (TSA) to improve the overall management of public resources in line with international best practice. This modality will be extended to the local governments effective FY 2014/15. In this regard, all Local Governments will be required to operate one Single Account in a Commercial Bank, effective 1st July 2014. You should therefore close all Other Accounts in Commercial Banks by 1st July 2014

Salary and Gratuity for Elected Political Leaders and District Councilors' Allowance

52. For the last two years, Government has continued to experience difficulties in payment of councilors' allowances, ex-gratia for LCI and LCII Chairpersons as well as salary and gratuity for the eligible categories of political leaders due to lack of adequate information to guide the allocation of resources during budget preparation. To ensure proper budgeting for FY 2014/15, a window has been provided under the Local Government Output Budgeting Tool (LGoBT) to enter the names of LCI, LCII and LCIII Chairpersons; Councilors both at the District and Municipal Council levels; and Executive Committee members both at the District and Municipal Council levels.

Preparation of Item Budgets by Local Governments under the LGOBT

53. The information captured during the preparation of the Budget Framework papers using the LGOBT automatically appears under the work plans of the

respective Departments against the various outputs in a Local Government function. Local Governments are advised to prepare the expenditure details at item level based on classifications under Chart of Accounts to produce their detailed budget estimates for FY 2014/15. The Local Government Accounting Officers are further informed that budget generated out of other budgeting format apart from the LGOBT will not be accepted and it will be an offence to present such a budget to council.

Preparation of performance reports

54. I have noted with concern the lack of involvement of heads of Departments/Projects in preparation of performance reports, indicating how the funds released to their cost centers have been utilized, the outputs delivered and physical location. In FY 2014/15, we shall vigorously enforce the requirement for performance reporting and a provision has been provided within the Output Budgeting Tool (OBT) for Heads of Departments/Projects to individually endorse both hard and soft copies of their "baby databases".

F. PREPARATION OF THE DETAILED BUDGET ESTIMATES FOR THE FY 2014/15

55. Accounting Officers of both Central and Local Government Votes should note that detailed budget estimates should be prepared and submitted concurrently with the annual and quarterly workplans as well as procurement plans for the FY 2014/15 in line with the timelines indicated in Annexes 9a and qb
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G. SUBMISSION OF ESTIMATES

56. Central Government Accounting Officers must ensure that their detailed budget estimates are submitted in both hard and soft copies (OBT database) to the Permanent Secretary/Secretary to the Treasury, Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, for the attention of the Director Budget not later than Thursday 17th April 2014.

- 57. Local Government Accounting Officers should submit both hard and soft copies of their detailed budget estimates for the FY 2014/15 to the Permanent Secretary/Secretary to the Treasury, Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, for the attention of Director Budget, for review, not later than Thursday 17th April 2014.
- 58. Accounting Officers for local governments should note that when presenting budgets to Council, only detailed budget estimates generated out of the OBT should be attached and not excel sheets.
- 59. As a reminder, Accounting Officers of all statutory organisations should also submit their detailed statutory expenditure estimates to this Ministry **not later than Thursday 17**th **April 2014**, for onward submission to H.E the president.

BUDGETING FOR PENSION AND GRATUITY FOR FY 2014/15

Reference is made to my 1^{st} Budget Call Circular, on the above subject. In the past, there have been concerns of delays in paying commuted Pension Gratuity for retiring Civil Servants which resulted in accumulated stock of pension arrears.

As a measure to address the payment delays, government has decided that commuted gratuity will be paid by the vote where the public officer is retiring from after Ministry of Public Service has verified the computations. You should however, note that, budgeting for monthly Pension in FY 2014/15 will remain the responsibility of the Ministry of Public Service.

This is therefore to request All Accounting Officers to submit all cases of Officers due for retirement in 2014/15 to the Ministry of Public Service for verification with copies to this Ministry, by 1st April 2014, with the following:

- i) Details of those who are to retire from March to June 2014; and
- Details of those due for retirement in FY 2014/15;

In turn, Ministry of Public Service should submit the breakdown of the verified commuted gratuity of these staff by Vote to this Ministry by 30th April 2014.

You are advised to give this matter serious attention, and the Accounting officers will individually be responsible for the inaccuracies and delays in submission of the required information.

RE: CIRCULAR TO PROCURING AND DISPOSING ENTITIES ON THE BULK PROCUREMENT BY NITA-U OF INTERNET BANDWIDTH AND DELIVERY THROUGH THE NATIONAL DATA TRANSMISSION BACKBONE INFRASTRUCTURE (NBI) – CIRCULAR NO.1 OF 2014

Reference is made to the Cabinet approval of the IT Rationalization Strategy in Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) contained in cabinet minute 261-CT 2012. One of the pillars under the strategy is to use the NBI/EGI infrastructure as the primary vehicle for all Government data, internet and voice services.

In order to implement the IT Rationalization Strategy, NITA-U using open international competitive bidding, procured a service provider; M/s Bandwidth and Cloud Services Group Ltd to provide bulk internet bandwidth to all Entities.

The Permanent Secretary/ Secretary to Treasury in a letter dated 28th October 2013 that was copied to all Accounting Officers informed all MDAs to work with NITA-U to implement the IT rationalisation strategy and advised all Accounting Officers not to renew contracts for internet bandwidth after 31st December, 2013. A copy of the letter of PS/ST is attached hereto as Annex I.

The Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) held discussions with NITA-U to ensure the smooth implementation of the Strategy within the scope of the PPDA Act and Regulations. The current legal framework (Section 7 (n) of the PPDA Act and PPDA Regulations 102 &103) allows for this arrangement where one Entity undertakes the lead role for commonly procured items on behalf of other Entities.

PPDA has noted the following immediate benefits that will accrue from the use of the NBI infrastructure under NITA-U for the provision of bulk internet bandwidth to Entities-

i. Efficiency gains by reduction in procurement lead times since the Entities will not be required to procure internet bandwidth but will enter into MOUs and service

level agreements that will state the amount of internet bandwidth required by each Entity;

- ii. Economy gains due to reduction in the cost of the internet bandwidth services as a result of the bulk procurement from one service provider by NITA-U;
- iii. Harmonization of the unit costs of internet bandwidth across Entities;
- Standardization of the service level agreements and the quality of services for all Entities; and
- v. Performance tracking and measurement of the service provider by NITA-U. The purpose of this circular therefore, is to advise all Entities that the implementation of the provision of internet bandwidth by NITA-U will be phased in accordance with the Entities that are connected to the National Backbone Infrastructure as follows-
 - 1. With effect from 15th January 2014, the Entities listed under Category A in Annex II that are currently connected to the NBI will be required to enter into MOUs and service level agreements with NITA-U for provision of internet bandwidth.
 - 2. With effect from 1st July 2014, the Entities listed under Category B in Annex II who are scheduled to be connected to the NBI by 30th June 2014; will be required to enter into MOUs and service level agreements with NITA-U for provision of internet bandwidth.
 - 3. With effect from 1st July 2015, the Entities listed under Category C in Annex II who are scheduled to be connected to the NBI by 30th June 2015; will be required to enter into MOUs and service level agreements with NITA-U for provision of internet bandwidth.

NITA-U will in the subsequent years update all Entities on when they shall be connected to the NBI and all such Entities will be required to enter into similar arrangements with NITA-U.

The Entities listed under the different Categories in Annex II are advised to review their existing contracts with internet service providers and where necessary legally terminate the contracts in consultation with the Solicitor General.

Please note that once the Ministry of Finance and Economic Planning has implemented the transfer of the funds for internet bandwidth from the respective Entities to NITA-U, the services by NITA-U will not be deemed as procurement contracts. However, NITA-U will submit periodic reports to PPDA on the performance of the MOUs and the service level agreements.

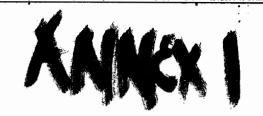

We appreciate your plans aimed at enabling NITA-U actualize the implementation of the rationalization and harmonization of ICT services across the MDAs through the proposed harmonized bulk procurement of internet band width to various MDAs.

We have no objection to your request since harmonized bulk procurement will save Government money. Consequently, we advise that:

- IV. However, in the next FY 2014/15, all funds under these MDAs will be transferred to your Vote to enable smooth harmonized bulk procurement.
