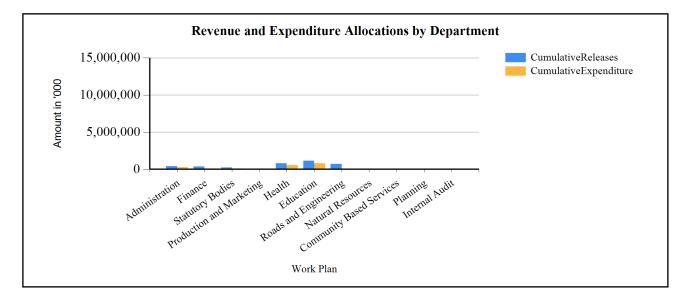
Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2018/19

Entebbe Municipal received a total of shs 3,775,806 billions by end of quarter one. The receipts received were 21% of the approved budget. The receipts were mainly attributed to by conditional government transfers of about 50.4% of the total. Local revenue of about 978.590 millions was received during the quarter. 100% of the total receipts were released to the departments with education and health getting the lion share of the release which was mainly spent on payment of staff salaries.

The %release spent was 66% with natural resources having 100% spent . the 34% unspent was mainly because funds were released late hence affecting the absorption rate of the funds . most of the unspent was under development funds since procurement was still ongoing by end of the quarter

the under performance in revenue was mainly because the receipts for locally raised revenue were way below the target of 25% of the approved budget

The Municipal received total local revenue of shs 978,590.031 billions as compared to the approved budget of 5,733,274 billions representing a performance of 17% which is way below target for the quarter by 8%. the under performance was mainly because sources like park fees among others could not be enforced because of political pronouncements. other sources which performed below target was mainly because of poor enforcement systems and sometime political interference.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

The Municipal received a total of shs 2,261,141 billions as central government transfers representing a performance of 24.5% of the approved budget. of the receipts 275 were discretionary government transfers which is mianly urban wage, none wage and the equalization grant which performed at 33% of the approved budget. all the central government transfers performed on and above target except for pension arrears which performed at 0% hence affecting the general performance . however these will be expected in quarter two.

Cumulative Performance for Donor Funding

no funds were realized by end of the quarter because of delayed approval for supplementary budgets by the accountant general . however other funds expected during quarter one were not released by the donors as expected

The administration department received a total quarterly out turn of Ushs. 416,303million against the planned Quarter of Ushs. 821,307million representing a performance of 51%, of the 51% development accounting 1% with local revenue accounting for 18%, pension and gratuity 25%. the performance below the target of 25% was mainly because of inadequate local resources realized at the end of the quarter

The department spent 82% of the quarterly out turn on payment of staff salaries, staff allowances, pension and gratuity, administrative capital and supervision of sub county program implementation. The under performance on the budget was to meager funds that were availed during the quarter and the activities were carried forward to second quarter.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department had an unspent balance of Ushs. 75,322 million with UShs. 18,629,173 on wage and UShs. 56,692,997 on Non wage. These funds were carried forward to second quarter to facilitate salary incrementment for staff who have served longer years, activities that are still in the procurement process and other utilities.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

Some of the physical performance highlights include payment of staff salaries, monthly allowances, payment of pension and gratuity, purchased stationery, supervision of sub county program implementation and preparation of reports.

The low performance in the release for the quarter was mainly because the municipal did not realise the planned 25% of the budget hence affecting allocations to departments The department spent 89% however 11% of the total receipts was not spent which was contributed by wage and none wage the total receipts for the quarter. the recurrent expenditures were mainly done on payment of salaries ,pension and gratuity, allowances and other recurrent activities.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department had unspent balanced of shs 38,757 which is 11% of the receipt. the unspent was mainly contributed by wage and none wage

The balances on wage was mainly as a result of Over budgeting for Salaries.

The unspent under none wage was because of Delay in the procurement process for fuel and Delays in inputting the Imprest account on the IFMS system by the office of the accountant General where other balance was supposed to have been put.

Paid salaries and allowances to 12 staffs.Catered for medical capitation,Lunch, procured fuel for generator and stationery,data collected on revenue sources,3 monthly reports and 1 quarterly and final accounts for 2017/2018.

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The quarterly allocation to statutory bodies were Ushs. 213.689million (17.2%) representing a performance of 72% of the quarterly plan. This included Wage, LG ex-gratia, multi-sectoral transfers and urban unconditional grant (non-wage). This percentage release was recorded below average due inadequate local revenue realized by the Municipal at the end of the quarter hence affecting the allocation to the department. The quarterly expenditure were Ugx 213.7million against the quarter's release of Ushs 223.6millions representing 95.6percent utilization capacity and the overall revenue performance represented 17.2% against the standard 25% by close of Q1.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The Departments had unspent balance of Ugx 9.9million, which were funds earmarked to facilitated political leaders allowances and donations however these were not done in time. the balance of 2.913 under wage was as a result of over budgeting
