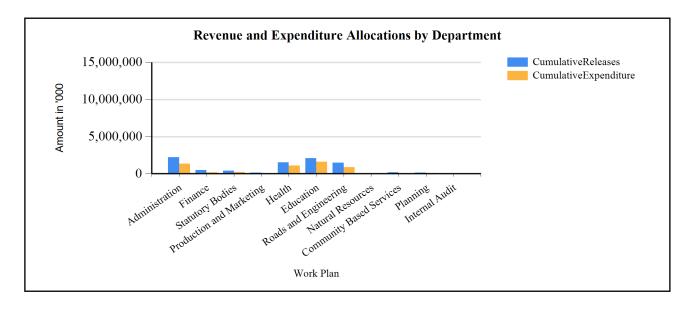

Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2018/19

By end of quarter two, Entebbe Municipal Council received a total of UGX8,781,916 billions . which was 49% of the approved budget. By end of quarter two entebbe had received 30% of its budget which was a low performance as compared to the expected 50% because of low collections in some sources . other grants including central government transfers and donor development performed above the target of 50% because most of the funds especially development were sent in early to ensure timely completion of projects. Of the total release, 99% was released across departments leaving a balance of 1% not warranted and this was mainly because funds were received late resulting into 49% budget released. departments like administration, health, education and works received bigger allocations as compared to others however most of these monies were to pay salaries, pension arrears, and road works. of the release, 74% was spent where departments like internal audit, natural resources, health statutory bodies and finance performed above 90%. departments which did not perform like roads was mainly because of late release of funds . other departments like community ,education and others were because most of the funds were for development projects which had not started. funds spent were mainly used to pay salaries, pension arrears, road works, allowances and operational activities and travels abroad among others

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Quarter2

Entebbe Municipal Council performed at 30% of the budget as compared to the expected 50% by end of this quarter. The below target performance was mainly attributed to by some revenues which performed below target including rent and rates from private entities, park fees, property and business registration among others . the under performance was mainly because the taxi park is under construction so no funds are expected , the new valuation role for property reflected higher values as compared to previous ,hence there is need to sensitize the property owners on the new rates.other sources like business registration was affected by the pilot project of TREP from URA which business people perceived as double taxing. Council intends to intensify senstisation and enforcement of the tax payers to ensure that these budgeted funds are realized

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

By end of quarter two, entebbe Municipal Council had received a total of UGX 6,959,022 billions as Central Government transfers representing a performance 58% of the budget. of the receipts other government transfers performed at 63% of the budget mainly because most of these funds were a one off which had to be spent in the first quarters of the financial year. the performance of 64% under URF was mainly because of the additional funding received during the quarter other transfers also performed within plan by end of quarter two except for sector conditional none wage and this is because the education department does not receive these funds in second quarter though it was budget, there has also been delays in receipt of YLP funds

Cumulative Performance for Donor Funding

Entebbe Municipal Council received a total of UGX80,000 as donor funding from Wuhan Municipal people's government . the performance of 73% was mainly because the funds were received as a supplement which was balances brought forward from the previous financial year, the unspent was mainly because these funds were not released in time, funding for the current financial year is yet to be received.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The administration department received a total quarterly out turn of Ushs. 1,792,831billions against the planned of Ushs. 821,307millions representing a performance of 218%,The over performance was mainly attributed to by Pension arrears which performed at 400% of the quarterly plan resulting from the 100% budget release. other revenue allocations to this department performed at 100% except for Local revenue which was mainly affected by the low collections which performed below target. The department managed to spend 65% of the total release for the quarter which was mainly affected by wage, pension arrears and development. The low absorption rate was mainly as a result of delays in procurement for DDEG projects, delays in recruitment of new staff and delays in verification of pensioners

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department had an unspent balance of Ushs. 26,450 millions on wage and UShs. 666,667.398 millions on Non wage and Ushs. 12,643.051 on government development. The unspent balances on release was because of the delays in recruitment of new staff hence resulting into low absorption rate. Balances on none wage was mainly pension arrears which will be used in the next quarter to pay pension and gratuity arrears for other pensioners. The delay in the procurement process has also resulted in the low absorption of the development grant DDEG however plans are underway to utilize the grant by end of third quarter

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

Some of the physical performance highlights include timely payment of staff salaries, timely payment monthly allowances, paid all the pensioners their entitlements as planned in time, paid all pension arrears, cleared all the outstanding utility bills for the quarter and conducted the supervisory role for all departments and facilitated the day today operational activities of the department.

Finance department received 49% of its planned revenue for the quarter. 13% comprised of Wage and the balance of 87% was non wage and local revenue which was spent on allowance, data collection of various revenue sources, sensitization of tax payers, and department's operational expenses. The low performance was as a result of uncollected local revenue due to the fact that the market and the park is still under construction.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department had unspent balanced of shs 47,202 millions by end of the quarter two. the unspent was mainly contributed by wage and none wage

The balances on wage was mainly as a result of Over budgeting for Salaries.

The unspent under none wage was because of delay in the procurement process for fuel and stationery and delays in requisitioning of the monies.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

Paid salaries and allowances to 13 staffs. Catered for medical capitation, Lunch, procured fuel for generator and stationery, data collected on revenue and sensitized tax payers on various revenue sources, 3 monthly reports and 1 quarterly.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department had unspent balance of 6% of the total release for the two quarters of which Ushs. 5,938.217 on wage and Ushs. 17,675.726 on non wage and these funds were carried forward to second quarter to facilitate activities that are still in the procurement process. the wage balance was as result of over budgeting

Some of the physical performance highlights include payment of salaries and allowances purchased stationery, held Committee meetings, and full Council, catered for welfare and entertainment, facilitated travels inland and abroad.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department received 123% of the Planned revenue for the quarter, of this all central government transfers performed at 100% of the quarterly budget. Transfers to Divisions which was mainly composed of local revenue and urban none wage performed above target because most of the planned activities were conducted during this quarter, local revenue however performed below budget because of low collections which affected the allocation to the department, other revenues like DDEG and sector development performed above target resulting from timely releases from central government to allow Development projects to be completed in time, 56% of what was released to the department for the quarter was spent, this was mainly spent on payment of wage, agriculture extension services and other operational activities within the department

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department has got unspent balance of 41% of the total release for the last two quarters. The wage balance of UGX2,218millions was because the funds were not adequate to pay for staff in the department hence not utilized. The other balances are development grants which have not been utilized because of the delays in the procurement process

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

All the 3 staff member were paid their salaries and 4 paid facilitating allowances
All staff members were facilitated with fuel for their extension activities and 2 received protective wear
4 staff members were facilitated to enable them carry out routine extension work like report writing, farm visits, travel to attend departmental meetings etc
