Kotido DLG received in ('000s) a total of UShs, 10,185,641(49% of the approved annual budget of UShs, 20,634,290) by the end of Ouarter 2 of FY 2019/20. These funds in ('000s) included: Locally Raised Revenues- UShs. 51,632 (25% of the annual approved local revenue of UShs, 206,526); Discretionary Government transfers- UShs, 1,843,047 (57% of the approved annual amount of UShs, 3,239,445); Conditional Government Transfers- UShs, 5,468,287 (60% of the approved amount of UShs, 9,094,802); Other Government Transfers- UShs. 2,342,514 (40% of the annual approved amount of UShs. 5,846,592; and External Financing- UShs. 480,161 (21% of the annual approved amount of UShs, 2,246,924). The under-revenue performance by the end of Quarter 2 was majorly due to no Local Revenue warranted despite collecting UShs. 101,480,743 by end of quarter 2, less NUSAF III funds, no RPLRP funds, less YLP fund and less external financing received during the quarter. Kotido DLG disbursed all the funds to the departments who spent in ('000s) UShs. 6,233,472 (61% of the released budget and 30% of the annual approved budget of UShs. 20,634,290) by the end of Quarter 2 as follows: Administration received UShs. 4,780,281 and spent UShs. 2,966,473; Finance received UShs. 132,298 and spent UShs. 109,937; Statutory bodies received 272,091 and spent UShs. 241,915; Production received UShs. 427,152 and spent UShs. 283,251; Health received UShs. 1,245,144 and spent UShs. 1,039,128; Education received UShs. 2.298,669 and spent UShs, 1.044,151; Roads received UShs, 273,213 and spent UShs, 133,561; Water received UShs, 284,911 and spent UShs. 81,028; Natural Resources received UShs. 127,035 and spent UShs. 98,628; Community Based Services received UShs. 231,103 and spent UShs. 170,494; Planning received UShs. 76,084 and spent UShs. 32,400; Internal Audit received UShs. 20,907 and spent UShs. 18,077; and Trade, Industry and LD received UShs. 16,755 and spent UShs. 14,429. By end of Quarter one, Kotido DLG generally had spent in ('000s) UShs. 1,634,574 (61% of the received UShs. 10,185,641) received on: Wage- UShs. 2.203.889 (75% of the received UShs. 2,933,612); N/wage- UShs. 1,558,916 (53% of the received UShs. 2,920,862); Domestic Development- UShs. 2,103,535 (55% of the received UShs. 3,851,006) and External Financing- UShs. 367,132 (76% of the received UShs. 480,161). By the end of Quarter 2, Kotido DLG had under expenditure performance of 61% against received funds and 30% against the budget was mainly because of understaffing with more wage allocated to the departments compared to the staff in post, Delayed request of funds by activity implementers, Receiving of tertiary grants yet Kotido DLG does not have a tertiary institutions. Less pension arrears paid to beneficiaries missing supplier numbers in time. Delay in procuring and prequalifying service providers / contractors. More specific reasons of under expenditures are detailed in the different departments

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Kotido DLG received all the expected local revenue from Ministry of Finance to a total of UShs. 51,631,578 by the end of Quarter 2 as disbursement from Ministry of finance. The expected local revenue performed at 25% because, the Local Government was not able to warrant any local revenues for departments as a result of not meeting the obligation for the Quarter 1 disbursed fans to the District. However, by the end of Quarter two, Kotido DLG has collected UShs. 101,480,743 which will clear the debt with Ministry of Finace and also help with enabling Quarter 2 and 3 disbursements.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

Kotido DLG received (in '000s) a total of UShs. 7,311,334 (59.3%) out of UShs. 12,334,247,000 as Central Government Transfers. This included Discretionary transfers which performed at 57% (UShs. 1,843,047 out of 3,239,445) and Conditional transfers which performed at 60% (UShs. 5,468,287 out of 9,094,802). There were more funds received in the quarter compared to what was planned because two thirds of the development funds were disbursed to the District which had been budgeted at quarterly while all pension arrears were received in Quarter 1. These were warranted and disbursed to all the 12 departments for expenditure.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Kotido DLG received (in '000s) a total of UShs. 2,342,514 as Other Government Transfers. This represented 40% of the annual expected amount of UShs. 5,846,592,204. There was poor performance of Other Government Transfers despite more funds received under URF (60%) because less NUSAF III funds and less funds received form Ministry of gender were and no Regional Pastoral Livelihoods Resilience Project funds received during Ouarter 1.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

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Kotido DLG received (in '000s) a total of UShs. 480,161 (21% of the annual approved external financing budget of UShs. 2,246,924). The under revenue performance of external financing was due to less funds received from UNICEF (25%) and Global Fund (18%) while there were no funds received from UNFPA, World Bank and GIZ despite having GAVI performing well at 53% by the end of quarter 2.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

Administration department received 122% (UShs. 2,568,662,000) of its quarterly budget with an annual cumulative of UShs. 4,780,281,000 (261% of the annual approved budget of UShs. 7,834,865). The over revenue performance of 122% quarterly and 61% annually was due to Pension arrears which planned quarterly but all funds were received in Quarter 1 (UShs. 1,588,403,000), NUSAF III funds (165%) and LLGs DUG N/wage and LLG DDEG funds with UShs. 49,913,000 and UShs. 505,716,000 respectively warranted under administration department despite being budgeted under different departments in Kotido's 5 LLGs. Administration spent ('000s) UShs 2,966,473 by end of Quarter 2 and UShs. 2,796,279 in Quarter 2 on: Operation of Administration department- UShs. 117,456 (Wage- UShs. 96,396 and N/Wage- 21,061); Human Resource Management- UShs. 1,007; Capacity building- UShs. 18,360; Supervision of Sub counties- UShs. 1,200; Public Information Dissemination- UShs. 2,395; Assets and Facilities management- UShs. 557; Payroll and Human Resources Management system- UShs. 781,768; Records Management- UShs. 835; Information collection- UShs. 1,118; Procurement Services- UShs. 918; and NUSAF III Projects- UShs. 1,651,340. The department had over expenditure of 143% quarterly due to the pension arrears received in first mostly paid in second quarter and NUSAF III Projects which were paid by more than a half. However, there was 38% under expenditure against the budget due to less local revenue received, less capacity building sessions conducted and less LLG expenditures by LLGs.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

Administration department had ('000s) UShs. 1,813,808 as unspent balances by end of Quarter 2 of which; Wage was UShs. 33,553 not paid due to less staff in the department, Non wage was UShs. 1,082,489 for unimplemented activities, pension arrears and LLGs activities, and Domestic Development of UShs. 697,766 part of which was DDEG for capacity building and LLGs as well as NUSAF III projects balances. The major reasons for unspent balances were; 1- Lack of supplier numbers by some beneficiaries of the pension arrears 2- Less staff in the department compared to the wage received. 3- Poor weather conditions affected monitoring and supervision of sub counties. 4- Delay in enrollment of the new CAO on the IFMS

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

By the end of Quarter 2, Finance department had received (in '000s) UShs. 132,298 (41%) of the annual budget approved budget of UShs. 324,000, of which UShs. 64,583 was received in Quarter 2. The department experienced 80% under revenue performance during the quarter because of less funds allocated by LLGs to finance department and no Local Revenue warranted for the department during Quarters 2. The Department spent ('000s) UShs. 109,937 by end of Quarter 2 on: LG Financial management services- UShs. 78,583 (Wage- UShs. 66,789 and N/wage- UShs. 11,794); Revenue mgmt and collection- UShs. 633; LG Budget and Planning- UShs. 2,173; LG Expenditure- UShs. 2,821; Account Services- UShs. 2,288; and IFMS- UShs. 10,000. The department spent less than received at 50% which was a result of high wage received and spent less while many activities were shifted to quarter 2 and unprocured services during the quarter.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

Finance department had unspent funds (in '000s) totaling to UShs. 22,361 of which for wage was UShs. 15,853 as unpaid salaries and Non wage- UShs. 6,508 for unimplemented department activities and services not procured. The reasons for unspent funds included; 1- Less staff in the department compared to the wage which was received during the quarter. 2- The breakdown in the generator made it difficult to carry out routine transactions in the system. 3- Delayed requisition of funds by activity implementers 4 - Inadequate transport with the department not having any vehicle or motorcycle for mobility thereby depending on other departments.

Statutory bodies department cumulatively received Ugx 272,091,000 and this represented 50% of the approved annual Budget of Ugx 545,943,000. The quarterly revenues performance was at 97%, less than what was expected due to no Local Revenue received despite received 133% of the DDEG funds. This resulted in under revenue performance during quarter two. The department spent Ugx 241,915,000 and this represented 44% of the approved expenditure budget and 100% quarterly. The expenditures were on; Council Administration- UShs. 112,916,000 (Wage- UShs. 72,466,000 and N/Wage- UShs. 40,449,000); Contracts Committee-UShs. 1,874,000; Recruitment services- UShs. 15,301,000 (Wage- UShs. 9,030,000 and N/wage- UShs. 6,271,000); Standing Committee- UShs. 5,570,000; and Council Block slab construction- UShs. 50,000,000;

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account
