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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2019/20

Nebbi Municipal Council planned to receive a total of UGX 6,585,679,000 in the FY 2019/20. By the end of the second quarter the Municipal was able to receive a total of UGX 3,226,131,000 representing 49% of the budget. This performance is below the 50% target for the second quarter because of under performances seen under External Financing which performed at 32% and other government transfers which performed at 27%. The underperformance under External financing is attributed to zero transfer of Nutrition fund from UNICEF. While under other government transfers the underperformance is due to non-receipt of funds under Support to PLE (UNEB) and less release for YLP fund in the second quarter of the Financial Year. Out of the cumulative amount received in the two quarters, a total of 2,327,424,000 (72%) was meant for wages, 516,804,000 (16%) for non-wages, 179,999,000 (6%) as local revenue, 176,953,000 (5%) for domestic development and 24,952,000 (1%) for donor activities in the Municipality. By the end of the second quarter, the Municipality was able to spend a total of 1,748,792,000 representing 27% of the budget spent and 54% of the releases spent. Of this total expenditure a total of 1,220,417,000 representing 70% was spent on wages, 454,168,000 (26%) was spent on non-wage recurrent, 58,703,000 (3%) on domestic development and 15,503,000 (1%) was spent on donor activities in the municipality. A critical analysis unfolds the worst expenditure to have occurred under Domestic Development where only 33% of the amount released was spent. By the end of quarter two, a total of UGX 1,477,339,000 was left on account representing 46% of the total release, the bulk of these funds is under Non-Wage Recurrent and Domestic Development, this is due to delays in the procurement process where some departments initiated their procurement needs late, Some funds needed to be accumulated across two quarters before the activities can be realistically/materially executed, Division budgets not being captured on the PBS tool even after supplementary was received for local Revenues this means transfers to these lower local governments could not be made and difficulties within the IFMIS.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Locally Raised Revenues expected in Q2 was 55,266,488 but actual out turn is 85,883,122. This is 155% quarter performance. This is attributed to less Local revenue appropriated for FY 2019/2020 by the Parliament of Uganda. The supplementary of 301m is yet to be invested in the system

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

In Q2, We expected to receive 1,424,057,301 as central Government transfers but actual receipt was 1,396,387,961(98%). At the end of the quarter, Central government transfers performed at 52% and this is slightly above the 50% performance target. The reasons for this high performance is overwhelming performance in the following areas; Production and marketing Sector Development grant, Education sector development grant, Urban Discretionary Development Equalization grant, and Urban unconditional grant wage.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

In Q2, other government transfers expected was 140,291,887 but actual out turn was 67,651,130 and this signified 27% quarterly performance.

This poor performance is attributed to non receipt of Support to PLE(UNEB) and YLP funds.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

In the Quarter (Q2), 16,810,435 was received against the planned of 19,500,000 and this represents 32% quarter performance. This low performance is attributed to non receipt of UNICEF- Nutrition fund.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department received 201,336,000 which is 59% of the total annual budget .Recurrent revenues is at 56% and is constituted of Gratuity for local governments of 41,913,000(50%), Pension for local governments of 15,407,000 (50%) locally raised revenue of 9,450,000 (52%), Unconditional Grant (Non-Wage) of 23,850,000(140%) and Urban Unconditional Grant (Wage) of 62,680,000 (50%) and development revenues comprising DDEG of 37,768,000 (151%). The department expected revenues for the quarter to be 159,197,000; however, the quarter out turn was 201,336,000 which is 126% of the expected revenues. Here in, Gratuity and pension for local governments expected were all received signifying 100% quarterly performance in each, locally raised revenues expected was 10,507,000 with an out turn of 9,450,000 which is only 90% of the quarter plan, Unconditional Grant (Non-Wage) expected was 5,946,000 and the out turn was 23,850,000 represented by 401% quarterly performance and Urban Unconditional Grant (Wage) expected was 62,680,000 and the out turn received at 100%, Expected DDEG was 8,292,000 with an out turn of 37,768,000 (456%). However, the department spent 135,541,000 which is at 85% of the quarter budget and the total unspent balance stands 96,295,000 (25%) and this is constituted of Recurrent balances (Wage of 16,373,000, Non-Wage of 61,073,000) and Domestic development balance of 18,850,000.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

-Gratuity to local government staff during the quarter was not paid since the quarter out turn was small to pay the retiree. This will be effected in second quarter. - Budget cut more especially in local revenues to the divisions which cleared off budget lines for transfers to the LLGs. These revenues have not been invested in the system. - Delayed releases of funds. - Delay in procurement processes.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

The following activities were carried out in the quarter: -Paid wages to 32 traditional staffs and 8 casual laborers in the quarter. -Paid pension to 8 local government staffs who retired from services. -Facilitated training committee meetings -Updated and facilitated monthly production of payroll and payment file for the quarter. -Facilitated staff travels - Procured stationery. - Procured fuel and lubricants. - Purchased airtime.

Revenue Summary Overall revenue expectation for the Department for the year is UGX 235.744 million of which UGX 58.936 million (25%) was expected in Qtr 2, but UGX 65,110 million or 110% of the expectation was received being 28% of the annual expectation. Break of outturn: 1) Out of the Planned annual Local Revenue of UGX 56.626 million to the department UGX 14.159 million was planned for q2 but UGX 12.564 million was received and used. This is 22% of the annual expected local revenue. 2) UGX 30.570 million was expected of Transfer to LLG. But UGX 19.420 million was transferred representing over performance by 68% of annual budget in quarter two. Quarter performance is 254% of the expected UGX 7.643 million 3) Budgeted Urban nonwage recurrent grant for the year is UGX 45.161 million. 25% of the fund was expected and was received in the quarter amounting UGX 11.290 million. All expected amount for the quarter was received. 4) UGX 87 .340 million was the annual wage budget for the department. UGX 21.835 million (25%) was expected in q2. The whole amount (100%) was received. 5) UGX 16.047 of DDEG was expected in the sector in the year. Of which 25% (UGX .4.012 million) was the quarter 2 expectation. No transfers were reported for the department. Summary of expenditure: 1) 83% of wage grant received in the quarter was spent 2) 108% of nonwage recurrent was consumed (UNWR and Local Revenue) and, 3) 0% of development grant was spent This represents an overall 58% expenditure performance for the department

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

1) Division budgets were not captured on the PBS tool. 2) There has been expenditure overlap in the reporting tool which is now automatically generated 3) Some funds needed to be accumulated across two quarters before the activities can be realistically/materially executed

quarter one departmental revenues 43,478,000 planned for the quarter. Quarter out turn is 48,291,000 which is 111% and 50 % of the overall budget. Local revenue out turn is 10,608,000 which is 89% of the planned local revenues of 11,952,000. Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs out turn is 7,060,000 which is 782% of the planned 903,000. Non-Wage out turn is 18,485,000 which is 100% of the planned 18, 485,000. Wage out turn is 12,138,000 of the planned 12,138,000 which is 100% Quarter plan The DDEG Quarter out turn is zero of the planned 528,000 Total expenditure is 27,229,000 representing 62% against the quarter plan of 44,006,000. The overall expenditure is 32%, cumulative out turn is 57,127,000. The total Unspent Balance is 35,738,000 cumulatively which is 39% comprising of Non-Wage of 25,898,000, Wage of 9,840,000 and development of 12,000.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The recurrent balances on the account is 35,738,000 cumulatively and is comprising of Wage is 9,840,000, Non-Wage of 25,898,000 and DDEG of 12,000. Reasons. for unspent balance -Ex-gratia of LCI and LCIIs accumulate up to the last quarter that is when it is spent. -Certain item like computer supply the expenditure will be in fourth Quarter since the amount allocated for the procurement is spread in small amount in all the four quarters. - For wage, the salaries for the political leaders (Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Chairperson LCIII of Central and Thatha could not be paid because they were not validated. For two months they did not access payroll and their arrears are still pending. -Certain planned outputs could not be implemented due to limited resource allocated though it is in the budget, no physical cash was spent thus contributing to the unspent balance. example travel inland of 7,000,000 was cut to only 4,200,000 meaning there was short fall of what was requested. Generally there was short fall in the funds to be utilized yet it reflects the quarterly budget and the difference remains as unspent.

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The Department expected to receive 56,464,000 which is 50% of the total budget but received 59,455,000 (53%) which is higher than expected this because Development funds received was 12,857,000 (67%) which is more than expected and Recurrent revenue was 46,598,000 (50%). On the other hand, the Quarter out turn was 29,783,000 which is 105% of the quarter plan of which Locally raised revenue was 444,000 which is 89% of quarter plan, Sector conditional grant (non-Wage) was 10,810,000 which is 100% of quarter plan, Sector conditional grant (wage) was 12,101,000 which is 100% of quarter plan and Sector development was 6,428,000 which is 133% of the quarter plan. However, the department spent 21,197,000 which is 75% of the quarter budget and on the other hand Total budget performance was 37,223,000 (33%) which is below the expected 50%. The total Unspent balance is 22,232,000 which is 37% of which recurrent revenue balance is 12,295,000 which is 26% and development revenue balance is 9,937,000 which is 77%.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The funds for Sector development grant was not utilized because the funds could not execute the activity because it was inadequate and has to be allowed to accumulate. Bureaucracy in procurement processes also delayed utilization of funds especially those that require advertisement. Locally raised revenue received is 1,778,000 (89%), unconditional grant non-wage is 2,700,000(100%) and Urban unconditional grant wage of 5,792,000(100%) indicating 98% quarterly performance of recurrent revenues. On the expenditure side, the department spent 2,549,000 which is only 24% of the quarter budget and the total unspent balance is 11,962,000 (60%) and this is constituted of wage of 7,690,000 and non-wage of 4,272,000.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department received 4,572,000 which is 48% of the total annual budget instead of a 50% cumulative out turn. The 2% difference was brought about by the less locally raised revenues received during the quarter. The above comprised of locally raised revenues of 890,000 (39%), Sector Conditional Grant (Non-Wage) of 1,812,000 (50%) and Urban Conditional Wage (Wage) of 1,869,000 (50%) The department expected to receive a total of 4,685,000 although the quarter out turn could only be 4,572,000 which is 98% of the expected. Herein, locally raised revenues expected was 1,003000 yet an out turn of only 890,000 (89%) was received during the quarter. Sector Conditional Grant (Non Wage) expected was 1,812,000 and the out turn received was at 100% and Urban Unconditional Grant (Wage) expected was 1,869,000 and the out turn was also at 100%. The department however spent 5,009,000 which is at 107% of the quarter budget leaving recurrent balances of 2,371,000 which is 27%. Therefore, the departments total expenditure stands at 35%.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

-Little funds were not spent because the expenditure lines had funds that could not fully implement the planned activities thus pushing the said expenditures to third quarter. Also there was a deduction of payee for the quarter.
