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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2019/20

Makindye Ssabagabo Municipal Council budgeted to receive a total of UGX 12,537,419,000= in FY 2019/20. By the end of the third quarter, the Municipality was able to receive a cumulative total of UGX 10,686,032,000= representing 85% of the budget performance. This performance is above the 75% target for the third quarter because of the over performances seen under sources like Locally Raised Revenues with 101%, Discretionary Government Transfers with 83% and Conditional Government Transfers with 87%. However, there were under performances for the following sources; Other Government Transfers performed at 34% and External Financing at 39%. Of the 10,686,032,000= cumulative receipt by close of quarter three, 10,684,131,000= was the cumulative release, representing 99.9% to Departments and Divisions and 9, 644,999,000= was the cumulative amount spent as follows; 2,618,653,000= representing 27.1% of total expenditure was spent on wages, 2,580,830,000= representing 26.8% of total expenditure was spent on No-Wage Recurrent, 4,403,267,000= representing 45.7% of total expenditure was spent on Domestic Development and 42,250,000= representing 0.4% of total expenditure was spent on Donor Development.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Makindye Ssabagabo Municipal Council planned to collect a total of UGX 1,717,105,000= from all Local Revenue sources in FY 2019/2020. But by the end of the third quarter the Municipality was able to cumulatively collect a total of UGX 1,741,531,000=representing 101% of the annual budget. This performance is above the 75% target in quarter three. The over performance can be attributed to the following sources that performed above 75% and they include; Local Service Tax, Occupational permits, Local Hotel Tax, Business licenses, Other licenses, Property related duties/fees, advertisements/billboards, Educational/instructional related levies, inspection fees and other fees and charges. However, all the rest performed below 75%.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

Makindye Ssabagabo Municipal Council planned to receive a total of UGX 9,747,015,000= in form of Conditional Government Transfers and Discretionary Government Transfers from central government in the FY 2019/20. The Municipality was able to receive a total of UGX 8,395,850,000= by the third quarter of the year, representing 86% of the budget performance. This performance is above 75% target for the third quarter which is due to over performances realized under Pension for Local Governments (100%), Urban Discretionary Development Equalization Grant (100%), Sector Conditional Grant –Wage (76%), Sector Development Grants (100%) and Transitional Development Grant (100%).

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Makindye Ssabagabo Municipal Council planned to receive a total of UGX 890,099,000= in form of Other Government Transfers from central government in the FY 2019/20. The Municipality was able to receive a total of UGX 477,309,000= by the third quarter of the year, representing 54% of the budget performance. This performance is below 75% target for the third quarter which is due to under performances realized under Uganda Roads Funds (URF) (73%), Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP) (2%) plus an over performance of Support to UPE (UNEB) (100%).

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

Makindye Ssabagabo Municipal Council planned to receive a total of UGX 183,200,000= in form of External Finance in the FY 2019/20. The Municipality was able to receive a total of UGX 71,342,000= by the third quarter of the year, representing 39% of the budget performance. This performance is below 75% target for the third quarter which is due to under performances realized under Mildmay International (0%) and Jhpiego Cooperation (50%)
