Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Cumulatively UGX 364,391,612 had been realized by the end of the 4th quarter against an annual target of UGX 1,289,346,296. UGX 33,150,068 was collected during the 4th quarter alone. The poor performance is attributed to the lock down arising from Covid-19 and over appropriation of the budget by the Parliament where they had overestimated the size of the district economy. Market dues contributed 76.72% followed by other fees and charges and Business license.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

The revenue sources under Central Government transfers are District and Urban Conditional wages, District and Urban Grants as wages and District and Urban Discretionary Development Equalization Grants. The approved Discretionary government transfers which includes District and Urban wages, non-wages and Discretionary development equalisation grant was UGX 2,904,290 with an out turn of UGX 2888,355 accounting for 99%; Conditional Government transfers that includes sector condition grants both wages, non-wages and other grants, transitional development grant, salary arrears, pension and gratuity for local Government had an approved budget of UGX 12,823,210 with an out turn of UGX 13,865,654 accounting 108%. Other Government Transfers from NMS, URF, UWA, UWEP, YLP, Other (Covid-19) funds under emergency fund, Micro projects under Luwero Rwenzori development programme and ACDP had an approved budget of UGX 724,000 with an out turn of UGX 269,584 accounting for 37%.

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Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Other Government Transfers from National Medical Stores, Uganda Road Fund, Uganda Wildlife Authority, Uganda Women Entrepreneurship Programme, Youth Livelihood Programme, Other (Covid-19) funds under emergency fund, Micro projects under Luwero Rwenzori development programme and Agriculture Clustered Development Projects had an approved budget of UGX 724,000 with an out turn of 269,584 accounting for 37%. During the 4th quarter no funds were received from UWA, Micro projects under Luwero Rwenzori development programme and YLP

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

The district had a quarter budget of UGX 181,000,000 but was able to receive UGX 16,965,000 which is 9.3%. The donors who contributed were Baylor, UNICEF and Enabler but below the budget. No funds were received from GAVI and WHO during the quarter.

The department had an approved annual budget of Shs.3,532,335,000/=. Cumulatively, the department received Shs. 3,344,451,000/= translating to 95% of the annual budget and has cumulatively spent 3,229,673,000/= translating to 97% and 91% of the cumulative releases and the annual budget respectively. This suboptimal annual budget performance is due to the direct transfer of donor funds from partners such as Baylor Uganda and Enabel to the beneficiary Health facilities. We received Shs. 999,195,915/= for Q4 against the planned quarterly budget of Shs. 883,084,000/= translating to 113% of the quarterly budget. This high revenue performance of Q4 is due to the additional funds (Shs. 16,956,000) received from UNICEF, Enable, and Baylor Uganda for health-related and activities and RBF reimbursement. We also received 165M from Government to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The department received 100% of the planned annual development grant in Q3. However, the department did not receive locally raised revenue. The Wage provision for the department is not sufficient to enable the recruitment of critical cadres in the department. Lack of ambulance affected timely management and response to emergency cases in the district and continues to contribute to poor maternal and neonatal outcomes

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

Late recruitment of Staff, bounced payment for the construction of a 3 stance latrine at Kisomoro HC III and the budget for bank charges which could not be paid under IFMS were the main reasons for the unspent balance.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

With support from Amref Health Africa, Baylor Uganda, and Ministry of Health, we trained 235 health workers,626 VHTs, and 172 security officers on COVID-19 and Ebola Viral Disuses. We conducted immunization outreaches in all the 7 S/counties and 5 Town Councils. Quarterly and performance meeting was held with support from Baylor Uganda and Enabel. The department also conducted the monthly DHT meeting and support the supervision of lower local health facilities. Additionally, we conducted verification of URMCHIP Result Based Financing performance at all the 11 RBF implementing facilities.
