By the end of quarter four, entebbe Municipal Council had received a total of ugx13,455,768billions representing a performance of 62% of the approved budget, the under performance was mainly because of the USMID funds which were never reflected in the expenditure limits uploaded by finance hence reflecting an under performance, other areas of under performance were the external financing. The Municipal disbursed 100% of the funds received for the whole financial year to departments, however it is indicated that of the release 99% was spent by the respective departments, the unspent balances were mainly in Community based services because of failure to get a supplementary for the UWEP funds, other departments like production failed to utilize part of the money because of late initiation of the procurement hence works were never implemented

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Entebbe Municipal Council managed to collect 130% of the local revenue approved budget, the variance of 30% was mainly because the supplementary local revenue budget as approved by parliament was never captured in the PBS budget hence showing a much smaller budget as compared to what was actually approved. The Municipal intend to put in place more startegies like automation of the revenue system to ensure higher performance.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

By the end of fourth quarter, The Municipal had received a total of Ugx7,852,500 billions as central government transfers. this represents a percentage variance of of 39% from the approved budget .this difference was mainly as a result of USMID funds not being captured in the receipts regardless of the fact that the local government received it hence causing a shortfall of 87% of the discretionary government transfers these Conditional Government transfers however performed at 109% of the approved budget due to a supplementary received under pension and gratuity during fourth quarter

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

The other government transfers received by the Municipal performed at 115% of the approved budget, the over performance of 15% was mainly because of the special funding received from Uganda Road Fund for road works that require urgent attention as a result of the floods.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

The Municipal received 78% below the approved budget . the under performance was mainly because the donors revised their work plans and put priorities under different initiatives hence affecting the allocation to the Municipal
