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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2020/21

Against the approved budget estimates of sh 41,937,411,000 a total of Ug.shs 22,561,200,000 had been received as at the end of second quarter translating into 54% quarterly performance. Out of the total cumulative receipts, Local revenue performance was Ug. shs 454.071 (37%), Discretionary Government Transfers was Ug. shs854,480m(3%), Conditional Government Transfers was Ug. shs5,316,893m (49%), Other Government Transfers was Ug.shs 16.139bn (1748%) while Donor Funding was Ug.shs45.312m (37)%. The cumulative receipts as at the end of Q2 was more than the 50% quarterly target because Council did received funds for USMID projects which had been budgeted under Urban Discretionary Development Equalization grant but was released under other government transfers. Total Cumulative releases to the departments at the end of the Q2 was Ug. Shs 22.561bn, and Ug.shs6.088bn had been spent leaving a closing balance of shs 16.473bn on the departmental accounts notably Administration, Local Council, Health, Education, and Engineering. The reason for these unspent balance was because:(1) the Procurement process for projects to be implemented was still ongoing 2)The evaluation of bids for USMID projects had not been completed. Out of the total releases shs 3.829bn was spent on payment of staff salary, shs 1.643bn on nonwage recurrent activities,shs591m on domestic development while shs23.8m was spent on donor development

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

Against the approved budget of shs 1,237,218,500, shs 454,071,000 had been collected at the end of the 2nd quarter translating into 37% Quarterly performance. Under performance was due the COVID 19 lockdown that affected most of the revenue sources like market dues, property tax, liquor licence, business licence and advertisement. This figure includes the cash limit that was advanced by MoFPED in first quarter and was warranted.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

Against the Approved Budget of shs 39,648,584,000 shs6,171,373,800 had been released as at the end of Q2 translating into 26% quarterly performance. Under performance was mainly because USMID funds were released on IFMS but the was not uploaded as releases from Central Government. It was later captured under Other Government Transfers

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Against the approved budget of Shs 928,036,186, Shs 16,139,276,000 had been released as at end of 2nd Quarter resulting into 1739%. Over performance was due to release of USMID Development funds. These funds had been budgeted under Central Government Transfers but was not uploaded among the releases from Central Government.

On the otherhand, there was inadequate release of funds from Uganda Road Fund for road maintenance.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

The Performance of donor funding as at Q2 was 37%. Under performance was due to inadequate release of VNG funds and MSF funds to pay their contract staff.

Out of the total revenue budget, shs 143.5m was spent on payment of staff salaries, shs 955.7m was spent on nonwage recurrent activities majorly pension and gratuity arrears for retired LG staff. while shs 238.4m was spent on domestic development.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

There was closing balance of shs 843.7m of which shs2.3m was for staff salary, shs331.1m was for gratuity for retired staff whose files were being processed while shs510.2m was for domestic development for USMID CBG since the procurement process was still on going.

The sector performed by 53%. Over performance was due to adequate release of sector wage and nonwage grants, development grant and urban unconditional grant nonwage. Out of the total releases, shs 14.7m was spent on payment of staff salary while shs 29.9m was spent on nonwage recurrent activities.

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Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

There was a closing balance of shs 17.4m of which shs 3m was for staff salary, shs 1.9m was for nonwage activities while shs 12.4m was for domestic development for Kitoro market This was because of a change in locations from Kizungu to Kitoro which led to delays in procurement and consequently construction.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

Established 2 soil and water conservation demos in Kihara and scheme respectively, mobilised 11 farmers into a group tobenefit from ACDP, established 2 maize field trials and 3 rice field trials under Mubuku11, developed a simple data base for farmer inventory, procured and distributed some essential agrochemicals and spray pump to lead farmers.

Against the approved budget of shs 3.671,bn,shs 1.77bn had been released as at the end of second quarter translating into 48% performance. Under performance was due to inadequate release of less receipt of transfers to LLG, local revenue and inadequate release of donor funds by MSF. Out of the total releases, shs 1.419bn was spent on payment of staff salary for PHC workers ,shs 263.5m was spent on nonwage recurrent activities while shs 23.8m was spent on donor development.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account
