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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2020/21

By the end of fourth quarter 2020/21, the District had received 15,390,060,000/- which is 99% of the annual budget revenues. By this time, this is slightly less than the expected revenue by 102M/= The best performing revenue category is Central Government Transfers (i.e conditional Government transfers Discretionary Government Transfers) at 101% followed by local revenue at 100% followed by Central Government transfers are performing better than expected due to supplementary budgets received under wage. The least revenue category is external financing at 63%. This is due to partners not leaving to their expectations possibly because of COVID 19 restrictions. The District received 100% advance of Local revenue to address issues of floods and to COVID 19. Since most the markets and transport systems were not operational. The situation was worsened by being a boarder district. Of the fourth quarter cumulative release, 93.41% was central Government Transfers, 4.92% Local revenue and 1.67% External financing. All the funds received, were warranted/released to departments and LLGs. Of the 15.390bn/= released to departments, 14.375,bn/= (93%) of the released amount) had been spent leaving 1.014bn/= on the various departments and expenditure accounts. The Departments with most unspent funds are Education, Health, Administration, Water, and CBS with 824M/=, 87M/=, 44M/=, 34M/=, and 16M/-, respectively unspent. The rest of the departments had spent 99% to 100% of their releases. The key reason for balances on expenditure accounts is that by the end of fourth quarter, the District had not yet completed the implementation of the capital projects they (departments) could therefore not spend. Further, due to COVID 19 restrictions, most of the administrative processes were delayed especially in the second quarter which affected the subsequent quarters. Further Education Department has 824M/=/as capital for construction of 2 seed secondary schools that did not take off. This has also delayed implementation as procurement is not yet complete. Health received funding towards control of COVID 19 late and could not spend it in time. The reasons for under performance are detailed in department reports.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

By the end of fourth quarter, the District had received 100% as advance on Local revenue budget from MoFPED in the second quarter. This puts all local revenue items performance at 100%. The refund was to be realized in the subsequent quarters. In the second quarter, all the local revenue sources (markets, transport and shops) were not functional due to COVID 19 restrictions. Further the District was experiencing unprecedented floods in 5 S/counties which worsened the business situation.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

The Projected Revenue under Central Government Transfers for 2020/21 is 12,985,386,000/= by the end of fourth quarter, the District had received 113.322bn/= (cumulatively) as Central Government transfers which is 102.5% of this revenue Category. This is 85% of the total amount received. This is composed of Discretionary government transfers, Conditional government transfers. The cumulative performance for this category is above the expected 100%. This higher performance is due to supplementary budget received under wage and DDEG top up by European Union. Most of the Conditional Government transfer items are performing at 100% and above as expected.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Under Other Government Transfers category, performance is at 79% quite below the expected level of 10%. There are 3 revenue items so far i.e Road fund, Parish Community Associations and Results based Financing performing at 86%, 119% and 66% respectively. The rest of the planned for programs have not released funds to the District. The reasons for non release of UWEP is due to change of policy such that Ministry of Gender Labour and social Development prefers to deal directly with the youth Groups.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

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The budget from external financing is 408,578,000/=. By the end of the fourth quarter, the District had received 257,198,000/= which is 63% of the expected revenues under this category performing below than expected. The Development partners who cumulatively financed the District by the end of this in this quarter are GAVI, UNICEF, UNHCR and BAYLOR contributing 88%, 83%, 49% and 7% of their commitment. The rest had not yet released any funding to the District possibly due effects of COVID19 pandemic. Worth to note is that these partners give in kind contribution. In the second quarter we received sanitary equipment from UNICEF, purifiers and sanitizing equipment

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The Department's Annual budget for FY 2020-2021 is USHS 2.259BN and 4th Quarter budget is USHS 0.566BN. The department received USHS 0.566BN in Quarter 4 which translates to 84% of the Quarter's Budget and Cumulatively we received a total of USHS 2.469BN for all four quarters which measures to 109% of our entire 2020/21 FY's Annual Budget. This is above the expected performance of 100% for the Annual Budget. However, this higher performance is a result of an improved IPF for Recurrent Revenues under Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs-NonWage and for Development Revenues under Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs-NonWage, District Unconditional Grant_Wage & significantly under Development Revenues that is Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs-GOU and DDEG at 152%, 103%, 370% and 178% respectively. Whereas the over all general performance was good the department needs IPFs under General Public Service Pension Arrears(Budgeting) and Salary Arrears(Budgeting) considered for funding in the next Budgeting Cycle. To enable us settle arrears for our staff and all Pensioners. The department's Account had a total of USHS 0.044BN as at 30th June 2021, which is 02% of the entire department's Budget. These funds were Budgeted for Wage, Pension and Gratuity for Local Governments and the process to pay it off was still ongoing.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The balance on the department's account as at the end of third Quarter includes funds budget for Wage, Pension and Gratuity. The payment process to the beneficiaries was ongoing and verification of the submitted documents was in final stages of the approval process.
