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### Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2020/21

The district received total funds of 20,196,956bn by the end of Q4 against the budget of 18,060,549bn which is a budget out-turn of 112%. The District performed excellently higher than the standard percentage of 100% reason being that conditional transfers and discretionary transfers performed at 119% and 100% respectively since these funds contain development grants which are released by Q3 and central government funds are always released as planned. However other sources such as external financing where only 2% of the expected funds were released by the end of quarter 4. Local revenue performed at 79%, the performance slightly improved since funds collected in urban areas were reported through their sub-counties although the 100% standard performance was not achieved. Other government transfers performed at 44% reason being that less funds were released by Central Government compared to what was expected as per the budget. All the funds received of 20,196,956bn was 100% disbursed to the district departmental accounts. Of the received funds of 20,196,956bn the amount spent was 10,470,327bn which is an expenditure performance of 52%. The departments that performed highly were Health (97%), Water (67%), and Roads and Engineering (64%) reasons being that these departments contained development grants such as sector development, DDEG and start-up capital which is always released in three quarters. While other departments performed poorly such as finance (17%) Natural resources (27%), internal audit performed at (37%) and Administration (26%) reasons being that funds for these departments were from local revenue which was affected by Covid-19 and non-wage where less funds were disbursed to the departments compared to what was planned by the end of Q4.

### **Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues**

Under local revenue the District received 308,549m compared to the annual budget of 392,483m which is an under performance of 79%. The sources that performed higher than the standard performance were registration of businesses (934%) and inspection fees (213%) reason being that for registration of businesses, sensitization programmes were run by URA to ensure that businesses are registered and enrolled on Electronic Fiscal Invoicing and Receipting (EFRIS) so as to be able to remit taxes and for inspection fees collection, enforcement was carried out. While the decline in performance was due to some sources that did not collect any funds in a quarter they include: Local hotel tax and Advertisements/Bill boards reason being that most of the business were affected by COVID-19.

In addition, Educational/Instruction related levies performed poorly at 19%, Animal & Crop Husbandry related Levies at 18%, reason being that these sources of funds were affected by the out-break of COVID-19 pandemic and foot and mouth disease that saw animal movements banned and most educational institutions closed down.

### **Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers**

Under central government transfers the sources include discretionary government transfers and conditional government transfers and the total amount of funds is 19,595,573bn against the total budget of 18,060,549bn hence a standard budget performance of 108%. A slight decline was under transitional Development Grant where only of 93% of the funds planned for were released. The other sources under conditional transfers that performed highly than the standard percentage (100%) were Gratuity for Local Governments (938%), Pension for Local Governments (554%), Sector Conditional Grant-Wage (108%), and Sector Conditional Grant (Non-Wage) at 102%.

Sector development grant performed at 100% reason being that funds are released fully by the end of the first three quarters. For Discretionary development the source that performed highly than the standard of 100% was Urban Unconditional Grant-Wage (102%) where slightly more funds were released compared to what was planned for. Other discretionary sources performed at a standard of 100% because funds were released as planned to cater for complete implementation of development projects and government activities.

### **Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers**

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Under other government transfers the district received 289,996m against the budget 663,304m which is a budget performance of 44%. The funds released under other government transfers are road fund where 237,828m was received against the budget of 360,148m hence a percentage of 66%, and RBF of 50,680 was received against the budget of 232,347 hence a performance of 22%. 4,488m for UWEP was also received although it hadn't been budgeted for. The other sources of funds were not released such as support to UNEB, YLP, and USF.

### **Cumulative Performance for External Financing**

Under external financing the District received 2,838m from Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI) against the budget of 86,194m which is a 3% release.

### Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department had cumulative revenue of 3,800,912bn against the budget of 1,936,784 bn which is a budget performance of 196%. The department performed higher than the standard percentage of 100% reason being that all funds under gratuity, pension and nonwage were released beyond the expected 100% for the financial year. The sources that performed lower than 100% were local revenue (81%) and multi-sectoral non-wage transfers to LLGs (87%). The cumulative expenditure for the department was 978,499m against the release of 3,800,912 bn which is an expenditure performance of 26%. The underperformance was under wage of (42%) reason being that few staff have been recruited compared to the approved salary structure and non-wage (34%) reason being that most of the warrants under non-wage were not effected as warranted. For Q4, the department had revenue of 2,202,201bn against the quarterly budget of 484,196m which is a quarterly budget performance of 455%. The reason for this over release was that more funds are released under, gratuity and pension for Local Governments where all the funds were disbursed in the quarter. The funds spent in Q4 were 148,196m which is a quarterly expenditure performance of 31%. The underperformance was under wage (64%) because the district has not yet recruited all the staff as per the recommended structure, and nonwage performed at 23% because works for the completion of the Administration Block Phase II were yet to be paid for. The unspent of funds of 2,822,413bn are funds inform of wage (387,475m) non-wage (2,342,656bn) and development (92,282m) reason being that few staff are paid and for non-wage funds were for staff induction.

The department had cumulative revenue of 250,180m against the budget of 256,180m which is a budget performance of 98%. The sources that performed at the standard of 100% are wages and non-wage reason being that these are central government transfers and they are all released as planned. The under performance in the release was under local revenue (80%) reason being that less funds were disbursed to the department due to less collections of local revenue due to the effects of COVID 19. The cumulative expenditure for the department was 43,257m against the release of 256,180m which is an expenditure performance of 17%. The underperformance was under non-wage of (160%) reason being that funds planned for monitoring of revenue sources was not implemented since monthly markets were not yet opened although the district was trying hard to identify other sources of local revenue. For Q4, the department had revenue of 62,585m against the quarterly budget of 64,034m which is a quarterly budget performance of 98%. Other sources performed excellently at 100% except local revenue due to the effects of COVID 19 that affected most of the local revenue sources. The funds spent in Q4 were 27,373m which is an expenditure performance of 43%. The unspent funds are 206,923m inform of wages (119,715m) non-wage (87,208m) reason being that few staff are paid compared to the budgeted staff in the department since the district had not yet uploaded the newly recruited on the payroll and for non-wage funds were for monitoring of local revenue sources which was not yet done because most sources were closed due to the effects of COVID-19 pandemic.

The department had cumulative revenue of 339,747m against the budget of 344,189m which is a budget performance of 99%. Wages and nonwage source of revenue performed excellently and attained a standard of 100% reason being that these are central government transfers and they are all released as planned. The under performance in the release was under local revenue (72%) reason being that less funds were disbursed to the department due to less collections of local revenue due to the effects of COVID 19. The cumulative expenditure for the department was 188,906m against the release of 339,747m which is an expenditure performance of 56%. The underperformance was under wage of (16%) reason being that the budgeted staff were not paid since the newly recruited staff had not been uploaded on the payroll as per the district staff structure. The newly elected political leaders had also not been uploaded on the payroll. For Q4, the department had revenue of 84,068m against the quarterly budget of 87,543m which is a quarterly budget performance of 102%. Nonwage and Wage sources of revenue performed excellently at 109% and 100% respectively reason being that central government funds are released as planned. Local revenue performed lowest at 49% reason being that collections of local revenue were low due to the effects of COVID-19. The unspent funds of 150,841 m inform of wage (111,334m) non-wage (39,507 m) reason being that few staff are paid compared to the budgeted staff in the department since the newly recruited staff and newly elected political leaders had not been uploaded on the payroll.

### Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department had cumulative revenue of 930,404m against the budget of 934,560m which is a budget performance of 100%. All revenue sources performed excellently such as Sector development grant (100%), Sector conditional Grants wage (99%) and nonwage (100%) reason being that development funds are released in three quarters to avoid delays in implementation of development projects. Other central government transfers were released as planned. The cumulative expenditure for the department was 266,602m against the release of 930,404m which is an expenditure performance of 29%. The underperformance was under nonwage 9% reason being that extension services were affected by covid-19. For Q4, the department received 216,231m which was 93% of the planned quarterly budget. The excellent performance was because the central government transfers under non-wage were released as planned. The quarterly expenditure was 61,850m compared to the quarterly release of 216,231m which is an expenditure performance of 29%. The poor performance under nonwage (14%) was because agricultural extension services were affected by covid-19; and for wage (30%) was because few staff were paid than those planned for.
