### Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2020/21

The annual budget for Council was shs 29,397,484,000 and received shs 23,105,933,000 which is 79% of the annual budget. Local revenue performed well at 100% of the annual local revenue budget due to secured supplementary budget on lease of plots. Discretionary government transfers performed at 8% of annual budget due to direct release of USMID funds to Council by MoLHUD not through Ministry of Finance as earlier planned and thus captured in Other Government transfers. Conditional Central government transfers performed well at 100%. Other Government transfers performed at 1053% due to direct release of USMID funds to Council by Ministry of Lands. No donor funded budgeted for and received. On the side of expenditure, the departments received a release of shs 23,105,933,000 which is 79% of the annual budget and they utilized shs 18,079,283,000 which is 61% of the annual budget at an absorption capacity of 78% of which shs 6,950,747,000 was spent on wages at an absorption capacity of 91%. shs 5,486,723,000 spent on nonwage at absorption capacity of 97% and shs 5,641,813,000 on development activities at absorption capacity of 57%. The department with poorest absorption of funds was Roads and Engineering at 59% due to un implemented USMID-AF projects, Administration at 92% due to some un verified pension files and unspent USMID CBG, Education at 92% as many teachers retired and their replacements not fixed in time and SFG projects delayed by procurement, Lastly Community Based Services at 92% due to poor recovery of YLP funds. However, even departments with good absorption capacities had poor budget releases to them due to poor performance of the local revenue collections as evidenced by lock down due to COVID-19 pandemic and under staffing in some departments and persistent poor recovery of YLP funds. USMID development grant released to Roads and Engineering not fully utilized in time due to ongoing procurement processes to secure consultants and contractors and sites were recently handed over.

#### **Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues**

Kabale Municipal Council has an annual local revenue budget of shs 2,051,610,732 and planned to collect shs 512,902,683 in fourth quarter but collected shs 309,332,444 which is 60.3% of the quarterly planned local revenue collections. The annual local revenue collected was shs 2,054,223,015 which is 100% of its budget. This good performance was caused by a supplementary budget otherwise local revenue performance was poor at 74%. The revenue that performed beyond their target were Local service tax, Business license, Other licenses and Registration whereas the rest under performed. The under performance was attributed to;

- 1. Effects of COVID-19 pandemic on businesses
- 2. Closure of Katuna border
- 3. Poor tax compliance
- 4. Relocation of Kabale Central Market that is under Construction by MATIP.

### **Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers**

Kabale Municipal Council has an annual budget of shs 26,415,479,847 and had planned to realize shs 6,603,869,958 from Central Government transfers but ended up realizing shs 3,196,264,370 which is 48% of the quarterly planned revenue. The annual cumulative receipt from Central Government was shs 11,254,201,190 which is 42.6% of the annual budget. All planned revenues were received. The deviation between planned revenue and actual revenue was due to:

- 1. USMID funds not released through Ministry of Finance as earlier planned
- 2. Releases of conditional grants declined due to COVID-19 lockdown

### **Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers**

Kabale Municipal Council has an annual budget of shs 930,393,533 under OGTs and planned to realize shs 231,294,633 in fourth quarter but ended up realizing shs 211,864,934 which is 91.6% of the quarterly budget. The annual receipt was shs 9,796,979,845 which is 1053% of its budget due to direct release of USMID-AF to council by MoLHUD not through MoFPED as earlier planned. persistent poor recovery of YLP funds.

Development funding under USMID CBG was received but not released in the PBS system. All planned revenues on Gratuity and pension were received in full amount. The department spent shs 875,331,000 in quarter four which is 119% of the quarterly planned expenditure of which shs 59,423,000 was spent on wages and shs 624,353,000 was spent on nowage activities and shs 191,555,000 spent on development. The cumulative expenditure was shs 2,718,338,000 which is 92% of the annual planned expenditure leaving an unspent balance of shs 229,585,000 which is 8% of the total received revenues by end of quarter four. The deviation between planned and actual performance was due to; 1. staff planned for but not recruited in time. 2. Non release of USMID capacity building funds directly in the PBS system.

The unspent balance of shs 229,585,000 corresponding to 8% of the total revenues received is composed of Urban grant wage, USMID capacity building grant and local revenue that was disbursed to the department and was retained by TSA.
