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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of quarter one the district had realized Shs 5,925,750,000 against an annual budget of Shs 21,538,376,000 being 28% budget performance. Of which from the central government source the district realized Shs 5,796,236,000 against an annual budget of Shs 20,492,979,000 being 28.3% budget performance for the year. Most central government funds performed as planned for the quarter at 25% for non wage recurrent grants and 33% for development grants except other government transfers where only 11% was realized. The Ministries are yet to communicate to the District why funds were not released. Under the local revenue source the district had realized Shs 40,710,000 against an annual budget of Shs 245,259,000 being 7% budget performance. With the exception of local service tax all other local revenue sources performed poorly. Poor local revenue collection was due to Covid 19 pandemic lock down restrictions. Under external financing the district 30,013,000 against an annual budget of Shs 800,137,000 being 4% budget performance. Nearly all the sources for external financing performed poorly except UNFPA. By the end of quarter one all funds received had been disbursed to the departments with Administration, Health and Education realizing the highest budget outturn of 32%, 32 and 28% respectively while roads and Community based services realized the least with 10 and 15%% respectively. The reason for this variance being Administration, Health and education realized their expected funding compared to roads and Community based services which expected funds from URF and Livelihood funds were not received. Three of the twelve departments had spent 70% and over of the funds they received during the quarter. By the end of quarter one the district had Shs 2,670,356,000 as unspent balances with Health, Administration, education departments having the biggest balances. The funds are majorly for some construction works whose service providers were still being procured.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

By the end of quarter one from the local revenue source the district had realized Shs 40,719,279 against an annual budget of Shs 245,259,248 being 17% budget performance. Several local revenue sources performed poorly. Poor local revenue collection from markets which contribute a portion of the district local revenue were still closed due to Covid 19 pandemic.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

By the end of quarter one from the central government source the district realized Shs 5,796,236,000 against an annual budget of Shs 20,492,979,000 being 28% budget performance for the year. Most central government funds performed as planned for the quarter at 25% for non wage recurrent grants and 33% for development grants.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

By the end of quarter one from the other central government source the district realised Shs 62,497,974 against an annual budget of Shs 574,844,925 being 10.9% budget performance for the year. All the other central government funds did not performed as planned for the quarter at 25% ie Youth Livelihood Programme. The Ministries are yet to communicate to the District why funds were not released.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

By the end of quarter one from the external financing the district 30,013,423 against an annual budget of Shs 800,137,178 being 4% budget performance. All other sources for external financing performed poorly.

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department cumulatively received Ugx 819,493,000 and this represented 26% of the approved annual Budget of Ugx 3,198,324,000. The quarterly revenues performance was at 102%, all other revenue sources performed as per the target. The department cumulative expenditure performance was Ugx 319,212,000 and this represents 10% of the annual budget and quarterly at Ugx 319,212,000 and this represented 40% of the approved quarterly expenditure budget. The wage performance was at Ugx 231,769,000 which is 24% of the annual budget and quarterly at 95% (Ugx 220,873,000) implying that all staffs in the department were paid their monthly salaries, this represents a normal progress. The non-wage expenditure performance was at Ugx 98,339,000 this represents 5% and quarterly at Ugx 98,339,000 and this represented 19%. Domestic development was at Ugx 0 this represents 0% of the annual budget and quarterly at UGX 0 and this represents 0% of the quarterly plan implying that most of the capital purchases and supplies had not been started. The underperformance was attributed to the fact that some the sector is implementing PDM and most of the guidelines have not been provided

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The unspent balance was Ugx 500,281,000 and this represents 61% of the annual budget of which Ugx 10,896,000 was for wage, Ugx 405,795,000 was for the non-wage part of which is for implementing PDM while other is for Extension grant and Ugx 83,591,000 is for development and procurement had not been initiated.

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

By the end of Quarter 1, the department had received shs 1,505,957,000 against the annual budget of 4,668,919,000 representing 32.3% for the year and 129% for the quarter. By the end of the quarter the department had spent shs 1,067,502 against annual budget of 4,668,919 representing 22.8% for the year and 91.5% for the quarter. Sector Conditional grant non-wage performed beyond 100% (404%) because of Supplementary funds received in quarter one for COVID 19 response. Up to 96% of planed wage was paid. This is because some staff's salaries who had abandoned duty where retained and those who had transferred their services to central government and are yet to be replaced.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

All domestic Development grants was not spent because procurement of contactors/ service provider is not yet done. 4% of planned salaries for quarter one was not paid to staffs who had abandoned duty or had transferred their services to central government.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

In Quarter one the following was conducted: Health Monitoring and inspection to 21 health facilities, 6 spot checks to facilities with ongoing Construction projects.
