#### Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By Close of O1 of FY 2021/22, Bugiri MC had received 1,342,038,000 translating into 26% against the planed annual Municipal budget of which 651,012,000 was Wage translating into 49% of the total receipts and 25% of the total planned wage and Non wage receipts worth 548,009,000 were received translating into 41% of the total quarterly receipts and 26% of the annual planned annual Non wage budget and Development grants worth 143,017,000 representing 11% of the quarterly receipts and 32% against the planned Annual development grant budget. LR WORTH 40,000,000 was collected translating into 7% of the Annual LR receipts and 29% against the planned quarterly receipts for LRR Central government funding worth 1,238,029,000 was received by the entity translating into 114% against the planned quarterly receipts and 30% against the planned annual budget. The over quarterly release was attributed to supplementary funding for COVID -19 emergency and response surveillance activities. Discretionary transfers worth 288,670,000 were received translating into 26% against the annual Discretionary receipts and 6% the annual entire budget of Bugiri Mc Conditional government transfers worth 949,359,000 were received translating into 31% against the planned annual conditional transfers meant for sectors like education, Production, Health among others, to develop pay staff in such departments Other transfers worth 64,009,000 inform of URF and UWEP was received meant for roads and drainage maintenance with in the municipality and UWEP institutional support meant for supervision of UWEP groups For Disbursements, By close of Q1 Education department had received 658,625,000 as the biggest share of the quarterly budget with 49% including Payment of salaries for teachers both primary and secondary and also tertiary institutions and development grant for education followed by health department with 16% Roads and engineering received funds worth 10% of the quarterly releases meant for URF 64million, while 111,289,000 was received by Administration department translating into 8% against the total quarterly receipts, followed by Production with 48,365,000 which is 3.6% of the total receipts, Statutory department with 3% of the receipts and Natural Resources department with 3% finance with 2.8% Planning 1.6% and Trade, industry and LED had the least quarterly receipts with 0.5% of the total quarterly receipts by close of Q1. By Close of Q1, Bugiri MC had spent funds worth 759,142,000 translating into 56% against the quarterly receipts of which 530,524,000 was spent on wage which is 70% of the total quarterly expenditure and 20% against the planned annual wage expenditure, and Spent Non Wage worth 203,683,000 translating into 27% of the quarterly expenditure and 10% of the annual Non wage expenditure for FY 2020/21. The low quarterly expenditure resulted from non disbursement of capitation grants to schools since since they were closed and awaiting official communication from education ministry on disbursement of capitation grants to schools. However Education department was the biggest spender by close Q1, representing 45% (344,381,000) of the total quarterly expenditure, Followed by Health with 17% Administration with 9.7%, Works department spent only 5% against the quarterly expenditure Finance department with 4.8% Statutory spent 4% of the quarterly expenditure followed by Natural Resources with 4%,, Production, Planning, Community based services and Internal Audit had the least expenditure with 0.5% of the total quarterly expenditure. Generally Development grant (24,936,000) expenditure in Q1 was non exhausted awaiting for finalization of the procurement process thus most funds were pushed to Quarter two meant for implementation. Various projects including construction of Two Classroom block at Busanzi P/S, Renovation of Classroom blocks at Hindocha P/S under Education, Construction of Staff house at Bugiri TC HCIII under Health department among others are yet to implemented in the Q2 awaiting procurement process finalization

#### **Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues**

For FY 2021/22, The municipal council projected an annual Local Revenue budget worth 547,118,000 which is 11% of the entire municipal budget.

However by end of Quarter one, The municipality had collected 40million as quarterly collection representing 7% against the planned LRR budget. This was under performance of Local Revenue collection was attributed to general depression of business of covid-19 partly contributed to this under performance since businesses were closed and un able to operate and therefore unable to pay taxes

However there are various strategies put in place to enhance and boost LR in the Q2

#### **Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers**

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By close of Q1 for FY 2021/22, Bugiri Mc had received central government transfers worth 1,238,029,000 translating into 114% of the planned

quarterly receipts. AND 29% of the planned annual central government transfers Discretionary transfers worth 288,670,000 were received translating into 26% of the planned annual discretionary transfers of the entity

Conditional Government transfers worth 949,359,396 were received translating into 31% of the planned annual conditional transfers revenues meant for Sectors like education both wage and non wage,Production both wage and non wage and development grant and Health department, . The increase in the quarterly transfers resulted from more Sector development grants received in Q1 especially health,Education and production pending being expended due to delayed procurement of suppliers sector conditional grants meant for development since they are released in only 3 quarters.

More still the over releases of central transfers resulted from the supplementary funding received from Ministry of Health and MoFPED to attend to COVID-19 activities and responses at the municipality and also operationalise Municipal Task forces to curb the spread of COVID-19 through continuous sensitization and surveillance of covid-19 cases thus the over quarterly performance of central government transfers

#### **Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers**

Bugiri Municipal Council has an annual budget for OGT for FY 2021/22 worth 396,585,000 representing 8% of the entire municipal budget.

During Q1, The entity had received funding worth 64,009,044 as Other Government Transfers translating into 16% of the planned annual OGT, URF worth 60,858,433 was received meant for maintenance of road network and mechanical

All the staff were their respective salaries and administration activities were facilitated and coordinated However 37,604,000 Remained unspent in the department

#### Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The department remained with 37,604,000 as unspent balances translating into 34% of the planned budget expenditure arising from un absorbed Non wage being pension and gratuity awaiting payment of retired civil servants and also un absorbed wage awaiting completion of the recruitment process for the declared positions to the service commission

By closure of Q1 the department statutory had received an actual amount of 40,605,132 at the beginning of quarter one out of the approved departmental budget of 212,217,000 resulting in to 77%% by the end of q1. The department received LR worth 6,910,000/= resulting in to 57%, Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs (NW) worth 5,650,000/= resulting in to 47.9%, Urban Unconditional Grant (NW) of 19,795,132/= resulting in to 48.7% and a quarterly wage of 8,250,000 resulting in to 99%. Therefore the total expenditure was at 59% receipt for Non-wage was 31,108,000 by the end of Q1. The department remained with unspent balance of 9,390,000 Nonwage resulting in to 23% and unspent wage of 107,000.

#### Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

By quarter one the department remained with unspent balances of 9,497,556 this 9,390,000 came as a result of accumulated funds meant for honoralia for LC1s and LC2s which is usually paid in December and also unspent Councillors allowances thus pushed to Q2 after the Council meetings, More still 107,000 was only spent on wage for political leaders

By Close of Q1 for FY 2021/22, The production department had received funding worth 48,365,000 translating into 25% against the planned annual budget and 102% against the planned quarterly budget. of which 100% of the planned quarterly central funds were realized as planned including sector wage for extension workers worth 17,100,000 and 25,877,000 was sector conditional grant including extension and production activity facilitation and also the Parish development model revolving and administrative costs for operationalisation. and also development grant worth 5,288,000 was received for capital purchases. However the department had spent 27,541,000 by close of the quarter translating into 14% and 58% against the planned annual and quarterly expenditures respectively . All the staff were paid their respective wages, and PDM was officially facilitated and launched awaiting operationalisation of the revolving disbursement By Close of Q1, The department had remained with 20,824,000 translating into 43% of the planned expenditure budget.

Arising from unspent Sector conditional grants NW awaiting issuance of the guidelines governing Parish development model and Development Grant worth 5,288,000 awaiting finalization of the procurement process to procure Equipment for Town agents in PDM and also Production grant meant Abattoir fencing however all were unspent awaiting finalization of the procurement process
