#### Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of quarter two the district had realized Shs 11.816,079,000 against an annual budget of Shs 21.538,376,000 being 55% budget performance. Of which from the central government source the district realized Shs 11,232,623,000 against an annual budget of Shs 20,492,979,000 being 55% budget performance for the year. Most central government funds performed as planned for the quarter at 50% for non wage recurrent grants and 67% for development grants except other government transfers where only 24% was realized. The Ministries are yet to communicate to the District why funds were not released. Under the local revenue source the district had realized Shs 109,693,000 against an annual budget of Shs 245,259,000 being 45% budget performance. With the exception of local service tax all other local revenue sources performed poorly. Poor local revenue collection was due to Covid 19 pandemic lock down restrictions. Under external financing the district 334.885,000 against an annual budget of Shs 800.137,000 being 42% budget performance. Fifty percent sources for external financing performed poorly. By the end of quarter two all funds received had been disbursed to the departments with community and Health realizing the highest budget out turn of 67%, and 65% respectively while water and statutory bodies realized the least with 45 and 46%% respectively. The reason for this variance being Community based services and Health realized their expected funding from donors and supplementary for COVID activities compared to water and statutory bodies which expected funds from URF and Livelihood funds were not received. Three of the twelve departments had spent 90% and over of the funds they received during the quarter. By the end of quarter two the district had Shs 4,224,099,000 as unspent balances with Health, and education departments having the biggest balances. The funds are majorly for some construction works whose service providers were still being procured.

#### **Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues**

By the end of quarter two from the local revenue source the district had realized Shs 109,693,000 against an annual budget of Shs 245,259,248 being 45% budget performance. Several local revenue sources performed poorly. Poor local revenue collection from markets which contribute a portion of the district local revenue were still closed due to Covid 19 pandemic.

#### **Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers**

By the end of quarter two from the central government source the district realized Shs 11,232,623,000 against an annual budget of Shs 20,492,979,000 being 54.8% budget performance for the year. Most central government funds performed as planned for the quarter at 50% for non wage recurrent grants and 67% for development grants.

#### **Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers**

By the end of quarter two from the other central government source the district realised Shs 138,877,000 against an annual budget of Shs 574,844,925 being 24% budget performance for the year. All the other central government funds did not performed as planned for the quarter at 25% ie Youth Livelihood Programme. The Ministries are yet to communicate to the District why funds were not released.

#### **Cumulative Performance for External Financing**

By the end of quarter two from the external financing the district 334,885,278 against an annual budget of Shs 800,137,178 being 42% budget performance. All other sources for external financing performed poorly.

#### Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department received Ugx 1,698,794,000 by end of quarter two and this represents 53% of the approved annual Budget of Ugx 3,198,324,000. The quarterly revenues performance was at 110%, all other revenue sources performed as per the target. The department cumulative expenditure performance was Ugx 731,336,000 and this represents 23% of the annual budget and quarterly at Ugx 412,125,000 and this represented 52% of the approved quarterly expenditure budget. The wage performance cumulatively was at Ugx 522,044,000 which is 56% of the annual budget and quarterly at 130% (Ugx 301,171,000). The non-wage expenditure performance cumulatively was at Ugx 209,292,000this represents 10% of annual budget and quarterly at Ugx 110,954,000 and this represented 22% of the approved quarter budget. Domestic development was at Ugx 0 this represents 0% of the annual budget and quarterly at UGX 0 and this represents 0% of the quarterly plan implying that most of the capital purchases and supplies had not been started.

#### Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The unspent balance was Ugx 967,457,000 and this represents 57% of the annual budget of which Ugx 1,302,000 was for wage, Ugx 798,974,000 was for the non-wage most of which is for implementing PDM and it's to be implemented in quarter three while other is for Extension grant and Ugx 167,181,000 is for development and procurement had been initiated.

By the end of Quarter 2, the department had received shs 2,988,585,000 cumulative against the annual budget of 4,668,919,000 representing 64%.
