## Quarter3

### Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of March 2022, the District received 17,214,360,000 Ug shillings representing 86% performance against the approved budget of 19,937,312,000 Ug shillings. Discretionary and conditional Government transfers performed well at 80% and 92% respectively. However District DDEG, sector and transitional development grants, all over performed at 100% because all development grants were fully (100%) received during the quarter. Locally raised revenues performed poorly at 44% because most sources performed low because of the outbreak of COVID-19 which affected the realization of the revenues formerly planned. For example markets performed very poorly because no markets were operating. Other Government transfers performed poorly at 61% because most of the grants were not received as planned. For example the Agriculture Cluster Development Project (ACDP), PCA funds, among others. Donor funding performed poorly at 45% because Donors had not met their obligations. In turn 17,214,360,000= was transferred to departments where 12,126,134,,000= was spent leaving unspent balance of 5,088,226,000=. Of this unspent balance, 1,651,879,000 is meant for wage especially under education department for the staff who have not accessed the pay roll for and wage for Kyamulibwa Technical Institute that was channeled to our District instead of transferring to Kalungu District. Some wage is for the staffs under Health department who have just accessed pay roll. Some wage is for health care workers whose recruitment was done late and have not accessed the pay roll. The non wage of 1,765,943,000= is meant for; mainly gratuity for local government under administration department not yet paid and the rest of the balance is for ex-Gratia for Councilors and LCI chairpersons and fuel commitments in other departments. The domestic development of 1,211,876,000= is meant for capital projects especially under education, water and production departments with whose projects are ongoing and awaiting payment to be effected once the completion is done fully. Donor development is 15,000,000 for the activities which are ongoing.

### **Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues**

Masaka District planned to collect a total of UGX 355,403,000 from all Local Revenue sources, but by the end of the third quarter, the district was able to collect a total of UGX 156,628,000 representing 44% of the annual budget. This performance is below the target. With the exceptional of Other taxes on specific services and other licenses that performed relatively good, all other revenue resources attributed this under performance.

### **Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers**

Masaka District planned to receive a total of UGX 641,049,743 in form of Conditional Government transfers and discretionary government transfers from central government in the FY 2021/22. The district was able to receive a total of UGX 1680,136,812 by end of quarter three of the year representing about 92% of the annual budget. This performance is slightly above 75% target due to over performances realized under Pensions and Gratuity arrears and DDEG which all performed at over 75%.

### **Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers**

Masaka District planned to receive UGX 1,019,475,000 in form of other government transfers in the FY 2021/22. By the end of third quarter, the district was only able to receive UGX 616,693,000 representing only 61% of the annual budget. This poor performance is due to non-receipt of funds under Social Assistance Grant for Empowerment (SAGE), Support to PLE (UNEB), ACDP, among others.

### **Cumulative Performance for External Financing**

The District estimated to receive a total of UGX 707,726,000 from donors in the FY 2021/22. By the end of quarter three, the district received Ushs. 319,855,000 representing 30% of the annual budget which is below the target. With the exceptional of Rakai Health Sciences Programme (RHSP) and Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI) that performed at tune of 80% and 50% respectively, all revenue resources for External Financing attributed this under performance.

#### Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

Administration department planned to receive Ushs. 1,677,718,000 in the quarter under review and it received Ushs. 1,824,965,000 representing 9% increase. This over performance was due to the receipt of Multi-Sectoral Transfers to LLGs\_Gou and General Public Service Pension Arrears (Budgeting) that performed at tune of about 0% and 0% respectively than planned for the quarter. Cumulatively, he department received Ushs. 3,685,629,000 representing 55% of the annual budget to the department. The department spent Ushs.3,898,119,000; of which about UG.X. 208,532,000 and 3,689,588,000 spent on Wage and Non-Wage respectively. By the end of quarter two, the department had un spent balance of about UG.X. 1,612,474,000 representing 29%.

### Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The Unspent balances of Shs.1,612,474,000= of which Shs. 162,298,000= is wage for staff who were not yet recruited and Shs.1,450,176,000= is meant for Pension and Gratuity.

This under performance was due to no realization of funds from Sector Conditional Grant (Wage) meant for the Parish Development Model. By the end of March 2022, expenditure amounted to UGX. 336,990,000. 193,684,000 on staff wages, UGX. 90,000,000 on non-wages and UGX. 53,306,000 on domestic development expenses, leaving un spent balance of about UGX. 347,724,000 meant for Domestic Development expenditures.

UGX. 347,724,000 representing about 24% of the realized funds remained unspent under development expenditures. The unspent development balances are for acquiring Micro scale irrigation equipment whose procurement process is still a challenge.

By the end of the third Quarter (FY 2021/22) Health Department had realized shs.2,751,454,000 and 1,032,276,000 which is 118% and 178% of the Annual and Quarterly Budget respectively.
