The cumulative spent balances is 65% of the total released budget. The summary of departmental performance is as below: 1. Agriculture sector spent 21% of their overall budget which was 3,355,098,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 838,398,000/= and only received 274,451,000/= which is 33% of the planned revenue. 2. Works and Transport sector in the same way spent 21% of their overall budget which was 1,810,807,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned423,678,000/= and only received 168,593,000/= which is 40% of the planned revenue. 3. Trade and Industry spent 76% of their overall budget which was 64,868,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 16,217,000/= and only received 23,413,000/= which is114% of the planned revenue. 4. Education spent 54% of their overall budget which was 10,445,976,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 2,744,823,000/= and only received 2,159,526,000/= which is 79% of the planned revenue. 5. Health spent 57% of their overall budget which was 6,030,632,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 1,507,658,000/= and only received 1,215,892,000/= which is 81% of the planned revenue. 6. Water and Environment spent 27% of their overall budget which was 1,357,137,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 339.284.000/= and only received 160.093 .000/= which is 47% of the planned revenue, 7. Social Development spent 52% of their overall budget which was 292,841,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 73,210,000/= and only received 61,168,000/= which is 87% of the planned revenue. 8. Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

The cumulative collection for LR for the three quarters amounted to 1,292,796,000/= which was way beyond the projection in the approved budget of 240,626,000/=. This has caused an over performance to 537% and called for a supplementary budget. However there was a small mobilization in the third quarter to the tune of 66,890.025/=, we have been unable to spend any of the local revenue funds awaiting approval of the supplementary which has just been recently approved by MoF to be executed in the forth quarter.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

The government of Uganda in third quarter of the FY 2021/22 released conditional grants up-to a tune of 15,341,928,000/= which is 84% of its approved budget of 18,162,317,000/=. In the same way, Discretionary Government

Transfers from the government of realized 81% which is 3,802,967,000/= of the approved total of 4,685,686000=. These two grants performed very well as it was released according to plan.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Other Government Transfers performed only at 16% due to none release from most of the grant sources. We received only URF amounting to 50,515,804/= giving OGT a poop performance

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

In the third quarter we have been unable to attract any of the external support in terms of grant from their resource envelopes however in the first and second quarter we got a cumulative release of 29,350,000/= contributing only 1% of the overall approved budget.

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

Cumulatively, a total of UGX 4,167,549,904 was received representing 69% of the annual revenue target. This implies revenue underperformed by 6% off the target of 75% for the 3rd quarter of the FY. Underperformance was due to non-receipt Donor funds coupled with fewer transfers in Sector conditional Grant. Also, in Q3 UGX 1,403,017,000 was received; representing 93% of the planned revenue receipts (UGX 1,507,658,000). O3 revenue receipts by source are as follows; Firstly, recurrent receipts were as follows; 100% of the planned District Unconditional Grant (Non-wage) was received (UGX 2,500,000), and there was no local revenue receipt in the quarter, though UGX 376,000 was planned. In addition, 1366% of the planned other transfers from the central government were received (UGX 174,592,000 Vs UGX 12,782,000); this was because of the transfer of funds for polio (nOPV) mass campaign and the COVID-19 mass vaccination campaign. 95% of the planned PHC grant was received (UGX 117,632,000 Vs UGX 124,002,0000). Also, 129% of the planned quarterly wage was received (UGX 1,000,391,000 vs UGX 777,311,000). Also, in terms of development revenue receipts; No external financing was received during the quarter. 100% of the planned DDEG was received in the quarter (UGX 14,788,000), and 133% of the planned Sector development grant was received (UGX 93,115,000 vs UGX 69,836,000). In regards to expenditure, cumulatively by end of Q3, a total of UGX 3,425,360,000 was absorbed representing 57% of the expected annual expenditure. This arose due to less expenditure on the wage and development funds for Q3. Underperformance is revenue expenditure due to the delay in awarding procurement contracts. Q3 expenditure was as follows; Firstly, in terms of recurrent expenditure; 119% and 204% were expended from the planned wage (UGX 924,456,000 vs UGX 777,311,000), and Non-wage (UGX 285,400,000 vs UGX 139,661,000) respectively. Also, only 7% of the planned development revenues were expended in the quarter (UGX 6,036,000 vs UGX 84,624,000).

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

UGX 742,190,320 representing 12% of the annual budget, remained unutilized by the end of the third quarter, due to no expenditure of the development funds amounting to UGX 322,602,911 attributed to delays in the procurement of services and suppliers for various services in the district. UGX 408,106,836 is the unspent wage due to the staff arrears as of the end of the third quarter, and UGX 9,323,933 was unspent Non-Wage by end of the quarter.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

392 staff received payment for 9 months in the district. 2,554 inpatients were admitted, 56,996 outpatients attended to during the quarter, 1,716 deliveries were successfully conducted in the quarter from all the health facilities, and 1,461 children under 1 were fully immunized during the quarter. Also, from the DHO's office; 1 support supervision was conducted, 3 monthly DHMT meetings were held, 1 HMIS/DHIS training was conducted for the Health workers of the district, 1 quarterly performance review meeting was held, and 4 support staff paid lunch allowances.
