Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of third quarter 2021/22, the District had received 15,151,263,000/- which is 81% of the annual budget revenues. By this time, this is slightly higher than the expected revenue by of 75%. The best performing revenue category is Local revenue at 92% followed by Central Government Transfers (i.e conditional Government transfers Discretionary Government Transfers) at 81% with the least as, Other government Transfers which is at 66%. The District is performing well in L/revenue because we received compensation fee (565M/- land fees) from UNRA otherwise the other items under Local revenue are performing so poorly. This is Due to COVID 19 restrictions which has hindered normal market operations, the District has experienced floods in 2 S/counties further the District experienced Foot and Mouth Disease which resulted into a quarantine on all forms of movement of all animals. Also due to COVID 19. Of the third quarter release (5.471.454.000/=) 78% was central Government Transfers, 11.5% Local revenue, 7.6% Other Government transfers and 2.7% External financing. Of the 15.151bn/= received, 14.788bn/= was warranted/released to departments leaving a balance of shillings 362M/= on the main district/LLGs collection accounts and other donor or Program accounts. The major component of this balance was Central Government releases (District Equalisation Grant -240M/=, Other Government transfers – 90M/= and Urban DEG 23M/-. The reason is that these funds were delayed to be warranted and were vet to be transferred to expenditure accounts. Of the 14.788bn/= released to departments, 11.274bn/= (79% of the cumulative released amount) had been spent leaving 3.514bn/= on the various departments and expenditure accounts. The Departments with most unspent funds are Education, Administration, Health and Production, with 1.806bn/=, 562M/=, 500M/=, and 313M/= respectively unspent. The rest of the departments have less than 130M/= unspent. Departments like Internal Audit, Trade Industry and Local Economic Development (TILED), Statutory, Community Based Services, Natural Resources Management Finance and Planning had spent almost 95% and above of their releases. The key reason for balances on expenditure accounts is that by the end of the second quarter, the District had not yet completed the procurement process for most of the capital projects they (departments) could therefore not spend. Production and Marketing Department had received Funds for Parish Development Modal without guidelines and therefore could not spend it. Education had a balance on wage as a result of delayed recruitment/deployment for Secondary School teachers for Bweramule SS which is newly taken up by Government. Administration had most of the balance as gratuity/pension because beneficiaries had not vet completed the process of accessing these funds. Departments (TILED, CBS, Internal Audit and Statutory, Finance and Natural resources) which have budgets with high component of Local Revenues received less (i.e below 40% of their departments budget) funding because, the District received very little L/revenue. In summary, the expenditure on Development 34%, wages 100%, Recurrent 77% and External Financing 67%. The reasons for under performance are given in the details of the departments but key among them is incomplete procurement process especially for departments like Education, Production, Health, Administration, Roads, Water and Education.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

In third quarter, the District realized 664,258,000/= under the Local Revenue Category. Cumulatively we have received 717,296,000/= which is 92% of the projected income under this category. This performance is above the expected level of 75% by this time. This performance is attributed to the land compensation we received from UNRA for Kanara Town Council. The other best performing revenue items under this category are Local service tax at 100% and business licensees at 86%. The rest of the other items are less than 50%. Worth to note is that the District relies on Market gate fees mainly for which we have so far only collected 53M/= which is 13% performance. This revenue source is significant to the Districts L/revenue budget and was projected to contribute 75% to this revenue category of the Budget. With the pronouncement on tax/charges in the transport industry, the budget and performance under Park fees has been and will be greatly affected. Further, the District experienced floods for over 2 years thus affecting most of the revenue centers. The situation has been worsened by COVID 19 restrictions. The We quarantine of animal movement due to foot and mouth disease has just been lifted but the effects are still visible resulting low animal business transaction.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

Quarter3

The Projected Revenue under Central Government Transfers for 2021/22 is 16,126,563,000/= by the end of third quarter, the District had received 13.223bn/= as Central Government transfers which is 82% of this revenue Category. This is 87% of the total amount received. This is composed of Discretionary government transfers, Conditional government transfers. Most of the Conditional Government transfer items are performing at 75% and above as expected. Development grants like Transitional Development grant, Urban/District Development Equalization and Sector Development are at 100% and above.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Under Other Government Transfers category, performance is at 72% slightly below the expected level of 75%. There are 2 revenue items so far i.e Results based Financing, Parish Community Association and Road fund performing at 169%, 82%, and 44% respectively. The rest of the planned for programs have not released funds to the District. The reasons for non- performance of other sources is possibly due to COVID 19 restrictions that limited revenue mobilization in those entities responsible for remitting this type of funding.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

The budget from external financing is 649,000,000/=. In the third quarter, the District realized 148,921,000/=. Cumulatively we have received 465,964,000/= which is 72% of the expected revenues under this category and performing fairly. The Development partners who financed the District so far are UNHCR, UNFPA-NPC, WHO and GAVI contributing 181%, 100%, 81%, and 62% of their commitment. The least is BAYLOR at only 7% and is possibly due effects of COVID19 pandemic. Worth to note is that these partners give in kind contribution as well like computer consumables, drugs and equipment.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The Annual Budget for Administration Department for FY 2021-2022 is USHS 2,981.115M, Third Quarter Budget is USHS 1,438.433M, during the course of Quarter 3, the department received USHS 1,469.902M and USHS 3,038.425M cumulatively which translates to 102% of both the Quarter's Budget and that of the entire Financial Year's Annual Budget. These Revenues are slightly above the expected performance of 100% for both the Quarterly budget and the expected 75% for the Annual budget. The best cumulative performance for the first three Quarters of this Financial Year is under Salary Arrears(Budgeting) at 100%, District Unconditional Grant_Wage at 92%, Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs_NonWage at 85%, Urban Unconditional Grant_Wage at 84% and Pension for Local Governments at 83% all under Recurrent Revenues and Multi-sectoral transfers to LLGs_GOU at 651% and Transitional Development Grant under Development Revenues at 100% both under Development Revenues, however, the Department underperformed in the following areas;- District Discretionary Development Equalization Grant at 0% and Locally Raised Revenues at 16%, this poor performance is mainly as a result of a ban imposed on Vandos(Animal markets) by MAAIF which are the District's major Local Revenue sources in a bid to control FMD pandemic, a recently hardly hit economy that is slowly recovering and the department never received funds under DDEG. By end of the 3rd Quarter, the department had spent 81% of all it's Revenues with a balance of only USHS 562.208M on it's Account.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

There was a balance of USHS 562.208M on the Bank Account by close of Quarter 3. These are funds budgeted for Staff salaries PAYE deductions, Gratuity for Local Government pensioners, the process to clear all these pending payments was started on and rolled over to the subsequent month in the next Quarter.

Our 3rd Quarter achievements included;- Submission of Supplementary Budget Request Estimates of Pension & Gratuity for F/Y 2022-2023, Conducted Supervision & Monitoring of Progress of DDEG Implemented Capital Projects, Attended quarterly meeting of all CAOs and Town clerks, Inducted all finance staff on IFMS programme, Newly recruited staff oriented, Facilitated Human resource staff for data capture and payroll update for newly recruited staff, 1 staff Supported for Career development, Attended 1st General meeting of Uganda IT Officers Association in Mukono DLG, Council Hall and Executive Offices Block Construction Tender awarded and Construction works started on, PBS Budgeting and Reporting processes coordinated, Paid 3 months staff salaries and Pension, Processed and paid Gratuity.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The Departments budget for Financial year 2021/22 is 464,167,000/=. During the third quarter, the department received a total of Shs 66,335,000 which is 56% of the Quarterly Budget and 48% of the Annual Budget. This is a low performance than the expected level of 75%. The main revenue sources are Un conditional Grant non wage at 76% & and Wage at 73% with the least as L/revenue at 26%. Due to effects of COVID 19 Lockdown, Floods and Foot and Mouth Disease, the District collected very little L/revenue such that the Department. Mult-Sectoral transfers was also less this time meaning that LLGS did not fund fully the department activities. The department spent 71M/= (61% of the Release) mainly on recurrent activities. All Department funding at LLgs were spent. There is 3.837M/= un spent.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The balance on the account is for procuring Financial Books whose procurement is complete but not yet paid for fully. This balance has been rolled to quarter four.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

The Department paid staff salaries, attended 3 TPC and 6 management meetings at District headquarters. Preparation and submission of the end of financial year financial statements, processing of third quarter warrants and transferring to respective accounts the quarterly releases, organized and held two revenue management committees, Preparation and finalizing of DDP according to review comments Preparation of the second quarter report for 2021/22. Collection and analysis of fourth revenue returns. We held two departmental meetings and inducted the new department staff. The department carried out revenues analysis and advised the department accordingly

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The Departments annual budget for 2021/22 is 550,444,000/= and Quarter 3 budget is 134,365,000/= of which we received 102,875,000/= in the third quarter which is 77% of the Quarterly plan and 56% of the annual work plan as by this time. The revenue items for this department are relatively lower than 75% of the annual budget. The lowest are Local Revenue at 23% and multisectoral transfers at 42%. The provision of 20% local revenue also does not favor funding of the department. Further due to COVID 19 Look down effects L/revenue was greatly affected.
