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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of the 3rd Quarter (FY2021/2021) the District had realized 76% (shs 24,683,361,000) of the approved annual Budget of shs 32,671,154,000. This slightly good performance was due to high Performance of the Central Government Transfers to the District to the tune of shs 15.601.597.000 where 2.804.743.000 and 25.149.200.000 are Discretionary Government Transfers(DGT) and Conditional Government Transfers (CGT)respectively against an Annual budget of 32,671.154,000(DGT-3,409,444,000 and CGT-25,149,200,000) which is 82%(DGT 82% and CGT 82%) implying a 7% over the expected 75% this high performance is basically as a result of receiving 100% of the Development Grants since they are released up to Quarter 3 and 100% realization of Arears for both Pension and salary for the Financial in Quarter 1 at 100%, However there was noted poor performance of Locally Raised Revenue of shs 238,313,000 which is 34% of the Annual Budget of 701,952,000 implying a shortfall of 41% against the Planned 75%. This poor performance was due to 1% in registration fees, no Park fees, Quarry charges, local hotel tax fees much as there was noted good performance of; miscellaneous was at 43%, Occupational Permits rose to 26646% as a result of a concerted effort by the District through sensitization of the masses on its importance, the poor performance was compounded by creation of new town councils, abolition of revenue sources like taxi parks and non-remittances as a result of poor economic situation of the community, there was also very low receipts from External Financing totaling to Shs 443.127.000 which is 21% of Annual Budget of 2,069,087,000 implying a shortfall of 54% of the targeted 75%. This was due non-realization of funds from TASO, IBRD and WHO, much as there was 99% from EU, 29% from GAVI, 95% from GIZ and 60% from AHF and this was compounded by the poor Performance of Other Government Transfers of shs 526,661,000 against an Annual budget of 1,341,471,000 which is 39% implying 36% less the expected 75% this low performance was due to non-receipt of funds from UNEB, though there were releases from URF, UWEP and PCAs at 41%, 44% and 40% respectively. Out of the cumulative release of shs 24,683,361,000 the District had 76% of the Budget released, 57% of the Budget spent and 75% of the Budget released spent leaving 25% Unspent. Water had the highest % Budget released at 97% because of the Development component makes the bulk of the Water Budget and the releases cycles for Development are 3 thus 100% had been released and Roads had the least release at 44% because of not realizing much of the Other Government Transfers which made a big bulk of the Departmental Budget from Rad Fund as a result of Government suppressing Budgets to cater for COVID-19 Expenditure. Trade had the highest Budget spent at 71% since their most of their activities were executed in time and Community Services at 29% had the lowest since most of the Funds to the Department were for from Other Government Transfers whose modalities of disbursement had not been completed. Water had the least % Releases Spent at 39% basically due to Procurement delays involved in Water projects, Natural Resources had the highest %Releases spent at 93% due to execution of their Planned activities. The overall 25% unspent balance was mainly as a result of late release of funds due to delayed receipt of cash limits on IFMS then the process of loading budgets and getting warrants from the MoFPED delayed as well, then in Departments with Projects that required procurement of contractors a process that was still ongoing by the end of the Quarter. The District's main expenditures in the Quarter were mainly on Payment of Staff Salaries, Joint monitoring of Completed Projects, Facilitation of the District Budget Conference, Facilitation for the Micro Scale Irrigation sensitizations, salary and Pension arrears, Councilors' honorarium, Accounting Stationery, salaries for the staff took the lion's share being that of Primary school teachers. The unspent balance was mainly for Projects that required procurement of contractors which could not be complete due to late receipt of funds and delay in procurement processes.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

By the end of 3rd Quarter for FY2021-2022, the District had realized Locally Raised Revenue of shs 238,313,000 which is 34% of the Annual Budget of 701,952,000 implying a shortfall of 41% against the Planned 75%. This poor performance was due to 1% in registration fees, no Park fees, Quarry charges, local hotel tax fees much as there was noted good performance of; Local Service Tax at 108%, miscellaneous was at 43%, other fines rose to 4068% as a result of a concerted effort by the District through sensitization of the masses on its importance, the poor performance was compounded by creation of new town councils, abolition of revenue sources like taxi parks and non-remittances as a result of poor economic situation of the community. This was also worsened by the new Policy of Ministry of Finance where the Cash limit is given after transfer yet some LLGs delay to submit returns.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

By the end of 3rd Quarter for FY2021-2022, the District had realized Central Government Transfers totaling to Shs. 27,953,943,000 where Shs 2,804,743,000 and 25,149,200,000 are Discretionary Government Transfers(DGT) and Conditional Government Transfers (CGT) respectively against an Annual budget of 32,671,154,000(DGT- 3,409,444,000 and CGT-25,149,200,000) which is 82%(DGT82% and CGT 82%) implying a 7% over the expected 75% this high performance is basically as a result of receiving 100% of the Development Grants since they are released up to Quarter 3 and 100% realization of Arears for both pension and salary for the Financial Year in Quarter 1 at 100%.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

By the end of 3rd Quarter for FY2021-2022, the District had realized Other Government Transfers of shs 526,661,000 against an Annual budget of 1,341,471,000 which is 39% implying 36% less the expected 75% this low performance was due to non-receipt of funds from UNEB, though there were releases from URF, UWEP and PCAs at 41%, 44% and 40% respectively.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

As of the end of 3rd Quarter for FY2021-2022, the District had realized External Financing totaling to Shs 443,127,000 which is 21% of Annual Budget of 2,069,087,000 implying a shortfall of 54% of the targeted 75%. This was due non-realization of funds from TASO and IBRD, much as there was 99% from EU, 24% from RHSP 29% from GAVI, 95% from GIZ and 60% from AHF.

By the end of the third quarter, the department had received shs261,633,000 out of the planned revenue shs364,836,000 cumulatively and shs75,714,000 was received out of the quarterly estimated revenue shs91,209,000 which is 72% and 83% respectively. This mainly came from less allocation on local revenue by 03% than planned and the rest of the sources were received 100%. By the end of the quarter, the department had spent cumulatively a total of shs239,149,000 out of shs364,836,000 budgeted and shs75,021,000 was spent in the quarter out of shs91,209,000 expected which is 66% and 79% respectively. Wages taking shs46,824,000 and other activities shs25,197 which is 89% and 66% respectively of the total planned expenditure for the quarter.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The un spent balance of shs22,484,000 related to shs22,332,000 for wage and shs152,000 for other activities still in progress across outputs.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

During the 3rd quarter 2021/22, the Department spent 15,604,000 (118%) of the quarterly out turn Ugx 13,219,000 and 2nd quarter balance on the sector planned activities, and this performance is highly attributed to timely access to funds. However, Ugx 16,686,000 (126%) of the quarterly out turn was realized due to receipt of 12,480,000 (147%) under wage.
