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### Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

Kwania DLG budgeted for a total of UGX. 25,404,529,000 during the FY. 2021/22. Cumulative actual receipts by the end of Second quarter stood at UGX. 18,507,915,000, representing 73% of the Total Budget and all was released to the various department as detailed in the table above, to implement approved activities. The bulk of the receipts Conditional Government Transfers amounting to UGX. 14,832,268,000 (79%), Discretionary Gov't transfers 81%, External Financing \_none, Other Gov't Transfers 14% and Local Revenue 27%. of the total receipts up to UGX. 10,437,448,000 had been spent (41% of the total budget) by the end of quarter under the different sectors in the District. The bulk of the cumulative expenditures was wage recurrent (50%) and Non wage recurrent at 37%. The unspent balance was mainly due delay in the procurement processes and the General staffing gap in the District. In a nutshell the District realized 73% of the total Budget and spent up to 41% of the cumulative release in the quarter.

remittance was mainly since the District did not realized the revenues from other grants like UWEP and RBF as planned for in the quarter, and only realized from URF and ACDP.
