Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

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Kotido Municipal council had approved budget estimate of SH UGX 138M from different revenue sources. During quarter III SH UGX 143M had been received representing 103% of local revenue performance. The over performance is attributed to increased collection of local service tax which over performance at 138% and intensive local revenue collection that is attributed to recently deployed principal town agents

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

Kotido Municipal Council had an approved budget of SH UGX 8.1Bn of which SH UGX 1.5Bn as discretionary Government transfers, of which SH UGX 341M being urban unconditional grant none wage, SH UGX 758M for urban unconditional grants wage and SH UGX 415M for Urban discretionary development equalization grant. During the quarter, SH UGX 1.24Bn had been received translating into 82% budget received of which SH 256(75%)M from urban unconditional grant none wage, SH UGX 569M (75%) from urban unconditional grant wage and SH UGX 415M from DDEG (100%)

Under the Conditional Government transfers, the vote had an approved budget estimates of 6.1Bn of which SH UGX 3.7Bn was sector conditional grant wage, SH UGX 2Bn was sector conditional grants none wage, SH UGX 264M was sector development grant, SH 40M for local Government pension and SH UGX 114 for Gratuity. During the quarter, conditional grants performed as follows:

SH 2.8Bn was received from sector conditional grant wage(78%), SH UGX 1.4Bn representing 74% from sector conditional grants none wage, SH UGX 253M (96%) and SH 33M (84%) for pension for local governments, SH UGX 85M (75%) FOR Gratuity for local Government

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

Kotido Municipal Council had an approved budget estimate of SH UGX 388M under other Government transfers of which SH UGX 3M from support to PLE, SH UGX 354M from URF and SH UGX 31.5M from Miicro projects under karamoja development programme. During the Quarter, SH UGX 178.3M was received of which SH UGX 167.8from URF and SH 10M under the micro projects code. it should be noted that the vote has not received any funding from the micro projects but rather the budget code was used to warrant other sources of funding to the vote (UWEP operations). overall, OGTs performed at 46%

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

The vote during the quarter did not receive any external funds and so no activities were executed with support from external funding.

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

Against an approved budget estimate of 431M, of which 348M was sector conditional grant non-wage, UgX 31.8M was sector conditional grant non-wage, and UgX 50M was sector development grant. During the quarter, UgX 107M was anticipated of which UgX 12.6M from sector conditional grant non-wage, UgX 7.9M was sector conditional grant non-wage, and UgX 6M from the sector development grant giving a total revenue outrun of UgX 26.7M translating to 25%. The above revenues were utilized as follows; Wage of UgX 7.9M was utilized at 100%, of UgX 87.2M non-wage UgX 12.6 was utilized during the quarter translating to 15%. The reason for underperformance was due to awaiting of final guidelines for the utilization of parish devt model, of UgX 12.6M released for utilisation during the quarter, UgX 0 was utilised due to delayed procurement processes giving a total outrun of 19% expenditure. The unspent balances of UgX 191M of which Ugx 39m for devt, Ugx 151m is fornthe currently ongoing PDM activities and the sector devt activities.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The unspent funds were from sector development grants and these are in the final stages of the procurement process. The other unspent funds were those meant for the parish development model of which we await the guidelines of implementation.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

The physical activities of Q3 were: Launched and distributed 21,523 hand hoes to farmer-beneficiaries in all of Kotido municipality. Conducted 3 monthly crop pest and disease surveys in all the divisions of the municipality. Facilitated selection of 400 farmers for seed technologies under the operation of wealth creation seed distribution. Facilitated establishment of 3 demonstration gardens to host beans, maize, and groundnuts at the headquarters of the municipality. Facilitated the training of 30 farmer group representatives in yield-enhancing technologies. Facilitate tsetse fly control spraying of 3,600 livestock units in the north division. Facilitated repair and maintenance of 2 motorcycles for the department. Trained 20 meat handlers on food hygiene and meat safety in The central division. Conducted 3 routine monthly disease surveillance in the municipality. Conducted 3 monthly routine monitoring and supervision of slaughters of livestock at the central abattoir.

During the Quarter, the department had anticipated to receive SH UGX 353M of which SH UGX 500,000 fro LRR, SH UGX 136M from sector conditional grant none wage, SH UGX 194M from sector conditional grant wage, SH UGX 22.5M from sector development grant, However SH UGX 395M was received during the quarter representing 112% of which SH UGX 500,000 from LRR which performed at 100%, SH UGX 136M representing from sector conditional none wage representing 100% and development revenues of 30M representing 133% of the revenues. During the quarter, the above revenues were spent as follows: wage at 111%, none wage at 102% and development at 36%.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The reason for unspent funds is because construction of the maternity in panyangara HCIII is not completed for the contracted firm to be paid.
