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## Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

The District in the forth quarter received accumulative release of funds of 29.852,986,000/= and a cumulative expenditure of 24,385,008,000/= which is amounting to 100% of the released budget and 83% budget spent respectively. The cumulative spent balances is 83% of the total released budget. The summary of departmental performance is as below: 1. Agriculture sector spent 72% of their overall budget which was 3,355,098,000/=, but for the quarter, they had planned 839,904,000/= but received 1,712,512,000/= which is 204% of the planned revenue. 2. Works and Transport sector in the same way spent 71% of their overall budget which was 1,810,807,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 423,678,000/= and received 916,664,000/= which is 216% of the planned revenue. 3. Trade and Industry spent 102% of their overall budget which was 64,868,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 16.217,000/= and received 16.316,000/= which is 101% of the planned revenue, 4. Education spent 89% of their overall budget which was 10,445,976,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 2,728,932,000/= and received 3,608,019,000/= which is 132% of the planned revenue. 5. Health spent 83% of their overall budget which was 6,030,632,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 1,507,658,000/= and received 1,575,227,000/= which is 104% of the planned revenue. 6. Water and Environment spent 64% of their overall budget which was 1,357,137,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 339,284,000/= and received 498,708,000/= which is 147% of the planned revenue. 7. Social Development spent 85% of their overall budget which was 292,841,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 73,210,000/= and received 97,112,000/= which is 133% of the planned revenue. 8. Public Sector Management spent 82% of their overall budget which was 5,048,473,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 1,267,218,000/= and received 1,455,889,000/= which is 115% of the planned revenue. 9. Accountability and governance sector spent 119% of their overall budget which was 951,340,000/=. but for the quarter, they had planned 237,835,000/= and received 241.068.000/= which is 101% of the planned revenue.

### **Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues**

The cumulative collection for LR for the four quarters amounted to 1,997,122,000/= which was way beyond the projected amount in the approved budget of 240,626,000/= FY2021/2022. This has caused an over performance to 830% and called for a supplementary budget. However there was a Revenue mobilization in the forth quarter to the tune of 704,325,993/=, we have been able to spend part of the local revenue funds which was approved by MoFPED as a supplementary budget in the forth quarter.

#### **Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers**

The government of Uganda in fourth quarter of the FY 2021/22 released conditional grants up-to a tune of 22,030,171,000/= which is 121% of its approved budget of 18,162,317,000/=. In the same way, Discretionary Government Transfers from the government also realized 108% which is 5,068,646,000/= of the approved total of 4,685,686,000=. These two grants performed very well as it was released according to plan.

#### **Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers**

Other Government Transfers performed only at 32% due to none release from most of the grant sources. We received only little funding from URF, UWEP, PRELNOR, NTDs and ACDP amounting to 719,679,000/= giving OGT a poor performance.

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## **Cumulative Performance for External Financing**

In the Forth quarter we were only able to attract very little funding from external support in terms of grant from their resource envelopes. However, this was amounting to Ugx. 37,370,000/= representing 1% of the approved projection for FY2021/2022 of Ugx. 4,024,248,000/=.

### Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

In the quarter four the department was able to receive a total revenue of 212,041,000 which made up 94% of the quarter planned value of 224,638,000 due to balances carried forward from the second quarter. These revenues were from wage, non wage and local revenue of 9,235,000/=, 33,394,000/= and 169,412,000 respectively and all made 94% of the planned. The department expended wage of 33,494,000/= and non wage & local revenue of 178,530,000/= which was 75% and 94% of the planned revenues respectively.

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### Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The unspent balances amounted to 946,837,000/= is coming from wage and Local revenue of 938,932,000/=which was money collected and accumulated in the general fund account but released under finance for transfer to the revenue collection account. we also had a balance from wage of 7,905,000/= meant for the newly recruited accountants still in process of accessing the Payroll.

Revenues: The cumulative outturn for Recurrent revenue (District unconditional grant, non-wage and sector conditional grant - wage) and Development revenue (District discretionary development Equalization grant and sector development grant) were 66% and 95% respectively giving a total revenue shares of 79% of the total revenue. During the quarter, we received UGX 440,195,000 (Recurrent – ugx 455,162,000 and development – ugx 75,634,000) which represented 52% of the total annual budget. Revenues for the quarter was as follows, District Unconditional grant non-wage – Ugx 109,988,000, District Unconditional – wage – Ugx 20,604,000, Locally raise revenue Ugx – 10,497,000, Sector conditional grant – non-wage – Ugx 142,420,000, Sector conditional grant wage – Ugx 74,651,00 and sector development grant – Ugx 75,634,000 representing the 52% Over performance was due to the additional fund which was send under the sector development grant for UgIFT Micro scale irrigation program Expenditures: For recurrent expenditure, the quarter outturn for wage and non-wage were Ugx 100,131,000 and Ugx 572,499,000 representing 108% and 157% respectively Total quarter expenditure on Domestic Development was Ugx 1,039,883,000 representing 271% The Average total expenditure for the quarter was 204% There was over performance since most procurements were done in the quarter

#### Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

Cumulatively, a total of UGX 8,153,078,000 was received representing 135% of the annual revenue target. This implies revenue overperformed by 35% off the target of 100% for the 4th quarter of the FY. Overperformance was due to additional receipt of Sector Conditional Grant funds coupled with District Conditional Grant (Non-Wage). Also, in Q4 UGX 3,985,528,000 was received; representing 264% of the planned revenue receipts (UGX 1,507,658,000). O4 revenue receipts by source are as follows; Firstly, recurrent receipts were as follows; 3783% of the planned District Unconditional Grant (Non-wage) was received (UGX 94,563,000), 2788% of planned local revenue was received (UGX 10,497,000), though UGX 12,782,000 was planned, no funds were received to that effect in the quarter. In addition, 313% of the planned Sector Conditional Grant (Non-wage) was received (UGX 388,513,000 Vs UGX 124,002,000); this was because of the transfer of supplementary Ugift primary health care funds. Also, 447% of the planned quarterly wage was received (UGX 3,472,071,000 vs UGX 777,311,000). In terms of development revenue receipts; only 3% of the planned revenue were received (UGX 19,884,000 Vs 590,687,000); 66% of the planned District Equalization grant was received in the quarter (UGX 9,825,000 vs UGX 14,788,000), with only 2% and 3% of the planned External financing and Sector Development grant received respectively during the quarter (UGX 8,020,000 vs 506,062,000) and (UGX 2,039,000 vs UGX 69,836,000). In regards to expenditure, cumulatively by end of Q4, a total of UGX 5,000,587,000 was absorbed representing 83% of the expected annual expenditure. This arose due to less expenditure on the wage and external financing funds for Q4. Underperformance is revenue expenditure due to no receipts of revenue funds from donors to implement the planned activities. Q4 expenditure was as follows; Firstly, in terms of recurrent expenditure; 94% and 360% were expended from the planned wage (UGX 729,902,000 vs UGX 777,311,000), and Non-wage (UGX 502,896,000 vs UGX 139,661,000) respectively. Also, only 2% of the planned external finances were expended in the quarter (UGX 7,962,000 vs UGX 506,062,000) and 395% of the domestic development funds were spent in the quarter (UGX 334,467,000 vs UGX 84,624,000).

#### Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

UGX 3,150,276,000 representing 41% of the annual budget, remained unutilized by the end of the fourth quarter, due to no less expenditure of the wage attributed to delays in the payment of staff arrears in the district.

#### Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

392 staff received payment for 12 months in the district. 2,883 inpatients were admitted, 93,886 outpatients attended to during the quarter, 1,632 deliveries were successfully conducted in the quarter from all the health facilities, and 1,957 children under 1 were fully immunized during the quarter. Also, from the DHO's office; 1 support supervision was conducted, 3 monthly DHMT meetings were held, 1 HMIS/DHIS training was conducted for the health workers of the district, and 1 quarterly performance review meeting was held, and 4 support staff paid lunch allowances. In addition, one block of 4 staff units was successfully constructed at Odokonyero HC II, the meeting area at Awer HC II was successfully remodeled, 1 block of the office of the DHO was renovated, 3 laptops were procured for the office of DHO, 3 standard pit latrines with 2 stances each constructed at Pacilo HC II, Pabbo HC III, and Bibia HC III, the solar system of Bira HC II repaired and installed with new batteries and inverter, and 15 200Ah solar batteries procured and installed for Atiak HC IV.
