Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of quarter four the district had realized Shs 24,599,576,000 against an annual budget of Shs 21,538,376,000 being 114% budget performance. Of which from the central government source the district realized Shs 24,101,684,000 against an annual budget of Shs 20,492,979,000 being 122% budget performance for the year. Most central government funds performed as planned for the quarter for non wage recurrent grants and development grants except other government transfers where only 47% was realized. The Ministries have not communicated to the District why funds were not released. Under the local revenue source the district had realized Shs 2255.478,000 against an annual budget of Shs 245,259,000 being 108% budget performance. With the exception of local hotel tax, park fees, ground rent & market dues all other local revenue sources performed well. Good local revenue collection was due to compensations from road constructions and local service from construction companies. Under external financing the district 862,751,000 against an annual budget of Shs 800,137,000 being 108% budget performance. By the end of quarter four funds received had been disbursed to the departments with Health and Administration realizing the highest budget out turn of 155%, and 112% respectively while roads and water realized the least with 73 and 83%% respectively. The reason for this variance being Health and Administration realized their expected funding from donors and supplementary for COVID activities and new LLGs operational funds compared to roads and water which expected funds from URF and FIEFOC funds were not received. Two of the twelve departments had spent less 80% and over of the funds they received during the quarter. By the end of quarter four the district had Shs 5,212,141,000 as unspent balances with Health, and education departments having the biggest balances. The funds are majorly for some construction works in progress under UGIFT

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

By the end of quarter four from the local revenue source the district had realized Shs 255,658,000 against an annual budget of Shs 245,259,248 being 104% budget performance. Several local revenue sources performed well. Poor local revenue collection from markets which contribute a portion of the district local revenue were open but restrictions due to Covid 19 pandemic.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

By the end of quarter four from the central government source the district realized Shs 24,101,684,000 against an annual budget of Shs 20,492,979,000 being 122% budget performance for the year. Most central government funds performed well for both non wage recurrent grants and development grants. Several supplementary budgets were issued for pensions, wage, COVID19, operation of new sub counties and development

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

By the end of quarter four from the other central government source the district realised Shs 288,065,000 against an annual budget of Shs 574,844,925 being 50% budget performance for the year. All the other central government funds did not performed as planned for the quarter except UWEP ie Youth Livelihood Programme. The Ministries have not communicated to the District why funds were not released.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

By the end of quarter four from the external financing the district 862,751,000 against an annual budget of Shs 800,137,178 being 108% budget performance. All other sources for external financing performed well except WHO whose funding depends results by health facilities.

The planned revenues exceeded the total revenue received because of a supplementary release on wage and pension arrears.

The department has unspent balance of shs 47,474,000 at the end of the quarter. shs 3,119,000 remained as wage. shs 42,346,000 as non wage was for LLGs and shs 2,009,000 was for purchase of a fridge which bounced in processing at the close

By end of quarter four the department had spent UGX 339,1480,000 against an annual budget of UGX 366,813,000 representing 92% for the year and 101% for the quarter. Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

By the end of quarter three the department had cumulatively received Shs 850,579,000 against an annual budget of Shs 716,827,000 which represents 119% for the year and 170% for the quarter. By end of quarter three the department had cumulatively spent Shs 835,746,000 against an annual budget of Shs 716,827,000 representing 117% for the year and 212% for the quarter. There was over performance in District Unconditional Grant (Non-Wage) and this performed at 144% more money was received than what was expected as planned in the budget and this was because of the supplementary budget that was meant to cater for Ex-gratia of Chairperson of LC I, LCII due to the operationalization of the newly created villages in the district. The department did not spend Shs 14,833,000 and is as explained below;

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The total unspent balance in fourth quarter was Shs. 14,833,000 and this represented 2% of the total annual budget; of which wage was Shs. 7,111,000 and this was as a result of one of the LC III Chairpersons who was not paid and this was from Kiriki Sub County. The non-wage that remained was Shs. 7,722,000 and this balance of money was meant for Sundet Sub County, Kaseko Sub County and Tuikat Sub County.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter

During the quarter under review, the council held one council meeting and 0ne extra ordinary at the district head quarters, paid monthly allowance to district councilors for 3 months from April to June, paid salary to DEC members, District speaker,LC3 Chairpersons and staff attached to council for 3 month from April to June, procurement unit held 4 contracts committee meetings, 2 evaluation committee meetings, made 1 advert under national and selective bidding, quarter 3 progress reports submitted, did confirmation of 1 officer in service, promotions of 10 staff, Reinstated 1 staff in to service, Removed 1 staff from service, dismissed 1 staff from due falsification of documents, rescinded 1 staff from appointment, transferred 30 staff from other districts to Kween, Recruited 189 staff on probation, Carried out monitoring of projects across the district by DEC members and standing committees (social services), participated in launching of some of the projects and held 1 standing committee and DEC meeting.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

The department received Ugx 2,925,773,000 by end of quarter four and this represented 91% of the approved annual Budget of Ugx 3,198,324,000. The quarterly revenues performance was at 99%, other revenue sources performed as per the target. The department cumulative expenditure performance by end of quarter four was Ugx 2,630,245,000 and this represents 82% of the annual budget and quarterly at Ugx 1,458,785,000 and this represented 182% of the approved quarterly expenditure budget of UGx 799,581,000. The wage performance was at Ugx 1,018,447,000 which is 110% of the annual budget and quarterly at 105% (Ugx 242,569,000) implying that all staffs in the department were paid their monthly salaries with wage supplementary. The non-wage expenditure performance was at Ugx 1,377,256,000 this represents 68% of the annual budget and quarterly at Ugx 983,984,000 and this represented 195% of the quarterly approved budget. Domestic development was at Ugx 234,543,000 and this represents 93% of the annual budget and quarterly at UGX 232,232,000 and this represents 369% of the quarterly plan implying that most of the capital purchases and supplies were done in quarter four when procurement process had been concluded.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The unspent balance was Ugx 295,528,000 and this represents 10% of the annual budget of which Ugx 256,463,000 was for wage, Ugx 39,062,000 was for the non-wage most of which was for implementing PDM and Ugx 2,000 is for development.

By the end of Quarter 4, the department had received cumulative revenue of 6,822,150,000 against the annual budget of 4,668,919,000 representing 146% of approved budget estimate. This was as a result of supplementary funding received in quarter 1 and 4. Actual amount received in quarter 4 was 2,150,856,000 against quarterly budget of 1,164,105,000 representing 185% of the approved quarterly budget estimate. By the end of the quarter the department had spent Shs 5,761,773,000 against annual budget of 4,668,919 000 representing 123% for the year and 203% for the quarter. Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

By the end of the financial year 102,783,000Shs (2%) of recurrent expenditure had not been spent 90,748,000 was meant for wage whereas 12,035,000 was non-wage recurrent expenditure. This is because of the supplementary budget which was requested in quarter 4. It was approved and money paid in June towards the end of the financial year when it was late to plan for and implement the intended activities. Part of the wage was salary which was not paid to staffs who had abandonment of duty for almost a full year. Similarly, by the end of the financial year 957,595,000 (40%) of development grant had not been spent. This is because procurement process to get suitable contractors started late and thus construction works commenced late and couldn't be completed in time before the end of the financial year. Payments for the uncompleted works like Construction of staff house and Completion of upgrade of Terenpoy HCIII, Upgrading of Kaptum and Benet HCIIs to HCIII, and procurement of medical equipment for Kaptum and Benet was not made.
