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Summary of Cumulative Receipts, disbursements and expenditure for FY 2021/22

By the end of the FY 2021/22, the receipts of the vote stood at Uganda Shillings: 15.893,345,000/=representing 104 percent of the annual approved budget. This was above 100 percent of the expected revenue receipts by the end of Ouarter Four. This was higher due to COVID-19 supplementary budget of 286.400.000/= received at quarter one, 421.282,779.000 of Ugift Supplementary allocation to Health, Education and Natural Resources, one off receipts of Other Government Transfers totaling to 126,000,000/= which was ment for completion of Four (4) Classroom Block in Obalanga Comprehensive Secondary School, External Financing from UNICEF and WHO totaling to 86,281,600/= and OGT for COVID 19 routine vaccination exercise totaling to 90,307,258/= and Other supplementary allocations received in quarter four. Furthermore, despite over performance (above the desired 100%), Discretionary Government Transfers, Conditional Government Transfers, Locally Raised Revenue and External Financing performed above the desired; at 107% (2,273,276,000), 106% (12,743,497,000), 105% (165,077,000) and 102% (188,814,000) respectively while Other Government Transfers performed below the desired at 74%. Besides that, most of the recurrent central government transfers performed at and above the expected of 100% with Urban Unconditional Grant (Non-Wage), Urban Unconditional Grant (Wage), District Unconditional Grant (Wage), Gratuity for Local Government all performed at 100% as expected. Pension for Local Governments. District Unconditional Grant (Non-Wage) and Sector Conditional Grant (Non-Wage) performed above the desired at 248%, 133% and at 121% respectively. Development Revenues (District DDEG, Urban DDEG and Transitional Development grant, sector Development Grants all performed at 100% as expected. Best performance on External financing was due to supplementary budgets from UNICEF and WHO received during quarter three and Worst performance of Other Government transfers was attributed to other Government ministries not releasing the funds pledged as planned. Despite the aforementioned receipts to the tune of 15.893.345.000 (104%), the vote spent only 11.850.910.000 accounting for 78% of the annual budget.

Cumulative Performance for Locally Raised Revenues

At the close of the financial year 2021/2022, the district had cumulatively collected 165,077,000 from the District and all its Six (6) Lower Local Governments. This accounts for only 105% of the expected annual out turn of 157,354,000 that Parliament had appropriated to the District for the financial year in question. The over performance was registered due to presidential directive to open up weekly markets which are the major contributors of the District Own Source Revenue. The Other fines and penalties-from other government units performed highest at 155%, followed by Market/Gate Charges at 146%, Land Fees and LST performed moderately at 96% and 86% respectively while other sources far performed far much below the average.

Cumulative Performance for Central Government Transfers

In total, the vote received a total of Ugx: 15,016,773,000 as central government transfers representing 95 percent of revenue receipts. The disbursement is 105 percent, and is slightly higher than the expected percentage of 100%. This arose because of the high performance of Sector Conditional Grant Non-Wage (Health) due to COVID-19 supplementary budget received in quarter one and two as well as District Unconditional Grant Non-Wage meant for operationalization of Town Councils among others.

Cumulative Performance for Other Government Transfers

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The vote cumulatively received 522,682,000 as other government transfers representing 74 percent of estimated revenue receipts by the end of the financial year. The disbursement is only 74 percent, which is far much below the expected 100 percent by forth quarter. These funds were received from Uganda Road Fund, Uganda Women Entrepreneurship Program (UWEP), Micro Projects under Luwero Rwenzori Development Programme and Other Government transfers from MOH that was used for COVID-19 Immunization campaign. Support to PLE (UNEB), Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP) Development Initiative for Northern Uganda (DINU), Results Based Financing (RBF) and Micro Projects under Luwero Rwenzori Development Programme performed above the desired due to the supplementary allocation form Ministry of Teso Affairs that was meant to support for community groups.

Cumulative Performance for External Financing

The vote cumulatively received 188,814,000/= from GAVI, UNICEF, TASO and WHO. This was 102% of the projected annual budget of 185,000,000. The amount from UNICEF and WHO was realized as supplementary budget under health. The Aids Support Organization (TASO) remitted 34,934,000 representing 29% while GAVI over performed at 104% because of supplementary allocation.

Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

By the end of quarter Four, the Sub Sub Program had received a total revenue share of 1,456,338,000/= representing 128% of the annual planned budget. The cumulative out turn of recurrent revenues was Uganda Shillings 1,231,503,000/= representing (135%) and Development of 224,835,000/= representing 100%. The development revenues performed at 100% as expected. Besides that, District Unconditional Grant-Wage, Urban Unconditional Grant (Wage) and Gratuity for Local Governments all performed at 100% as desired while Pension for Local Governments, District Unconditional Grant (Non-Wage), Local Raised Revenues performed far much above the desired; at 248%, 341% and 203 respectively while Multi-sectoral transfers to LLG Non-wage performed far much below at 78% since all the supplementary budget on Local Revenue was indicated as transfers at HLG. The District Discretionary Equalization Grant (DDEG) and Multi-Sectoral Transfers to LLG_Gou all performed at 100% as expected. The department spent Ugx: 1,132,550,000/= representing 100% of the annual budget due to supplementary allocation and this is broken down as wage expenditure that performed at 100% (427,347,000/=) as expected, while both non-wage and development performed at 99 percent of the annual budget. The Sub Sub Program had a total unspent balance of Ugx: 321,930,000/= representing 22% of the amount received by fourth Quarter of which total recurrent balance was 321,930,000/= representing 26% with Wage balance of Ugx: 378,000/= and Non-Wage balance of Ugx: 321,552,000/=, Development Balances (Domestic Development) amounted to Ugx: 1,858,000/= representing 1%.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The development amount of 1,858,000/= was balances after payment of a Solar system, 6 stance pit latrine and fencing of Administration block among others. Non-Wage balance of 321,552,000/= was meant for pension, gratuity and Operational funds for New Town Councils which was warranted under production and therefore the expenditure of the said is not reflected hence unspent balance.

By close of Quarter four, the Sub-Sub Programme had received UGX 246,650,000 out of the budget of UGX 252,352,000. Out of UGX246,650,000 received; recurrent was 237,720,000 representing 98% of expected 243,422,000 and development 8,930,000 representing 100% of the expected UGX 8,930,000 The District Unconditional Grant (Non-wage) and the District Unconditional Grant (Wage) and Urban Unconditional Grant (Wage), Urban wage performed at 100% of the desired performance, Multi-Sectoral Transfers to LLGs Non Wage, a Multi-Sectoral Transfers to LLGs_Gou Development and Local revenue performed at 93%, 100% and 87% respectively of the expected annual budget. The Sub-Sub Programme spent UGX 237,473,000 constituting 94% of the annual expected expenditure outcome. This expenditure is broken down in to: Wage of UGX 111,744,000 representing 93% and Non-wage to the tune of UGX 116,799,000 accounting for 95% of the annual estimated outturn. Development expenditure was UGX 8,910,000 representing 100% of the annual estimate. The Sub-Sub Programme had an unspent balance of UGX 9,177,000 representing 4% of the released budget. This was further broken down in to; Recurrent of UGX 226,000, and wage worth UGX 8,910,000.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The Sub-sub programme had an unspent balance of 9,177,00 and the reasons for the same were; Failure to absorb the wage component because of the staffing gaps still unfilled in Town Councils

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Summary of Workplan Revenues and Expenditure by Source

By the end of the Quarter, the Sub-sub program had received UGX 371,852,000 as total revenue shares representing 98% of the annual budget. This was slightly lower than the anticipated revenue out turn of 100% expected at end of the Quarter. The Development Component was not allocated to the sub sub program it performed at 0%. Out of the total recurrent revenues UCG (Non-Wage) performed at 203,134,000 representing 100% of the annual out turn, while UCG (wage) performed at 128,370,000 also representing 100% of the annual out turn and UCG Non-Wage and Wage combined performing at 98% by the end of the quarter lower than expected 100%. Locally Raised revenues cumulatively contributed 23,207,000 accounting for 73% thus, performing below the expected annual out turn of 100% by the end of the financial year. Multi-sectoral Transfers to LLGs stood at 17,641,000 accounting for 100% performing exactly as expected 100% by the end of the financial year. The Sub sub program expended UCG (wage) of 127,576,000 accounting for 99% and UCG (Non-Wage) of 247,147,000 also accounting for 98% of the total revenues received living the unspent balance at 795,000 representing -0%.

Reasons for unspent balances on the bank account

The Department had shortage in IPF during the planning and this explains the negative in the unspent balances and justified by the narrative of the political leaders who were not paid by the end of the financial year.

Highlights of physical performance by end of the quarter
