The Budget Framework Paper for the financial year 2023/2024 has been developed in accordance with the Third District Five-year Development Plans 2020/21-2024/25, National Development Plan III (2020/21-2024/25) and Vision 2040.

Rakai district will implement her programs for the Financial Year 2023/2024 under the theme Empowering Communities to Embrace Industrialization for Inclusive Growth, Employment and Wealth Creation. The strategy will primarily focus on four broad areas, namely:-

- i. Enhancing value addition in key growth opportunities by: -
- Promoting Value chains between farmers and markets for key agricultural commodities
- ii. Enhancing productivity and social well-being of the population by: -
- Building skills for agro-processing;
- Addressing the health sector's needs to deal with the CoVID-19 pandemic, operationalizing health facilities, especially at the Health Centre III level
- Improve functionality of safe water points through routine maintenance.
- iii. Strengthen the role of the state in guiding and facilitating development by: -
- Strengthening Government implementation through better planning and budgeting, implementation of the programmatic approach and enhanced monitoring and evaluation.

The funding for this plan is expected from different Central Government grants locally generated revenue and external funding which is expected from donors like UNICEF Uganda, GAVI, World Health Organization, among others. The development direction for the district will focus on improved livelihood conditions of our communities through properly identified and guided alignments to strategic inventions in feeder roads improvements, increased production and productivity at the household level, improved health, education services, safe water provision in order to improve on safe water

coverage in the district and payment of staff salaries. The district will as well institute strong measures for reviewing and monitoring the implementation of

priorities across all sectors. On behalf of Rakai District Council, I wish to extend my gratitude to the Government of Uganda, Development partners, technical staff and all other stakeholders that contributed to the development of this document. I am hopeful that this document will go a long way in directing sustainable development that aims at improving the quality of life of the Rakai District Community

Revenue Performance in the First Quarter of 2022/23

The district received total revenue of UGX 10,069,198,000 from Central Government transfers, External financing and locally generated revenue against the approved Annual budget of UGX 44,231,303,000, which is 23% realization by the end of the first quarter FY 2022/2023. Generally, the district performed below the anticipated 25% whereby The Central Government transfers performed at a tune of 23%, other government transfers at 37%, External financing at 6% and locally generated revenue at 6%. Other government transfers performed poorly because some of the non-wage recurrent grants performed at 0% i.e, Support to PLE (UNEB), Micro projects under Luwero- Rwenzori Development Program and fewer funds from URF. The relatively good performance under central Government transfers is because most central government funds performed as planned for the first quarter at more than 25% for Programme Conditional Grant – Wage Recurrent. The External financing is not performing as expected and this was because of the district not receiving funds as planned especially from UNICEF, GAVI and WHO. All funds was disbursed to the respective Programmes as per the regulations whereby 17% was disbursed as wages, 18% as nonwage and 2% as external financing.

Planned Revenues for FY 2023/24

The district projected total revenue for FY 2023/2024 is UGX 42,575,780,000 compared to UGX 44,231,303,000 for FY 2022/23. This is a reduction of 3.74%, which is mainly due to a decline in Central Government Transfers and External financing for FY 2023/2024, which has decreased by 2.98% and 26.96% respectively compared to that of FY 2022/23 mainly because some IPFs for some grants were not provided for i.e Gratuity for local governments and GIZ. The revenue sources will include; locally generated revenue of UGX 553,561,000, Discretionary Government Transfers of UGX 5,634,135,000, Conditional Government Transfers of UGX 33,935,923,000, Other Government Transfers of UGX 1,368,223,000 and External Financing of UGX 1,083,938,000. However, most of the other revenue sources such as Sector Conditional Grant (Non-Wage) and District Discretionary Development Equalization Grant have not changed significantly compared to the levels of FY 2022/23

Revenue Forecast for FY 2023/24

Locally Raised Revenues

The projected Local Revenue for the district during the FY 2023/2024 including local revenue for Lower Local Governments will be UGX 553,561,000

representing 1.30% of the total district budget. The major revenue sources include Business licenses, Inspection Fees, Interest on loans issued, Local Services Tax, Market /Gate Charges, Other Fees and Charges, sale of Bid documents, and Registration fees for documents. The projected local revenue for

FY 2023/2024 has remained the same compared to that of FY 2022/2023 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which could not favour the locally generated revenue as most of the Market businesses are just recovering

Central Government Transfers

The projected Central Government Transfers for the district during the FY 2023/2024 including multi-sectoral transfers to Lower Local Governments stand at UGX 40,938,281,000 representing 96.15% of the total district budget. Out of this revenue, 13.76% will be Discretionary Government transfers (UGX 5,634,135,000), 82.90% will be conditional Government transfers (UGX 33,935,923,000) while 3.34% will constitute other Government Transfers

(UGX 1,368,223,000). The projected Central Government Transfers for FY 2023/2024 have decreased by 2.98% compared to that of FY 2022/23 mainly

because some IPFs for some grants were not provided for i.e Gratuity for local governments

External Financing

The projected External Financing for the district during the FY 2023/2024 stands at UGX 1,083,938,000 representing 2.54% of the total district budget.

This revenue will be realized from the following sources: Rakai Health Sciences Programme (RHSP), World Health Organisation (WHO), Global Alliance

for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI) and United Nations Children Fund (UNICEF). The projected External Financing for FY 2023/2024 has decreased by 26.96% compared to that of FY 2022/2023 due to no commitment from Gesellschaft fur Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ)

Medium Term Expenditure Plans

The District expenditure aims at achieving the District Vision of A transformed Rakai community from a peasant to a modern society by 2040. The expenditures are aligned to priorities in the National Development Plan and the 5 year District Development Plan. This is derived from the program annual

work plans for example access to safe water will increase from 38% to 40%, reduce the HIV/AIDs prevalence from 10% to 4%, recruitment of more staff

to fill the gaps and improve service delivery, increase incomes of our communities, promote sustainable utilization of wetlands, Maintenance & rehabilitation of district roads
