### **QUARTER 3: Highlights of Vote Performance**

- Land Acquisition for government projects has significantly increased project costs and in some cases led to delays in project implementation.
- 2. Inadequate counterpart funding for compensation which delays disbursements by other funding partners. Government will put in place a mechanism that will ensure adequate counterpart funds for the projects are promptly availed.
- 3. Expanding electricity coverage to realize the required transformation in rural areas of Uganda in reasonable time poses unique challenges. Therefore, despite the heavy investment in the construction of the rural electrification infrastructure which is capital intensive, the connection rates have remained very low.
- 4. The power tariff is relatively high mainly due to the Bujagali tariff that is relatively higher than the Kira and Nalubale power plants.
- 5. There is an increase of illegal mining being carried out by artisans in areas of Mubende, Namayingo, Bugiri and the Karamoja region. This shall be addressed in the revised legislation where some areas will be gazetted for these Artisanal and Small-scale miners.
- 6. The oil price is currently very low at less than \$50 a barrel, development of some of the discoveries and the required commercialization infrastructure may be affected.
- 7. Management of expectations created by the discovery of petroleum: The people of Uganda in general, and in the areas where the discoveries have been made in particular, expect quick revenues, jobs and business opportunities, among other things.

#### Performance highlights for the Quarter

The total installed power generation capacity has improved over time and currently stands at 947MW from the large, small hydro, thermal and renewable sources of energy. Development of Karuma Hydropower Project (600MW) and Isimba Hydropower Project (183 MW) is progressing well. Medium size hydropower projects and minihydros under development include: Achwa Hydropower Project (83MW), Muzizi Hydro Power Project (44.7MW): Nyagak III Hydropower Project (5.4MW and the GETFIT Portfolio of about 156.5MW. Government has continued to expand the power transmission network to ensure attainment of national electrification coverage as envisioned in the National Development Plan. A total of 113 districts out of the total 117, representing 96.6% are now electrified. About 6,000 Off-grid connections at household/institutional solar systems across districts were installed. Energy efficiency management measures have been instituted through audits of major energy consumers, labeling and enforcing standards, installation of the lighting test bench and preparation of the Energy Efficiency Conservation Bill 2017.

Government granted eight (8) Petroleum Production Licenses over 13 oil fields to the licensed oil companies during August 2016. The joint venture partners (TULLOW, TOTAL and CNOOC) launched the Front-End Engineering Design (FEED) studies for the upstream petroleum development and production projects in February 2017 to inform the Final Investment Decision (FID). Four (4) companies have been shortlisted for refinery development, and due diligence on these Companies is being undertaken. Development of Crude Oil Pipelines from Kabaale, in Hoima District to Tanga Port in Tanzania is ongoing. A review of the Mineral Policy is ongoing and a draft Green Paper on Mineral and Mining Policy was prepared and preparation of Principles to be embodied in the Mining (Amendment) Act, 2003 was done. Both documents in the revised form are ready to be presented to Cabinet by June 2017. Mines Development of Kilembe Mines Limited and Sukulu Phosphate and Steel Project is ongoing for Mineral Value Addition
