The Embassy participated in first CCIVS Partnership meeting on "The future of Cultural Heritage and Diversity with international Partners" held on 8th February 2017 in Paris

Variances in Budget execution is because the Embassy procurement process is still ongoing and is yet to award a contract to the successful bidder.

Participated in all OECD forums to vouch for Uganda's support in promotion of economic growth, prosperity, and sustainable development.

The Embassy met with Mr Didier to discuss the technicalities for the Embassy to participate in the Diplomatic Garden party scheduled for July 14th 2017 and the Mission committed funding of 5000 Euros to book the Uganda stand at the event.

The Mission continued to coordinate the Kampala team to participate and create the required match making exercise with tour operators in France.

#### Performance highlights for the Quarter

H.E President Museveni attended the 27th French Africa Summit at Bamako at the Invitation of President Francois Hollande of France. The Heads of State produced a communiqué on the discussions and commitments between African and French Head of State on a variety of topics including politics, the Economy and Security among others.

France agreed to assist African Countries in fighting terrorism and cybercrimes and agreed to place sufficient means and increase their cooperation in the area of fighting crimes

Coordinated the drafting of the MOU with Campus France as a framework to enable Ugandans to access public universities in France

Held Specialised Meetings with AFD Officials on increasing France Official assistance to Uganda.

Held High level negotiations to make Uganda a priority country in 2017 to receive increased bilateral financial assistance from France from current 10M€ to 30M€.

The Mission regularly met with the special advisor of President Hollande to lobby for Uganda to be priority in French ODA Policy

The Mission held meetings with Foreign Affairs officials to know how Uganda could operationalise utilisation of the 3 billion provided by France to Africa Countries for clean alternate energy

The Mission met with the Special Advisor of President Hollande and Ministry of Foreign Affairs officials to have President Hollande visit Uganda before the elections.

The Mission kept sending briefs to inform Kampala on the French Presidential elections

The Mission held several meetings with French special envoy to the Great lakes Region Amb>Sophie Makame

Embassy attended a meeting on the proposal to create and coordinate a network of "Green Embassies"

Hon. Okello Oryem participated in the "Protect the Children from War" Ministerial Conference held on 21st February 2017 at the French Ministerial Conference Centre in Paris.

Embassy attended the VIII Tourism Investment and Business Forum for Africa held at the International Trade Fair in Madrid, Spain (INVESTOUR). The Forum launched the International Year of Sustainable Tourism for development.

The Embassy met with Mr Didier to discuss the technicalities for the Embassy to participate in the Diplomatic Garden party scheduled for July 14th 2017 and the Mission committed funding of 5000 Euros to book the Uganda stand at the event.

The Mission continued to coordinate the Kampala team to participate and create the required match making exercise with tour operators in France.

Met Ugandans in France periodically and informed them on the available opportunities in Uganda and their required contribution in terms of remittances, direct investment, partnership building and skills

As of end Q3 2017, the Embassy issued 365 visas, most of which were to French nationals. Of the visas issued, 171 were for business purposes while 147 were for tourism with the remaining falling in the "other" category. The total collection of consular fees for the quarter amounts to 27,680 euros.
