The theme of the budget is about helping Uganda grow stronger by:

- Farming for business (commercial agriculture)
- Building more factories (industrialization)
- Expanding services
- Using digital technology
- Finding more markets for our products

The government, together with partners like the Bank of Uganda, Uganda Revenue Authority, private companies and civil society, will share information with the public during Budget Month. This helps people understand how money is collected and spent.

Uganda's budget for 2025/26 is 72.4 trillion shillings. Part of this money is planned by Parliament and part goes to important statutory needs. appropriated

WHAT IS THE BUDGET?



Think about when your family goes shopping.

Your parents first decide how **much money they have** and **make a list of what to buy**—like food, clothes, and school supplies.



The government does the same thing! It collects money (from taxes and debt/borrowing).



A tax is when the governments asks people to contribute some money from their income to make the country nice for everyone



A debt is when the govt asks some other people to give them money to use for a while before they can pay it back later.



It plans how to spend it on important things like schools, hospitals, roads, technology, sports, and jobs.

So, a budget is like **Uganda's shopping list** for the whole country!

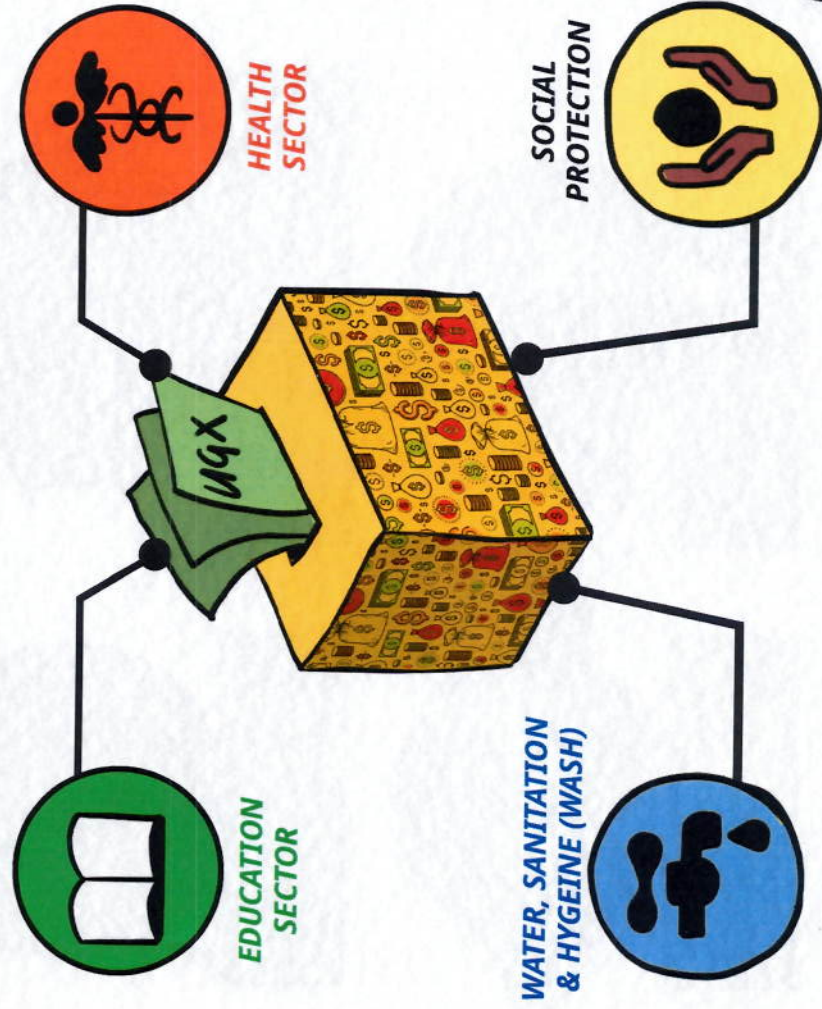


WHAT IS SPECIAL ABOUT THIS YEAR'S BUDGET (2025/2026)?

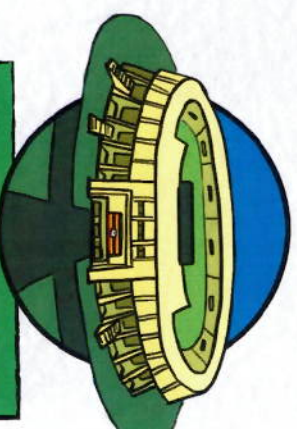

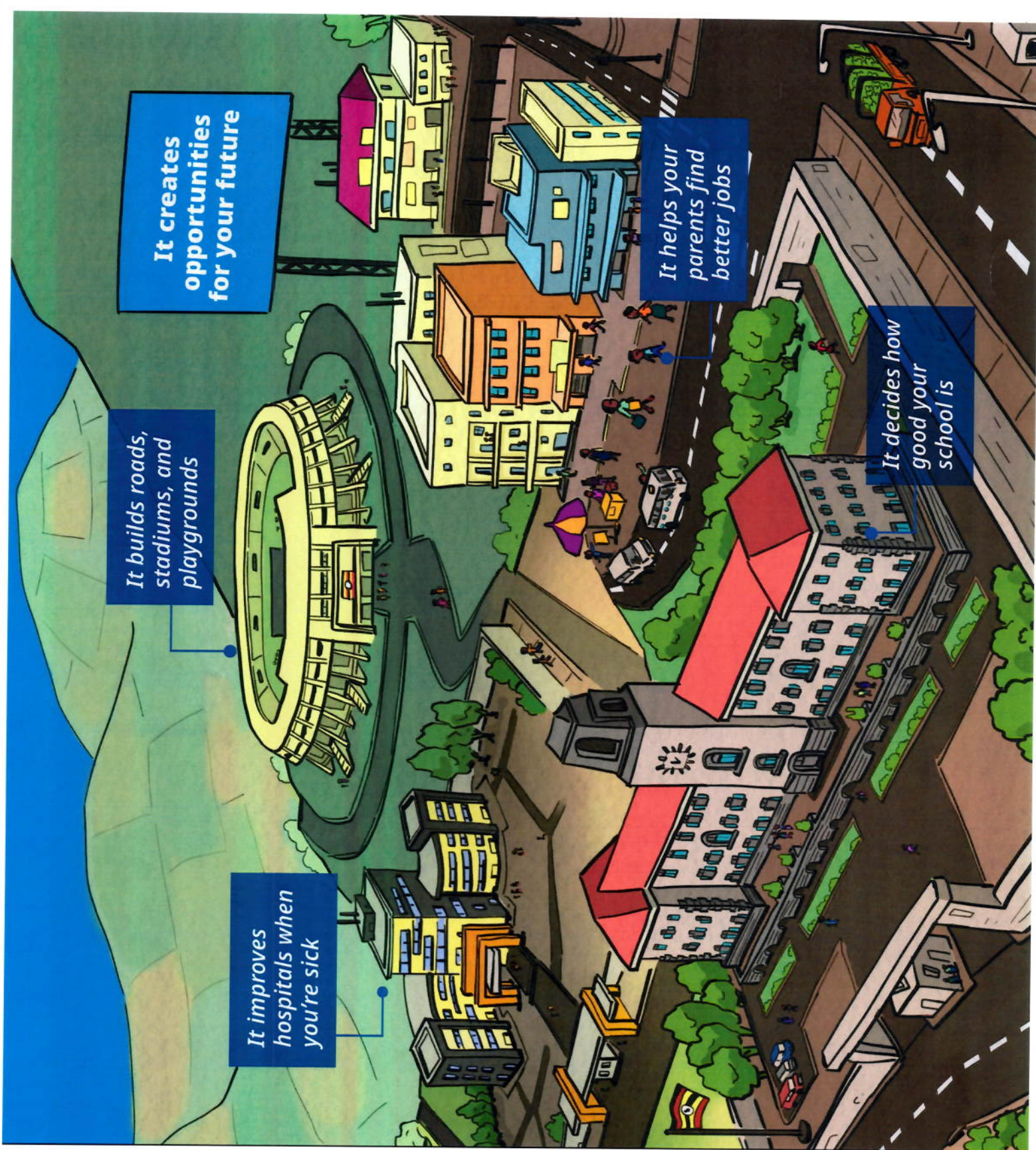

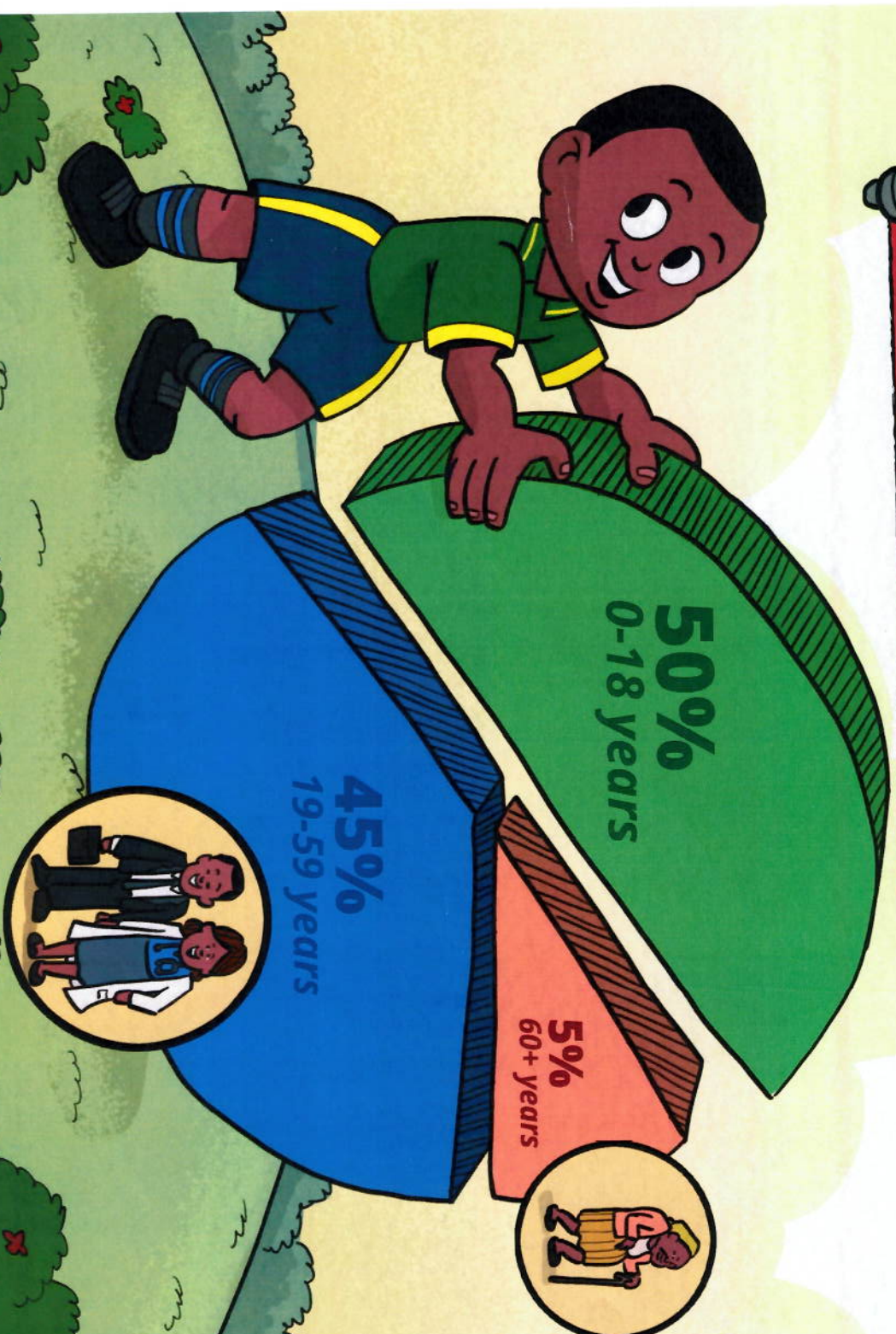

HOW DOES THE BUDGET HELP CHILDREN?

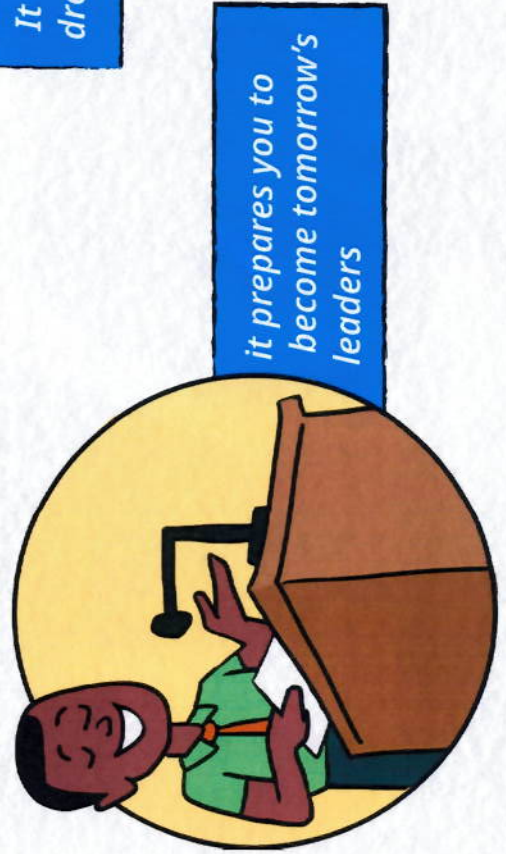
The budget isn't just for adults—it's for YOU too!
