The performance in the Supreme Court and Court of Appeal has been affected by lack of substative leaders while the Magistrates Courts have suffered and performed poorly due to withdrawal of Chief Magistrates to serve in the High Court as Assistant Registratrs. The use of new mechanisms such as plea bargaining has boosted performance at the High Court Level. The major challenge in compilation of the report arises from the fact that most courts are not networked and collection, storage and analysis of court performance is a challenge that requires a lasting solution. In addition, the policy and planning Unit has never been connected on the IFMIS and thus, has to rely on the Accounts division for the Financial report.
