NTR collections is far below i.e. less than 50% of the planned collection due to the renovation work of the maternity ward and maternity services were temporarily shifted to private ward until August 2014, however the private ward needs some fixing before it becomes functional, by the end of 2014 the private ward was still not being operational. The private ward used to contribute much to NTR.
