QUARTER 1: Highlights of Vote Performance

CHALLENGES DURING BUDGET EXECUTION

I. Slowdown in business activity mainly attributed to uncertain economic environment during the general elections period in Kenya led to under performance of international trade taxes.

II. Uganda's export earnings dropped by 2.4% following decline in most export commodities like coffee, fish & its products, gold, beans, cotton and tea. The decline is attributed to the fall in the export volumes of major products. The fall in export of gold is due to the drop in the price of gold on the international market.

III. Some activities were differed to quarter two mainly because the quarterly release came in late and in some Departments staff was engaged with critical priority activities which took precedence during implementation.

IV. Delayed implementation of the Ministry's new structure impacted on the implementation of departmental work plans due to under staffing.
 V. Most procurements are ongoing especially for ICT systems related activities and for consultancies to undertake various activities. These will be completed in quarter two and as such activities will be implemented in second quarter.

The NPC started the development of the 5 year National Population Council Strategic Plan. The development of this Strategic Plan was because of transitioning from POPSEC to NPC. Radix Management Consulting (u) ltd was awarded the contract and it has begun the process of conducting informant interviews, desk reviews to collect vital data that will inform the drafting of the Strategic Plan.

Process for the review of the 2008 NPP underway and the consultant has started on their work.

• A Zero draft of the reviewed National Population Policy has been submitted to NPC Secretariat.

NPC procures data handling equipment for town councils for CDOs/Planners that undertook training on POPDEV integration techniques, Harmonized database and orientation on POPDEV integration.

Data processing equipment (Central Processing Unit, Monitor and Ups) were procured for 10 Town Councils.

The 10 computer were delivered, engraved and distributed to the selected town councils (phase 10) of Kiboga TC, Kakira TC, Anaka TC, Kambuga TC, Rubona TC, Butalangu TC, Kiwoko TC, Buvuma TC, Sheema TC and Kabwohe-Itendero TC.

Planners and CDO's recommended that there is need to train more Town Councils on data management, and also plan for the new Municipal Councils as well as Town Councils which were created in the recent financial years.

The National Population Council organized a three day training to enhance the capacity of LG technical officers (District & Town Councils) in POPDEV integration, trained them on the harmonized District database and oriented

them on the importance of data in planning. The Local Governments were also oriented on POPDEV Integration Assessment Indicators and policy options for harnessing the demographic dividend in Uganda. Thirty six participants from the 40 Local governments invited attended the training in Colline Hotel Mukono on September 13-15, 2017.

A number of recommendations came out from the training:i. NPC needs to carry out more trainings to enhance capacity of local governments on POPDEV integration and data management ii. NPC should expand its support and equipping of local governments with data processing equipment for planning iii. There is need for NPC to decentralize the training of local governments on POPDEV integration and data management to cover all LGs in Uganda. iv. There is need for NPC to follow up on the trained local governments in order to provide technical support and assess them on their performance on integrating population issues in their plans and budgets. NPC participated in a number of National and International events in which various IEC materials with messages on Population, Development, and Reproductive Health & Gender were distributed during exhibitions. Activities participated in were:- International Youth Day commemorations in Bundibugyo district on August 12, 2017 • National Population Council spearheaded the commemoration of World Population Day on July 11, 2017. The national celebrations were hosted by Busia district under the theme: Strengthen Youth Competiveness for sustainable Development. The celebrations were held at Madibira Primary School playgrounds and H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, the President of the Republic of Uganda was the Guest of Honour. The Guest of Honour underscored the importance of skilling the youth, keeping girls in school to avoid teenage pregnancies and washing hands after visiting the lavatory. Policy issues that need to be addressed came up:-

• Teenage pregnancy that needs to be addressed immediately

- Youth unemployment

Monitoring teams assessed sixteen (16) higher and lower Local Governments (new districts Municipal Councils and town councils) to assess their readiness/capacity to integrate POPDEV variables into their Development frameworks (Budgets & Plans); the functionality of their databases, and the extent of their readiness to assess POPDEV variables. The objectives were; Assess the readiness of the Districts, Municipal Councils and Town councils to carryout POPDEV Integration in their development Frameworks: To identify functional gaps and areas the LGs need support; Introduce the new LGs to concepts/materials for POPDEV Integration. NPC Secretariat formed two teams to assess the selected LGs on POPDEV Integration in Kakumiro, Kagadi and Rubanda District, Kole TC, Kumi TC, Omoro District, Apac MC, Kitgum MC, Bugiri, Kamuli, Kapchorwa, Kisoro MC, Shema MC, Ibanda MC, Mityana MC and Mubende MC. Recommendations: · There is need for periodic assessment of local governments to determine their capacity on POPDEV integration which can be used as a basis for determining which LG needed capacity building and which official needed further training. • There is need to train both planners and statisticians where they exist so that they complement each other in case one of them is not available. · Constant backstopping and capacity building of Planning Units regarding POPDEV integration and data management should be carried out by National Population Council. · Engage with all stakeholders to make sure that all Planning Units in Municipalities employ statisticians who would assist planners in data management and POPDEV integration.

Data processing equipment (Central Processing Unit, Monitor and Ups) were procured for 10 Town Councils.

The 10 computer were delivered, engraved and distributed to the selected town councils (phase 10) of Kiboga TC, Kakira TC, Anaka TC, Kambuga TC, Rubona TC, Butalangu TC, Kiwoko TC, Buvuma TC, Sheema TC and Kabwohe-Itendero TC.

Planners and CDO's recommended that there is need to train more Town Councils on data management, and also plan for the new Municipal Councils as well as Town Councils which were created in the recent financial years.

The National Population Council organized a three day training to enhance the capacity of LG technical officers (District & Town Councils) in POPDEV integration, trained them on the harmonized District database and oriented them on the importance of data in planning. The Local Governments were also oriented on POPDEV Integration Assessment Indicators and policy options for harnessing the demographic dividend in Uganda. Thirty six participants from the 40 Local governments invited attended the training in Colline Hotel Mukono on September 13-15, 2017.

A number of recommendations came out from the training:-

i. NPC needs to carry out more trainings to enhance capacity of local governments on POPDEV integration and data management

ii. NPC should expand its support and equipping of local governments with data processing equipment for planning iii. There is need for NPC to decentralize the training of local governments on POPDEV integration and data management to cover all LGs in Uganda. iv. There is need for NPC to follow up on the trained local governments in order to provide technical support and assess them on their performance on integrating population issues in their plans and budgets.

NPC participated in a number of National and International events in which various IEC materials with messages on Population, Development, and Reproductive Health & Gender were distributed during exhibitions. Activities participated in were:-

 International Youth Day commemorations in Bundibugyo district on August 12, 2017 • National Population Council spearheaded the commemoration of World Population Day on July 11, 2017. The national celebrations were hosted by Busia district under the theme: Strengthen Youth Competiveness for sustainable Development. The celebrations were held at Madibira Primary School playgrounds and H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, the President of the Republic of Uganda was the Guest of Honour. The Guest of Honour underscored the importance of skilling the youth, keeping girls in school to avoid teenage pregnancies and washing hands after visiting the lavatory. Policy issues that need to be addressed came up:-• Teenage pregnancy that needs to be addressed immediately · Issues of personal hygiene · Youth unemployment Monitoring teams assessed sixteen (16) higher and lower Local Governments (new districts Municipal Councils and town councils) to assess their readiness/capacity to integrate POPDEV variables into their Development frameworks (Budgets & Plans); the functionality of their databases, and the extent of their readiness to assess POPDEV variables. The objectives were; Assess the readiness of the Districts, Municipal Councils and Town councils to carryout POPDEV Integration in their development Frameworks: To identify functional gaps and areas the LGs need support; Introduce the new LGs to concepts/materials for POPDEV Integration. NPC Secretariat formed two teams to assess the selected LGs on POPDEV Integration in Kakumiro, Kagadi and Rubanda District, Kole TC, Kumi TC, Omoro District, Apac MC, Kitgum MC, Bugiri, Kamuli, Kapchorwa, Kisoro MC, Shema MC, Ibanda MC, Mityana MC and Mubende MC. Recommendations: · There is need for periodic assessment of local governments to determine their capacity on POPDEV integration which can be used as a basis for determining which LG needed capacity building and

which official needed further training.
There is need to train both planners and statisticians where they exist so that they complement each other in case one of them is not available.
Constant backstopping and capacity building of Planning Units regarding POPDEV integration and data management should be carried out by National Population Council.
Engage with all stakeholders to make sure that all Planning Units in Municipalities employ statisticians who would assist planners in data management and POPDEV integration.
