Matters to note in budget execution

QUARTER 1: Highlights of Vote Performance

a) **Poor Planning in Procurements**: Entities are continuously failing to plan and cost procurements especially the big and complex projects and as a result they end up over or undervaluing procurements. This is caused by failure of Entities to clearly scope the proposed projects.

b) **Delays in Evaluation of bids especially for High Value Contracts**: There still exist challenges in the evaluation of procurements which stem from unethical conduct where evaluators disclose information unofficially which results into lengthy appeals that sometimes end up in courts of law. This unnecessarily lengthens the procurement process. The amendment of the PPDA Act should be able to solve some of these delays.

c) Weak Contract Management: Though big strides have been made in the post contracting stage, many procurements are mismanaged at the contract management stage where contract managers do not diligently carry out their duties and leave government projects at the mercy of the profit motivated contractors who end up doing substandard work.

d) **Reduced Budgetary Allocation:** During the budgeting process for FY 2017/18, the budgetary allocation to PPDA under GoU reduced from UGX 14.2 Billion to 13.4 billion which is a reduction of UGX 800 Million. This budget cut puts the Authority in a precarious situation since the Authority is already struggling with a number of unfunded or underfunded activities like counterpart funding for e-Government Procurement project and low audit coverage.

e) Limited funding for Audit coverage: Due to funding constraints, the Authority is not able to audit all the Entities under its jurisdiction and currently conducts audits on a sample and risk basis. The current audit coverage is only 35% and this position is continuously being worsened by the ever increasing number of both central and Local Government Entities.

f) **Delays in amendments to the Local Government PPDA Regulations**: The amendment process of the Local Governments (PPDA) Regulations was halted; pending the finalising of the review of the PDPA Act. It is now planned that the review of the PPDA Regulations and Local Government PPDA Regulations shall be reviewed at the same time for a harmonised position. This delay in the amendments of the Local Government PPDA Regulations may continue to hamper efficiency in the Local Government procurements.

Performance highlights for the Quarter

QUARTER 1: Highlights of Vote Performance

- 1. The Authority completed 20 procurement and disposal audits worth UGX 346 Billion. The Audit process for 34 procurement and disposal audits has been initiated and at different approval stages. The Authority also initiated 6 performance based contract audits.
- 2. The Authority completed 21 investigations into mismanagement of procurement and disposals which revealed failure by Entities to adhere to evaluation criteria.
- 3. PPDA conducted compliance checks in 5 Entities.
- 4. Rolled out the Government Procurement Portal to 8 Procuring and Disposing Entities.
- 5. 16 applications for Administrative Review were handled. Out of these, seven were upheld and nine applications were rejected.
- 6. Seven applications were filed at the PPDA Appeals Tribunal against the Authority. The tribunal set aside the decisions of the Authority in 3 cases, 3 cases were dismissed and an application for leave to file outside the statutory period was allowed.
- 7. 13 applications for accreditation for an alternative procurement and disposal system were handled and all the applications are still under consideration.
- 8. 58.4% of the central government PDEs have submitted their procurement plans whereas 50.3% of the local government Entities have submitted their procurement plans to date. 35.1 % of the expected monthly procurement reports from Central Government Entities have been submitted.
- 9. PPDA conducted follow up activities in 10 PDEs. A total of 156 recommendations were reviewed and of these 98 recommendations (63%) were found to have been implemented and 58 recommendations (37%) were either partially implemented or not implemented.
- 10. 70 suspension hearings were conducted and all the suspension hearings are still ongoing.
- 11. The average lead time taken to complete the procurement cycle with open domestic bidding method is 150 days.
- 12. PPDA conducted training under supply and demand driven arrangements targeting different stakeholders bringing the total number of participants trained during the quarter to 588 stakeholders.
- 13. The Authority conducted a survey to update the list of common user items and their prices which is used by Entities as an indicative market price guide for commonly procured items.
- 14. The Authority conducted a study to identify the barriers to the participation of women enterprises in public procurement. the study findings were validated by stakeholders. The study findings will be disseminated in Q2.
