#### Matters to note in budget execution

The quarter budget performance was 79%.

This was mainly due the lengthy process for the procurement of the Representation Vehicle which was still on going at closure of the Quarter.

The major Challenge to the budget execution is the short fall on critical items like Allowances, Medical expenses, Fuel and Oils, Staff Salaries, and Rent.

In this Regard,the Mission in a letter Ref:C.4 dated September 4 requested for supplementary funding for critical items amounting to 1,863,719,908.

Foreign Exchange loss and loss on poundage is another constraint. For instance in the FY 2016/17 the mission lost USD 32,228.27 due to exchange loss on Capital Development.
