Matters to note in budget execution

- Delay in receiving the release hence the delay in implementation of planned activities.
- Insufficient funds received hence unable to implement all planned activities, the Mission's Q1 Approved budget was Ugx 955,175,624 but unfortunately the cash limit given was Ugx 827,508,058 hence causing a short fall of Ugx 127,667,566 on the missions budget.
- The mission's funds were yet again affected by the double foreign exchange rate fluctuations in International money market, that is from Uganda shillings to US Dollars (USD) and there after US Dollars to Australian Dollars (AUD) and this did not only affect the mission funds but also the home based staff whose foreign service allowances are whereas they are budgeted in USD but payment is in AUD.
- Increasing cost of production that is attributed the increase in Consumer Price Index in Australia as such shortfalls have increasingly been recognized on a number of budget lines such as Salaries, Telephone, Water, Electricity, and Medical expenses. As such we make a special appeal to expedite the process of upgrading the mission to category A.
