There were no major / significant variances in budget execution under Progamme 18 (Regional Integration). The main variances in budget execution were registered under Programme 49 (Administration, Policy and Planning). These variances were as a result of unspent balances. These included among others;

(i) UGX 471.3 million under the item of Pension (212102): This was as a result of over release of funds during Q2

(ii) UGX 50.6 million under the item of Gratuity (213004): This was a s a result of the time of r payments not yet being due. the Payments were to be due in Q3.

(iii) UGX 474.5 million under Sub-programme 1005: This was a s a result of the procurement process for various items under Capital purchases still being conducted.

(iv) The other unspent balances were as a result of delays by various users to submit the required paper work to enable payments to be effected.

A supplementary funding will be sought to address this problem
