QUARTER 1: Highlights of Vote Performance

1.Adoption of the 2019 G77/CHINA Ministerial Declaration which officially endorsed Uganda as the host of the Third South Summit in April 2020. The Summit will offer a great opportunity to Uganda to market its tourism, trade and investment potentials. Considering that Third South Summit is the first to be held after the adoption of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, it will adopt the Kampala political declaration and plan of action containing targeted actions to accelerate the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development as well as strengthening South-South Cooperation.

2.Facilitated a meeting between the Minister of Health of Uganda Hon. Ruth Aceng and Assistant Secretary for Health of the United States Mr. Brett P. Giroir in September on the sidelines of the 74th UNGA where Mr. Giroir communicated that his government is willing to assist Uganda in the fight against sickle cell disease. Asked the Ministry of Health to share their roadmap for assistance.

3.The UN Climate Action Summit resulted into the adoption of key initiative action areas with high potential to curb greenhouse gas emissions and increase global action on climate adaptation and resilience. These comprise: climate finance and carbon pricing; energy transition; industry transition; nature-based solutions; infrastructure, cities and local action; adaptation and resilience; mitigation strategy; youth engagement and public mobilization; and social and political drivers. These initiative action areas are important to Uganda's national efforts in addressing the adverse impacts of climate change prioritizing nature-based solutions as the main strategy for both adaptation and mitigation.

4.Participated in the intergovernmental negotiations that adopted the Political Declaration on Universal Health Coverage that is aimed at mobilizing political attention and enhance health investments in a harmonized manner as a milestone in achieving 2030 Agenda.

5.A total of 179 visas issued, out of which 118 are multiple; 38 singles; 23 EATV generating USD 12,800 that is submitted to the Consolidated Fund.

6.Facilitated and organized a successful high-level week of the 74th Session of the UN that was attended by Rt.Hon. Prime Minister Ruhakana Rugunda, 4 Ministers, 6 Members of Parliament and over 50 Ugandan Delegates.

7.Collected NTR of USD 432,841 from Uganda Hose and the Official Residence that is submitted to the Consolidated Fund.
