-Insecurity in some countries of accreditation is till a big challenge as it impedes on the embassy's ability to provide consular services.

-The government of Iran has occasionally switched off Internet in a bid to cub protests and this has affected our communication with Ugandans in the countries of accreditation to whom the embassy is supposed to offer consular services.

-Information coming from the Government of Iran has been scanty during Q2 due to the recent tensions and insecurity between America and Iran.
