Performance highlights for the Quarter

The following are among the key highlights during the reporting period:

- 1. NARO has continued to generate relevant technological products, services and innovations for agro-industry and ensuring food and nutrition security. In-spite of COVID-19 pandemic effects, NARO in the end of the third quarter of FY 2019/20, registered significant achievements in the different targeted Key Performance Indicators (KPIs). A total of 20 varieties were submitted for release, 41 technologies generated, 32 innovation platforms supported and 40 innovations delivered to uptake pathways.
- 2. NARO has also constituted a Vaccinology Research programme at NaLIRRI under which all vaccine research and development is being undertaken. NARO is in advanced stages of obtaining Title of the 10 square miles of land allocated for livestock research at Maruzi.
- 3. Land with a title has been secured and engineering designs approved for establishment of proposed satellite station for fisheries research on Lake Albert,
- 4. By the end of the quarter, Lakes Kyoga, Kwania and Kibimba dam which were previously Kariba weed hotspots are now over 90% clear of the weed due to the deployment of an integrated management approach using bio-agents (Cyrtobagous salviniea weevils) and some mechanical removal,
- 5. By the end of the quarter, NARO technologies, information and management practices (TIMPs) were showcased to at least 10,000 stakeholders during the National Agricultural Show in Jinja; 10,000 stakeholders at the World Food Day 2019 at Bulindi ZARDI, and to 15,000 stakeholders in five (5) Farm Clinics held at Kituza, Bulindi ZARDI, Ngetta ZARDI, Kamenyamigo and Bulegeni; and Harvest Money Expo,
