#### **QUARTER 3: Highlights of Vote Performance**

For Quarter (Q3) FY 2019/20, the Embassy registered the following key achievements:

- 1. On 25th February 2020 The Head of Mission Presented Letters of Credence to the President of Iceland Guoni Th. Johannesson, and held meetings with the various Government Officials at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, on ways and means of how to promote trade, investment, tourism and bilateral relations between Iceland and Uganda.
- 2. Embassy officials in conjunction with the Swedish East Africa Chamber of Commerce (SWEACC) coordinated and participated in an East African Business & Investment Forum held in Dar es Salaam from 12th 13th March 2020, under the theme "GREEN SOLUTIONS IN CITIES", an area of great importance worldwide including in the East African countries with a fast growing urbanization that requires efficient solutions to cover for the implications in Health, Security and Environment.
- 3. The Mission also coordinated the signing of a cooperation agreement between Swedish East Africa Chamber of Commerce (SWEACC) and the Uganda National Chamber of Commerce and Industry (UNCCI) in March, 2020.
- 4. Arranged a visit of the Budget Committee of Parliament of Uganda led by their Chairperson Hon. Amos Lugoloobi, to undertake a benchmarking visit to Denmark which provided a forum for sharing of knowledge, skills and experiences in execution of the New African Policy that is being implemented by the NORDIC Countries as well the Baltic States. The Team interacted with relevant Nordic Government Officials, Danish Private Sectors Officials, Political Leaders of the Gentofte Commune and various Company Executives with a view to promote mutual cooperation in various areas of Investment, Tourism and trade.
- 5. The Mission continues to engage the leadership of the Investment Fund for Developing Countries (IFU) for increased cooperation. IFU provides risk capital and advice to companies wanting to do business in Africa, Asia, Latin America and parts of Europe. Currently IFU is already doing business in Uganda in the Agriculture Sector through the Agricultural Business Initiative (ABI), Northern Uganda Resilience Initiative (NURI) and Banking with 10% shares in DFCU.
- 6. Engaged the Confederation of Danish Industry (DI) for support in terms of collaborations, attachments and mentoring of Uganda Manufacturers. DI is Denmark's largest, most representative and most influential business and employers' organisation, covering manufacturing as well as service industries across sectors such as transport, energy, IT, health, trade and professional services.
- 7. Held discussions with INOAQUA-TILAPIA GENETICS NORWAY which expressed interest to investment in Aquaculture Industry. The company has been encouraged to visit Uganda and present her interest to the relevant institutions in Uganda.
- 8. Engaged the Mayor of Gentofte Municipality, a suburb to the Capital Copenhagen, with a view to explore possibilities of twinning (partnering) with a Ugandan city.
- 9. The Mission has been meeting major Tour operators in the Nordics region namely, Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden who are involved in promoting out bound tourists to Africa. (On this backdrop, the Embassy has come up with a concept Paper to Ministry of tourism on Promoting Uganda in the NORDICS at Minimal Cost).
- 10. The Head of Mission participated in the first ever EU Uganda Investment Summit hosted by H.E Yoweri Museveni from March 9-10, 2020. In attendance were about 700 European Companies. The Focus was on improving infrastructure such as railways, electricity, building roads, Agroprocessing and mineral development. Over 100 firms committed to investing in Agro-processing, manufacturing and services industries, which would create 32,524 jobs with an investment of Euros 1.5 Billion and emphasis placed on empowerment of women in businesses. The Mission will continue to follow up with the Nordic countries which are part of the EU to ensure that these proposed investments are implemented.
- 11. Held formal meetings with the Ugandan Community leaving and working in Denmark and shared information on how the community could contribute to the national development of Uganda.
- 12. Repatriated one (01) Ugandan national who succumbed to cancer in Oslo, Norway.
- 13. Sixteen (16) Ugandans who had lost their passports were facilitated with Certificates of Identity.
- 14. Recommended and forwarded Twenty-Seven (27) passport applications to Kampala for issuance
- 15. Certified/verified one (01) driving permit and the marital status of one Ugandan.
- 16. Certified Passports for Seven (07) Ugandans.
- 17. Handled Deportation for one (01) Ugandan.
- 18. Handled Preparatory processes for the procurement and deployment of consultancy services that will supervise renovations of both the Chancery and Official Residence.
