QUARTER 4: Highlights of Vote Performance

- 1. The Judiciary disposed of a total of 131,385 cases compared to 173,200 in FY 2018/19. The total number of cases disposed of in the reporting period reduced by 24%. Hearing of cases was disrupted due to the effects of COVID 19 pandemic as the Judiciary reduced the operations of Courts.
- 2. A shortfall in the Development Budget of UGX 2.683 bn for the construction of the Supreme Court and Court of Appeals building affected the planned construction of the substructure.
- 3. There was no budget to purchase motor vehicles for the newly recruited Judges and Justices despite the lifting of the ban to purchase motor vehicles by Cabinet.
- 4. Various planned activities were not carried out due to the due the effects of COVID 19. They include; training of the Registry of Planning and Development Staff in Planning, budgeting & M&E; Piloting of Performance Enhancement Tool; Review of the Gender Policy and Strategy; Popularization of the Anti-Sexual Harassment Policy; Review and development of the Strategic Plan.
- 5. Various procurement processes were halted following a freeze by the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority due to COVID 19 like renovation of Courts.
- 6. Since there were no approvals from the Medical Board during 4th quarter, this caused unspent balances on the medical expenditure.
- 7. Travel restrictions due to COVID 19 caused unspent balances on travel abroad.
