Performance highlights for the Quarter

The overall performance during the first quarter of FY 2020/21 stands at 84.7% of the released funds compared to 83.4% performance recorded in the same quarter of FY 2019/20.

The Parliamentary Commission received UGX 22.884Bn for wage of which UGX.22.647Bn was spent which translates into 99.7% wage performance; UGX 148.865Bn was released for non-wage (including Government Contribution to East African Community), of which 85.4% was utilized and UGX 9.430Bn, under the Development budget was released in the first quarter of FY 2020/21 and only 38% was utilized. As communicated the Q1 cashlimit circular, a number of budget lines and subventions were suppressed in order to mitigate the covid-19 pressures. Consequently, a number of planned activities were not undertaken and others deferred. Calling for readjustment of workplans for subsequent quarters

In light of the above, below are some of the challenges the Parliamentary Commission experienced during and after the first quarter, of the FY 2020/21 which consequently affect full implementation of the planned activities.

- A shift of plenary sittings from the main Chambers to the Conference hall and eventually to the erected tent on ground floor of the car park to in order to observe the social distance and other covid-19 SoPS.
- The need to provide for spacious Committee rooms to enable committees continues to execute their mandate at the same time observing the SoPs.
- Inadequate funding under subventions to meet the Annual government contribution to the East African Legislative Assembly.
- The need to provide infrastructure to implement a hybrid system of deliberation in Parliament in which some Members are allowed to participate through a virtual system while others are physically present here
- Low turn-up of Members to conduct Parliament business due to the on-going campaigns for the general elections.
- Low progress on the construction of the new chamber because of the need to keep low workforce and inability to secure supplies and equipment due to covid-19 especially those from outside Uganda.

Inspite of the above challenges, the Parliamentary Commission continues to institute various precautionary and safety measures and also improve on the facilities that are available, to enable Parliament to perform and operate amidst the covid-19 situation.
