i. Mitigation of Gender-Based Violence: A Training of Trainers workshop on Gender-Based Violence targeting 60 participants was conducted. The exercise equipped a core team of DVA staff with the necessary knowledge on key gender-based violence concepts. In addition, sensitization seminars targeting 360 people was conducted in 16 districts to equip military veterans and their families with key information on the prevention, mitigation and referrals for survivors of Gender-Based Violence.

ii.
