Matters to note in budget execution

Most of the activities were performed as planned despite some challenges particularly related to Covid 19. The challenges in budget execution included over consumption of supplies in most departments and thereby leading to stock outs of very vital items like gloves, IV fluids, masks and syringes among others. Staff working in most wards and clinics were demanding for allowances like the others working in the Covid Treatment Unit, They claim to be overworked during this period and being at risk of getting Covid 19 from the patients. The budget for the MCH complex building is still less by 1.35 bn. There is therefore need for additional funding for this project in the next Financial Year 2021-2022. The number of Health workers is still inadequate in the Hospital. There is need for more wage to enable us recruit more Health workers and for improvement of staffing norms generally going by the current workload in the Hospital.

Performance highlights for the Quarter

Most of the Covid 19 patients in the Treatment Unit were treated and discharged, we only lost 3 patients to Covid 19. The Hospital received 10 ICU complete beds and an assortment of other medical equipment to be used in the Covid Unit. The Accident and Emergency Unit of the Hospital is performing very well and the Community is generally happy about this service. The Accident and Emergency department is partially financed by the Government of Korea through the KOFIH project. The MCH complex building is nearing completion. This is a 400 bed complex with Theaters and several clinics as well as offices. It has been under construction for the past 7 Financial Years and its currently at 94% completion . We resumed the construction of the 40 Unit Senior Staff Hostel after a break of 1 year due to inadequate funding. This contract is phased in such a way that we only construct when funds are available. This was done this way to avoid litigation.
