QUARTER 2: Highlights of Vote Performance

- 1) The planned Development activities/projects are ongoing but the progress has been affected by the convid-19 pandemic and its resultant effects. In addition, the projects are being implemented in a phased manner in line with the funds flow given the budget limitations.
- 2) The 56 Unit staff housing project construction plan was imitated, consultant to develop architectural drawings and BOQs done, Bids already produced and evaluation done and the bidding process is being finalized for the eventual award of the contract for actual works to commence.
- 3) Perimeter wall construction moving on. The lower gate was completed and works are ongoing to complete the main gate since the entire hospital could not be left without access and to allow for screening, regulating and controlling traffic flow in view of the Covid -19 new up surges.
- 4) Whereas the hospital continues to acquire more sophisticated equipment, power and utility requirements of these machines for effective operations are soaringly high given the YAKA system. The budgets are restrictive and may lead to some domestic arrears. There are Power outages resulting into high fuel consumption to run backup generators; The hospital is challenged by high equipment repair costs (maintenance of Oxygen plant and CT Scan machines) as well as Internet connectivity.
- 5) The entity continues to allocate resources to areas critical for service delivery including medicines and supplies, utilities (Water and Power), Diagnostics supplies and sundries for improved services provision. Constraints however exists due to high patient load arising from referrals and special needs from the specialised clinics whose commodities are not in the NMS essential medicines and health supplies list.
- 6) The hospital is at the infancy stage of establishing a Regional Medical Equipment Maintenance Workshop to address associated frequent equipment break downs due to maintenance and user training challenges leading to high repair costs. Functionalization of the workshop will address these challenges.

Performance highlights for the Quarter

In the current quarter, the hospital will focus on:

- 1) Implementation of guidelines for management of Covid-19 pandemic following the new community up surges. Emphasis will be laid on interventions promoting hand hygiene and provision of sanitizing facilities, Patient screening, Community surveillance; mass engagement with the media for community sensitization, case tracing treatment and hpme care support for asymptomatic cases, screening and sample collection. Management continues to support health worker teams for proper management of Covid-19 Virus through trainings, provision of utilities and supplies including Personal protective wear, feeding and transportation.
- 2) Management efforts will be geared towards strengthening support supervision using standard check lists both internally and in the region for improved service delivery.
- 3) Management will continues to intensify quality improvement initiatives focusing on maternal, neonatal and public health related interventions for improved service delivery. Focus will also include provision of specialised services for all referred cases (Diagnostic, medical and Surgeries), Clinical support services, procurement of medical commodities; enforce community engagements with the media; performance management and internal supervision; Quality improvement initiatives (5S-CQI-TQM), Technical support supervision to lower facilities in the region; building & strengthening partnerships and collaborations for quality and improved service delivery.
- 4) Fast track the 56 Unit storied multi-year staff house construction project as planned; Close supervision of ongoing projects and works to ensure quality and value for money (Lab construction, Finishing of works at the gate and installation of the CCTV cameras).
- 5) Management has engaged with partners, Ministry of Health and Ministry of Finance where upon works for construction of the Covid Isolation Units are ongoing.
- 6) Under Human resources, emphasis will be on Staff performance and duty attendance; duty facilitation; staff performance reviews and payments of salaries, pensions and gratuity.
- 7) Continue with staff and student/Interns capacity building initiatives, teaching, mentor ships and research.
