QUARTER 3: Highlights of Vote Performance

Performance high lights for the Quarter:

- 1) Management started the process of data digitalization through computer Installations, staff computer training and internet connectivity and protection of installations for safety. This will improve on data capture, tracking and reporting.
- 2) The construction of the 32 out of the 56 Unit staff housing project initiated, Consultant procured, architectural drawings and BOQs developed. Bids documents, bidding process and bid evaluation done; However, the evaluation report was referred back by the contracts committee for some amendments for re submission to the contracts committee for approval. The report has been re-submitted for clearance by the contracts committee for the eventual award, contract signing. The actual works are expected to commence by May on Quarter Four.
- 3) Perimeter wall construction 95% finished with the lower gate completed and works are ongoing in the main gate (Roofing and wall works, Fixing of lights and plumbing) traffic flow controlled in view of the Covid -19 new up surges.
- 4) Power and utility requirements for effective operations are high yet the budgets are restrictive and may lead to some domestic arrears. There are Power outages causing high fuel use for backup generators; the hospital is challenged by high equipment repair costs (including maintenance of the Oxygen plant and CT Scan machines).
- 5) The entity continues to allocate resources to areas critical for service delivery including medicines and supplies, utilities (Water and Power), Diagnostics supplies and sundries for improved services provision. Constraints however exists due to high patient load arising from referrals and special needs from the specialised clinics whose commodities are not in the NMS essential medicines and health supplies list.
- 6) The Regional Medical Equipment Maintenance Workshop hospital is at the infancy stage to address the frequent equipment break downs. Management puts this among the planning priorities.

In the current quarter, the hospital will focus on:

- 1. Management will continue intensifying quality improvement initiatives focusing on maternal, neonatal and public health related interventions for improved service delivery with focus especially on specialised service provision for all referred cases (Diagnostic, medical and Surgeries). This will be enforced by:
- 1) Data digitalization and improvement in Monitoring and evaluation
- 2) Strengthening Clinical support services, availability of medical commodities;
- 3) Media and community engagements;
- 4) performance management and internal supervision;
- 5) Quality improvement initiatives (5S-CQI-TQM),
- 6) Building & strengthening partnerships/collaborations for quality and improved service delivery.
- 2. Implementation of Covid-19 pandemic guidelines following the new up surges with emphasis on:
- 1) Promoting the Covid 19 immunization campaign and observance of the Standard operating procedures (Hand hygiene and sanitizing; social distancing Etc)
- 2) Community surveillance and engagement with the media for continued community sensitization.
- 3) Support of the Health worker teams for proper management of Covid-19 through training, provision of utilities/supplies, personal protective wear and feeding case management teams.
- 3. Management efforts will be geared towards strengthening support supervision with standard check lists both internally and in the region for improved service delivery. Emphasis will be laid on Technical support supervision to lower facilities to de-congest the hospital, reduce unnecessary referrals and help functionalise the lower facilities.
- 4. Fast track progress for the 32 out of the 56 staff house construction project; Close supervision of ongoing projects and works to ensure quality and value for money (Lab construction, Renovation of the maternity ward and finishing works at the main gate; and the ongoing construction of the Covid-19 Isolation.
- 5. Under Human resources for health, emphasis will be on Staff performance and duty attendance; duty facilitation; staff performance reviews, payments of salaries, pensions and gratuity. Continue with staff and student/Interns capacity building initiatives, teaching, mentor ships and research.
