Performance highlights for the Quarter

Outputs realized for participating at the 14th UN Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice held in Kyoto, Japan from 7th-12th March 2021 under the theme: Advancing crime prevention, criminal justice and the rule of law towards the achievement of the 2030 Agenda.

- (1) Uganda's country statement was highlighted at the Conference on 8th March 2021 upon coordination by the Mission with UNODC. It was delivered by Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu, who highlighted efforts by the Government of Uganda in the advancement of rule of law and good governance.
- (2) Bilateral relationship between Uganda and Japan was further strengthened and Uganda-Japan cooperation was established in relation to Uganda's Justice, Law and Order Sector (JLOS) through a bilateral meeting coordinated by the Mission between the Head of Delegation and Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs- Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu and Minister of Justice of Japan- Hon. Kamikawa Yoko on 7th March 2021
- (3) Relationship between Uganda and UNODC was strengthened and cooperation was established in relation to Uganda's Justice, Law and Order Sector (JLOS). Uganda's multilateral initiatives in the area of crime prevention, justice and the rule of law were also further strengthened through the bilateral meeting coordinated by the Mission between the Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu and the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC)- Madam Ghada Fathi Waly on 9th March 2021
- (4) Cooperation between Uganda and Japan in Hokkaido Region established and is expected to strengthen the promotion of Uganda's interests in Japan particularly in the areas of investment and tourism as a result of the bilateral meeting coordinated by the Mission between the Honorary Consul-Designate of Uganda to Hokkaido Region- Ambassador Kameda Kazuaki and Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu in his capacity as Head of NRM 2021-2026 Manifesto Implementation Committee
- (5) Cooperation between Uganda and Japan and promotion of Uganda's interests in the Kinki Region (southern part of Japan) in the areas of investment and tourism strengthened as a result of the bilateral meeting coordinated by the Mission between the Honorary Consul of Uganda to Kinki Region- Mr. Saraya Yusuke and Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu in his capacity as Head of NRM 2021-2026 Manifesto Implementation Committee
- (6) Uganda's representation in an international Congress on crime prevention and criminal justice was highlighted through an interview organized by the Mission for the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs- Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu (MP), facilitated by the UN Information Service Vienna.
- (7) Provided protocol services to a high-level Ugandan delegation, led by Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu.
- (8) Ugandan products like coffee, waragi, gorilla, tourism and brochures promoting Uganda's tourism and investment potential given out as gifts during bilateral meetings and side events at the 14th UN Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice.

Uganda's role as a major player in peace and security initiatives in the Great Lakes Region articulated when the Mission participated in the Online Meet-up Forum for the Primary Course of the Global Peacebuilders Program.

Uganda's position regarding participation at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games communicated to Japanese Parliamentarians in a meeting held with them on 24th March 2021.

Public Diplomacy promoted and bilateral relations strengthened as the Mission participated in the New Year Greetings of the Emperor of Japan.

Uganda's image enhanced when the Mission facilitated the refurbishment of the Mission's Chancery from 29th January to 9th February 2021.

Facilitated and coordinated Uganda's participation at the XXXII Olympiad while ensuring subsidized training costs, adequate and conducive training facilities, further collaboration with the principalities in promotion of Uganda in various fields of development and encouraging international exchanges during the visit to Izumisano City Pre-Games Training Base in March 2021.

Collaboration between the Mission and Uganda Investment Authority (UIA) on matters of investment promotion in Japan enhanced when the Mission organized and participated in an online capacity building program delivered by UIA.

Mobilized Uganda Diaspora Japan (UDJ) in partnership with Fukuoka-Uganda Friendship Association (FUUFA) to continue the bore hole construction project in Uganda. The 19th well was completed in Namayumba in March 2021.

Coordinated the recovery of US\$ 4,100 from fraudulent Japanese registered car dealer Car Hub Japan being payment for the purchase of used motor vehicles by two Ugandans (Evans Katwebaze of Standard Char-tered Bank Uganda worth US\$ 2,000 and Freda Muhumuza of Namuwongo worth US\$ 2,100) by threatening legal action in writing, physically visiting the Offices of Car Hub Japan in Tokyo and engaging the company owners into a negotiated settlement. The Mission continues to follow up on many such fraud cases involving dubious car dealers fleecing many unsuspecting Ugandans in online used vehicle transactions.

Information on available scholarship opportunities from the Government of Japan was harnessed, experiences on best practices adopted by various countries in the fields discussed were shared, collaboration with MEXT enhanced when the Mission actively participated in an online workshop on Education, Sports and Culture organized by MEXT for Embassies in Tokyo.

Collaboration with a Japanese University initiated when the Mission held a meeting with representatives of Ritsumeikan APU to discuss the possibilities of collaboration, student exchange programs, and scholarships for Ugandan students.

Issued 5 visas which generated Non-Tax Revenue amounting to UGX 2,162,180 together with 2 emergency travel documents.

Satisfactorily handled 33 consular services in Japan (20) and South Korea (13); which included the issuance of certification for passport renewal (11), new passport, eligibility to marry, registration of marriage, driving license, change of address, and emergency travel documents.

Uganda's role as a major player in peace and security initiatives in the Great Lakes Region articulated when the Mission participated in the Online Meet-up Forum for the Primary Course of the Global Peacebuilders Program organized for 10 Japanese program associates and 10 international program associates (including a Ugandan scholar) over a five-week course work period in Hiroshima and Tokyo. The Ugandan scholar, who will be deployed to a oneyear overseas assignment as UN volunteer, articulated Uganda's efforts in the field of peace-building and postconflict restructuring both at national and regional levels as part of his research topics. Relationship between Uganda and UNODC was strengthened and cooperation was established in relation to Uganda's Justice, Law and Order Sector (JLOS). Uganda's multilateral initiatives in the area of crime prevention, justice and the rule of law were also further strengthened through the bilateral meeting coordinated by the Mission between the Head of Delegation and Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs- Hon, Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu and Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC)- Madam Ghada Fathi Waly on 9th March 2021 on the sidelines of the 14th UN Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice. Hon. Kamuntu requested the Government of Japan to support initiatives in Uganda's Justice, Law and Order Sector (JLOS). Uganda's country statement was highlighted at the 14th UN Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice on 8th March 2021 upon coordination by the Mission with UNODC. It was delivered by the Head of Delegation and Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs-Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu, who highlighted efforts by the Government of Uganda in the advancement of rule of law and good governance. In particular, the Hon. Minister shared Uganda's experience on successfully holding General Elections in January 2021 during COVID-19 pandemic while observing strict Standard Operating Procedures as guided by the World Health Organization

in a bid to curb the spread of the Corona

virus.

Public Diplomacy promoted and bilateral relations strengthened as the Mission participated in the New Year Greetings of the Emperor of Japan. This is one of the most important events of the Imperial Household calendar with wide coverage in both print and electronic media in Japan.

Uganda's representation in an international Congress on crime prevention and criminal justice was highlighted through an interview organized by the Mission for the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs-Hon. Prof. Ephraim Kamuntu (MP), facilitated by the UN Information Service Vienna. Among the questions asked from the Hon. Minister was regarding his experience in attending a conference in hybrid format (combination of in-person and online participants), a first of its kind. In his interview, Hon. Kamuntu credited the organizers for the Congress' hybrid format, which made it possible even for those in normal times who could not have attended.

Uganda's image enhanced when the Mission facilitated the refurbishment of the Mission's Chancery from 29th January to 9th February 2021. Among the changes made were the installation of a dedicated space for photo opportunities which showcases the flags of Uganda, EAC and Japan; Uganda's Coat of Arms; and the Embassy Name. The Embassy logo were also placed at strategic locations outdoors. The Mission also requested the property owner to install red carpets in the Chancery boardroom, hallways and the Office of the Head of Mission so visitors can bring their shoes inside without the need of using slippers (as per the Japanese custom). Another outdoor flagpole was also set up to raise the EAC flag side by side with the Ugandan flag.

In October 2020, published the National Day supplement in two major Japanese

daily newspapers which was supported by the Japanese business community. The Mission used this opportunity to promote Uganda's image, its tourism and investment potential as well as communicating to the world that Uganda's international borders had been opened after over six months of restricted international travel and that the Pearl of Africa was ready to resume normal business previously halted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ugandan products like coffee, waragi, gorilla, tourism and brochures promoting Uganda's tourism and investment potential given out as gifts during bilateral meetings and side events at the 14th UN Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice. In October 2020, the Embassy organized and participated in two online capacity building programs delivered by: Uganda Tourism Board Marketing and Product Development Executives aimed at enhancing the Mission's capacity to promote Uganda as Africa's destination of choice; and National Planning Authority regarding preparation of the Mission's Strategic Plan for 2021/22-2024/25 in line with NDP III.

Collaboration between the Mission and Uganda Investment Authority (UIA) on matters of investment promotion in Japan enhanced when the Mission organized and participated in an online capacity building program delivered by UIA. Coordinated, in conjunction with UNIDO **Investment and Technology Promotion** Office in Tokyo, an online business matching event on the occasion of Africa Industrialization Day 2020 from 20 November 2020 to 4 December 2020 where 16 Ugandan companies and Uganda National Chamber of Commerce and Industry (UNCCI) were involved in discussions directly with over 100 Japanese and African companies for partnerships in investment and technology transfer in Africa particularly in the sectors of construction, real estate, rental and leasing; transport and postal services; information and communications; electricity, gas, heat and water supply; agriculture and forestry. Notable companies from Uganda included: Meat Packers Ltd, Moroto Ateker Cement, Ayago Global Foods Ltd,
