V5: VOTE CHALLENGES FOR 2020/21 AND ADDITIONAL FUNDING REQUESTS

Vote Challenges for FY 2020/21

The demand for statistical information is growing to inform the National Development Plan, the Regional development frameworks and the Sustainable Development Goals at International level. Also, the private and public sectors, and the general public are demanding for statistical data and information. This requires a systematic increase in human, financial and other resources to meet the increasing demand. The increasing demand for small area statistics also requires the Bureau to increase the sample size and collect more data amidst scarce resources. This resulted into the postponement of the conduct of the Uganda Census of Agriculture and Aquaculture (UCAA), and Uganda Business Inquiry (UBI). Other challenges include: Increasing non-response especially in urban areas. Creation of new geographical administrative area units, Increasing demand for small area statistics, Increasing unit cost for data production especially with the adoption of Computer Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI). Border conflicts affecting the timely production of statistics. Refusal by some farmers to measure their land area in the Annual Agricultural Survey attributing it to land grabbing, Absence of data on the demarcations of the new urban administrative areas which affects the development of the indicative planning figures,
