V2: Past Vote Performance and Medium Term Plans

Performance for Previous Year FY 2018/19

- I. Successfully Campaigned for the election of Judge Margaret Tibulya to the United Nations Dispute Tribunal.
- II. Succeeded in halting the decision to transfer the Regional Service Center Entebbe to Nairobi preventing a loss of over 274 jobs of Ugandans. III. Co-facilitated the intergovernmental negotiations that adopted an action -oriented outcome of the 2nd High-Level United Nations Conference on South- South Cooperation, which sets out the framework for cooperation with other countries ie mobilizing resources, attracting Foreign Direct Investment, transfer of technology etc
- IV. Mobilized financial support for Uganda Government officials from Headquarters to participate in conferences/meetings ie the Second High-Level United Nations Conference on South-South Cooperation and African regional midterm review of the Vienna programme of action for the landlocked developing countries.
- V. Participated in the intergovernmental negotiations of the 63rd Session of the Commission on the Status of women (CSW63) that adopted an outcome document emphasizing women's and girls' access to social protection. Over 50 Ugandans who participated in the Session, benefited from the experiences shared by other delegations on Child protection, Empowerment of women, persons in vulnerable situations.
- VI. Participated in the Intergovernmental Conference on Migration in Marrakech that adopted the Global Compact for safe, orderly and regular migration, the first ever of its kind aimed at fostering greater international cooperation to better address the complex situation of global migration.

Performance as of BFP FY 2019/20 (Performance as of BFP)

- I. Adoption of the 2019 G77/CHINA Ministerial Declaration which officially endorsed Uganda to host the Third South Summit in April 2020. Over 1,500 delegates from 134 Countries are expected to attend.
- II. Adoption of the resolution on New Partnership for Africa's Development: progress in implementation and international support". The resolution is important to Uganda as it stresses the need for continued financial and technical support
- III. Facilitated a meeting between the Minister of Health of Uganda Hon. Ruth Aceng and Assistant Secretary for Health of the United States Mr. Brett P. Giroir in September on the sidelines of the 74th UNGA where Mr. Giroir communicated that his government is willing to assist Uganda in the fight against sickle cell disease. Asked the Ministry of Health to share their roadmap for assistance.
- IV. Facilitated and organized a successful high-level week of the 74th Session of the UN that was attended by Rt.Hon. Prime Minister Ruhakana Rugunda, 4 Ministers, 6 Members of Parliament and over 50 Ugandan Delegates.
- V. Collected NTR of USD 432,841 from Uganda House and the Official Residence that is submitted to the Consolidated Fund.
