The COVID-19 pandemic disruptions presented the main challenge as the University was partially closed for several months, considerably affecting physical teaching, learning and research activities, and NTR collection.

The university IT infrastructure has a low capacity to support the increased demands for online teaching and learning, research, and other support services. This has affected the full operationalisation of MUELE and other online learning platforms.

The 2020 fire outbreak destroyed the Main Administration Building which caused loss of records. The destruction of the building also affected the availability of physical space for teaching and learning as part of the Central Teaching Facility one – primarily teaching space has been converted into offices for management.

Staffing levels in several units across the University fall below 50%, explaining the continued reliance on short-term contracts and part-time staff to support certain functions alongside costly extra load for existing staff.

Land encroachment remains one of the significant challenges to the University's assets. The University owns land in various prime areas, but this land has remained undeveloped due to financial constraints, which predisposes the land to encroachment and land grabbing. The University will prioritise partnerships under Mak Holdings to develop the land alongside surveillance and increased land protection efforts.

Underfunding affects the University's ability to deliver its mandate, especially concerning capital development, digitisation, and student support services. The Government's decision to implement a 40% reduction of the non-wage recurrent and development budgets in FY2021/2022 and the freezing of expenditure on workshops, seminars and travel abroad exacerbates this challenge. These activities are critical to the University as they concern the movement of external examiners, faculty members undergoing training, collaborative research and student vivas. The University will continue to engage the Government on the budget cuts and expenditure freezes.

COVID-19 increased the Country's healthcare services' pressure and exposed the gaps in the University's staff medical insurance scheme. Several university staff members suffered critical illness due to COVID-19, especially in the second wave, and some unfortunately succumbed to the Pandemic. However, the medical insurer could not cover the high cost of ICU hospitalisation for staff that required intensive care services. In addition, some of the staff who suffered from COVID-19 experienced challenges accessing hospital services at the peak of the second wave. The University had accumulated Domestic Arrears amounting to UGX 22.200 Bn by the end of Quarter one of FY2021/2022. The outstanding payments for the staff In-House Retirement Benefits Scheme (IHRBS) amounting to UGX 15.500 Bn constate the most significant percentage of the arrears. However, the Ministry of Finance took over this obligation has continued to settle the payments in a phased manner, paying a total of UGX 9.500 Bn since FY2020/2021. Other arrears to UGX 6.7Bn result from Court awards and unpaid bills for goods and services from previous financial years.

The University also has contingent liabilities, including UGX 2.2 Bn, due to external lawyers from previous cases in which they represented the University. Other matters are still before the Courts.

Performance highlights for the Quarter

The University's approved budget for FY2021/2022 is UGX 365.068 Bn. However, in a circular dated 15th September, 2021, the Permanent Secretary/Secretary to the Treasury communicated the Cabinet decision to implement a 40% reduction on the non-wage recurrent and development budgets of all Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) due to the impact of COVID-19. In addition, the Government suppressed the funds appropriated for workshops and seminars and travel abroad where Makerere University had budged for a total of UGX 4.322 Bn. Accordingly, Makerere University has suffered a total budget reduction of UGX 66.027 Bn (Non-wage UGX 54.972 Bn and Development UGX 6.686Bn) in FY 2021/2022, in line with Government's budget cuts.

The budget cuts present significant challenges to the University's operations. They affect critical items, including teaching materials, ongoing research activities, external examiners, IT infrastructure and bandwidth, electronic library resources, part-time and contract staff salaries, and student allowances, to mention but only a few. Some of the affected budget items present a risk of student unrest and undermine the quality of teaching and training when not fully funded. These challenges are exacerbated by the COVID-19 disruptions where the University will cover three semesters in FY2021/2022 instead of the traditional two semesters covered in a financial year.

Despite the closure due to COVID-19, the University has sustained delivery on its core mandate of teaching, learning, and research. This has been possible through adaptation to the blended service delivery model in the administrative and support services and the core functions of teaching, learning, research and community outreach.

Total budget receipts in Q1 of FY2021/2022 amounted to UGX 79.501 Bn. Of the received funds, UGX 51.650 Bn (65%) was for wage, UGX 25.350Bn (32%) for non-wage and UGX2.500Bn(3%) for Development. The funds received in Q1 fell below the quarterly budget projections for the non-wage and development budgets by UGX 11.766 Bn, representing 12.9% (i.e.UGX 10.087Bn for non-wage and UGX 1.679Bn for development budget).

NTR performance in Q1 was UGX1.398 Bn against the budget projection for the quarter of UGX 25.065Bn. The University's NTR performance continues to be affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic and related measures to combat its spread which has disrupted the University calendar and hence the low payment of fees by students and collections from other revenue sources. Revenue collections have also been affected by the closure of the Academic Information Management System (AIMS) yet the Academic Management Information System (ACMIS) is not fully operationalised.

The University's expenditure in Q1 amounted to UGX 55.919Bn against the UGX 79.501 Bn received during the quarter, representing 70.6% performance. Wage Expenditure was UGX 47.605bn (92.2% of the funds released for wage), non-wage was UGX 8.311 Bn (32.8% of the funds released for non-wage), and development was UGX 0.003bn (0.1% of the funds released for development). Overall, the un-utilised funds amounted to UGX 23.397 Bn, representing 29.4% of the total release.

The expenditure underperformance on the non-wage recurrent and development budget items was because the University remained partially closed during the quarter; hence there were limited activities related to the core functions of teaching, learning and research. Capital development projects were also undergoing evaluation to determine a phased continuity in light of the budget cuts.

Physical Performance

The University's physical performance in Q1 was underlined by the closure of educational institutions on 18th June 2021 following the second wave of COVID-19, which disrupted ongoing activities, including the 1st-semester examinations for the Academic Year 2020/2021 and delayed the commencement of the 2nd semester. However, by leveraging the blended model of teaching and learning, the University completed examinations for the first semester and reopened for medical students on 1st September 2021 following the Government's directive. The budget outputs under the delivery of tertiary education sub-program include teaching and learning, research and graduate studies, and administration and support services. The physical performance under these outputs is as follows:

a) Teaching & learning

- i) Continued with online teaching and learning for 31,456 students for 5-weeks which enabled the students to complete examinations for the first semester of the 2020/2021 academic year. A total of 22,000 students registered and completed examinations during the quarter.
- ii) Reopened the University to 4,292 medical and health sciences students in the College of Health Sciences (CHS) and the College of Veterinary Medicine, Animal Resources, and Biosecurity (COVAB). Physical teaching and learning activities for Semester II of the academic Year 2020/21 for CHS and COVAB commenced immediately.
- iii) Trainined 1200 academic staff members in online student assessment, which enabled online examinations for the first semester of the 2020/2021 academic year.

iv) Commenced training for 15 E-learning Champions (online pedagogy and instructional design) under the Institute of Open, Distance and e-Learning (IODeL) and acquired 15 online pedagogy kits (a laptop computer, keyboard, earphones and camera) with support from the MasterCard Foundation.

- b) Research and graduate studies
- i) Research continued in the Colleges with a total of 50 PhD defences held.
- ii) Faculty members continued to publish in international journals.
- c) Administration and support services.
- i) Facilitated administrative functioning in the ten colleges, including the provision of data and airtime for communication, fuel for the day to today college operations, staff welfare and office consumables.

The performance under the Support Services sub-programme included the following outputs.

- a) Administration & Governance
- i) Held 15 meetings of the University Council and Council Committees to provide general policy direction and oversight as per the Council's mandate under the Universities and Other Tertiary Institutions Act (UOTIA).
- ii) Held one specialised training for 19 members of the Staff Development, Welfare and Retirement Benefits Committee (SDWRBC) on the Committee's mandate and fostering staff development and welfare in the University.
- iii) Appointed 56 staff members to fill positions that had fallen vacant for various reasons (retirement, death or resignation). 40 of the staff appointments were academic (23 Male and 20 Female) and 13 were administrative staff (9 Male and 4 female).
- iv) Inaugurated the new seven member Board of Trustees of Makerere University Endowment Fund and the seven Member Board of Directors of Makholdings Company Ltd.
- v) Promoted 38 academic staff (30 Male and 8 Female) to senior faculty positions. This enables the staff to supervise graduate students and lead research projects and hence contributes to the drive towards a research-led University.
- vi) To save the University from huge penalties and liabilities, 4 cases were settled out of Court including Elizabeth Kaase Bwanga Vs Mak; Ruth Mpiriirwe Vs Mak; Njoroge Racheal Vs Mak and Samiiha Nalwoga Vs Mak.
- vii) Strengthened the Human Resources capacity at the University by conducting specialised capacity development for 15 finance staff (9 Males and 6 Females).
- viii) Made salary payments for 2,985 staff on the payroll (65 % Males and 35 % Female) and 60 contract staff.
- ix) Settled gratuity for 11 staff whose contracts ended.
- x) Setled payment obligations for the staff medical insurance with IAA/Prudential running up to March 2022.
- xi) Continued provision of a clean work and learning environment by maintaining and settling contractual obligations for seven cleaning companies.
- xii) Facilitated proper functioning of University Hospital, including maintenance of transport and operation of equipment.
- xiii) Supported students to participate in the National Volleyball tournament at Kabale University.
- xiv) Renovated 2 University Tennis Courts and hosted the 2nd FASU Tennis Championship games.
- xv) Fitted lighting and plumbing materials in 5-halls of residence (Mitchell, Livingstone, University Hall, and Lumumba hall).
- xvi) Plans for restoring the main building were approved by Makerere University Council and submitted to KCCA for final approval.
- b) Research and Innovations Fund activities (MakRIF):-
- i) A total of 135 projects out of the 224 projects from the first round were closed out.
- ii) 206 Principal investigators and team leads were inducted on the RIF processes of payment, procurement, accountability and Intellectual property.
- iii) A total of 400 proposals were received for the third competitive RIF Call.
- iv) Conducted 10 disseminations for RIF research outputs. RIF also had various publicity engagements, including 45 Media mentions, 91 hits on the website, 425 new followers of social media pages, and 1631 visitors on the RIF website.
- v) Produced 7 Policy briefs and 8 Peer-reviewed papers and manuscripts.
